RCSC Elections

Packets Due October 4; Candidates to be Announced

While there may still be a few days to complete and submit a candidate packet for the 2019 RCSC Board of Directors Election (deadline is Friday, October 4 by noon), it is likely that those interested have already completed this task.

So how and when are the candidates announced? Once signatures have been validated, a press release will be issued stating those RCSC Members whose names will appear on the ballot come November soon after the verification is complete.

Press releases are sent not only to the local media, but are also posted on the RCSC website (www.suncityaz.org) and are emailed to Cardholders who have enrolled to receive RCSC News Email Alerts.

RCSC Directors serve for three-year teams from the candidates themselves at two and each year, elections are held to fill

the three upcoming vacancies. Those directors leaving the Board at the end of 2019 are President Jerry DeLano, Director Darla Akins and Director Stella VanNess.

Those wishing to meet the candidates once they have been announced will have the opportunity at upcoming Board Meetings.

In addition, candidate literature will be available at the various RCSC recreation centers, golf pro shops, bowling centers and outside the offices of Cardholder Services and Clubs & Activities on the lower level at Lakeview. Candidate information will also be available in upcoming editions of SunViews and via the RCSC Web Portal once online voting begins on Monday, November 11, 2019.

RCSC Members are invited to hear upcoming "Candidate Forums" which

will be held in November. There will be both an afternoon and an evening session (please refer to the right for dates, times and locations); however, should these meetings not be convenient, video recordings of both session will be posted on RCSC's YouTube channel for Members to view. Reminder notices will be sent via RCSC News Email Alerts when this information and documentation becomes available.

In addition to online voting, Members may request Absentee Ballots if necessary by calling the Corporate Office at 623-561-4600. In-person voting will occur on Election Day (Tuesday, December 10, 2019) in Lakeview Center Social Hall #2 from 8am to 4pm.

RCSC Cardholders:

Please keep the following in mind when using RCSC Facilities

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas only; not accepted concerts or free events).
- · Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation and if eligible, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview and RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests should be prepared to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- · Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted quests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending free concerts and

events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

- Immediately exit pools, spas if lightning is observed or thunder is heard.
- Household pets are NOT allowed at any RCSC facilities. including but not limited to buildings, golf courses, grounds, parking lots, except for dogs at the RCSC dog park, Best Friends Dog Club and/or dogs trained as service animals. Emotional support animals are not an exception.

Please refer to the RCSC Cardholder Guide and Board Policies for more information regarding these matters. Your continued cooperation is much appreciated!



No matter what state you're from, while you're here in Sun City it is much appreciated if you would park in only one space (note the white line under car) and save these smaller spaces for golf carts - as designed.

Items not permitted, include but are not limited to, balls, Frisbees, rafts, water guns and any metallic items. Same goes for very, very large ducks!

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds for July increased by 10.5% compared to prior year, due in large part to last year's closure of Willowcreek and Willowbrook. The total rounds played in July also represent the 3rd highest number of total rounds played in the last seven years.

We currently have 50 participants signed up to participate in our "Patriot Day" golf event on August 30. This total is behind the 94 participants we had last year, though we are still accepting applications at the time of this writing. "Patriot Golf Day" was organized with the help of PGA of America to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country. Money raised from the tournament will be added to dollars collected by our starters from August 30 through September 4.

Snack Shops

Snack Shop revenue exceeded total budget for the month. For the year the snack shops are behind revenue budget and ahead of total gross income budget. Snack Shops continue to have a regularly scheduled closing time of 1:00 p.m.; however, this closing time can be extended based on demand.

Golf Course Maintenance

Overseeding will begin on September 30 on North, Lakes West, Willowbrook and Riverview. These courses will reopen October 19, with cart path restrictions in place until November 8. The remaining courses will close October 21 and reopen November 9th with cart path restrictions in place until November 22. We are currently not planning an overlap period during which all courses will be closed; however, we will be monitoring long range forecasts as we near the September 30 start date. Should forecasted temperatures prove problematic for overseeding, we will move the start date for the first wave of course closures to October 7. Should this change prove necessary it will result in an overlap period of course closures, as we would not move the second wave of courses back.

The summer projects at both South and Lakes West are complete. The practice area is going through the final stages of grow-in. In the coming weeks we will be verticutting the surface and adding top dressing. We expect to be able to open the practice area for use by the end of September. The forward tees on Lakes West are also in the final stages of growing in. Mowing heights are slowly being lowered to normal playing heights. We expect the tees to be ready for use by the middle of September. Lakes West was recently re-rated by teams from the Arizona Golf Association and Arizona Women's Golf Association, including the new tees. Once available, these ratings will be posted in the pro shop and included on future scorecards.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

The newly surfaced greens at Mountain View and Oakmont are progressing, despite an inactive monsoons season. Both greens have been laser leveled twice and are scheduled to be tested by bowlers on August 28.

The grounds crew remains busy with regular maintenance; however, they are enjoying the inactive monsoon season. A definitive date for overseeding the softball field has not been decided, but it will occur at the end of September and the field will be closed for three weeks.

Tips from a Pro

Practice Makes Perfect...or does it?

We've all heard the saying "practice makes perfect" but instead we should say "perfect practice makes perfect." Let me clarify. To learn a new behavior, or replace an old habit with a new habit, we need repetition. However, we must repeat the desired behavior over and over correctly for it to become automatic!

What does this mean for practicing your golf swing? Well, let's say you have a terrible time topping the ball and you go to the driving range for three hours and hit 1,000 balls (99% of which you topped). Has this practice session helped you or hurt you? I would venture to say it hurt you because now you've engrained into your psyche the most effective way of topping the ball and you've practice it over 999 times!

So, what is the most effective way to practice correctly something that is new to you?

- Try using a club that is easy for you to repeat the desired effect correctly. For most golfers this might be a short iron such as a 7 iron, but over the years I've learned that everyone is different so use whatever your favorite/easiest club to hit is.
- Use a slower swing to ensure you're correct in your execution. Maybe try a halfspeed swing first to see if you have more control. If that works well, try a threequarters speed swing and then if you are successful go to your normal full swing
- Shorten your swing. Use a similar technique as you did with swing speed. Try making a half swing (perhaps waist high) and if that works try a three-quarters length swing (shoulder height in the backswing) and if that works well go to your normal length swing. (This works best with irons).
- Put the ball on a tee. Use the progressive tee approach. If you are successful hitting the ball with the tee, then bump it down a little further and then again, a little further until you have the ball back on the ground. Once the swing is working you can do it either with or without a tee.
- Practice using drills. Drills to practice the correct swing, grip or technique is much easier to do correctly when NOT hitting an actual ball. Get it right first using your body, the club, or even a practice swing hitting nothing or just a tee. Doing it right is what matters most!

Remember the point of practice is to make the new technique automatic so that it becomes the way you do it...without any thought! It is better to not practice at all rather than practice incorrectly!

- Close the gap/hole with putter by patting down the ball mark.
- Insert Green-Save tool on the high side behind ball mark and push the back toward the center.
- Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- Never use loosened turf for repair.

WRONG!

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system



RIGHT!

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.





This means you can vote from any device (any computer, tablet or smart phone) anywhere (back home, right here in Sun City AZ or any place in between). Or you can request an absentee ballot by calling the RCSC Corporate Office at 623-561-4600 (no absentee ballots will be sent until elections have begun) and just make sure that your ballot is mailed back soon enough that it arrives here by Election Day.

And for those who would still prefer to cast their ballot in person, the only polling place will be in Lakeview Social Hall #2, which will be open from 8am to 4pm on Tuesday, December 10.

Thanks to your efforts and input, open meetings with multiple opportunities for Members to address the RCSC Board of Directors regarding both meeting agenda items and various matters of concern is now a reality. Let's continue this trend of participation throughout the remainder of this election process and encourage everyone eligible to vote in this year's election.

Management Report

Financial Report

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended July 2019 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Every division has met or exceeded its net operating budget projections year to date with overall income at budget and overall operating expenses 10% favorable to budget. This has led to an overall operating excess 30% favorable to budget. In the month of July overall RCSC has exceeded revenue and operating expense targets by 4% and 2% respectively. The month of July was led by the Bowling division with 11% favorability in both revenue and operating expense. Golf continues to improve with July actuals exceeding budget by 4% in both revenue and operating expense. This represents three consecutive months with favorable results in Golf. General and Administrative expenses continue to be below budget with July ending 10% favorable YTD.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in July were 10.4% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivable decreased in July by 1.4% and is up 6.0% from the beginning of the year. Overall accounts receivable past due balances have increased 0.2% since the beginning of the year. June assessments went 30 days past due at 7.2% rate and May assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.5% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$4,245 in July. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$56,884. Payments made in July by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$126,548 from 263 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$975,462 from 2,115 property owners.

In July property transfer balances decreased by 1.0%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 50% of all receivables and 51% of past due balances. As of July there are no pending balances for lender owned properties. At the end of July trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 42 and properties owned by lending institutions decreased to 2.

Project Updates

Fairway Center

Repaint Fairway Center

The Fairway Center pool was closed from 8/19/2019-8/23/2019 to paint the pool area. This was completed and the pool area reopened as scheduled on 8/24/2019. Substantial completion of this painting project is expected by 8/30/2019 and the project reviewed for any punch list areas at that time. Contractor: Silverado Painting (Cost \$75,000)

Bell Center

• Fitness Lobby Carpet Replacement The carpet and carpet base in the fitness lobby area was replaced during the pool closure time period. Contractor: ReSource AZ (Cost \$10,204)

Lapidary Club Room

Work is substantially complete and the club is moving back into the club room. Final pending items include corrective work on several cabinets and repair of the sales room roll up window covering that will be scheduled in the next two weeks. Work included flooring, ceiling grid, overhead lights, cabinetry, and environmental remediation. Contractor: Multiple (Cost \$82,179)

· Repaint Bell Center

Work has been completed. There was some concern that there was overspray on the metal roofing areas on the 99th Ave side of the building but before photos show this was present prior to the work beginning and not attributable to this work. Project included painting of all buildings, doors, wrought iron and gates, light canopies, and block walls. Contractor: Ghaster Painting & Coatings (Cost \$166,235)

Silvercraft Club Room

Work has progressed well over the past month. Current pending items are the completion of cabinetry by RCSC Skilled Trades and will be completed over the next several weeks. Club items are planned to be moved back into the room from storage on 9/4/2019. Work included flooring, ceiling grid, overhead lights, cabinetry, paint and environmental remediation. Contractor: Multiple (Cost \$81,955)

Table Tennis Flooring

The flooring has been installed, tables moved back into the room and play resumed. The installation of the rubber base is scheduled for Friday 8/30/2019 and will complete this project. Contractor: Damage Demolition, AZ Resource Flooring (Cost \$30,816)

Sconce Lighting Upgrades

The sconce lighting under the canopies in the 99th Ave entry area, walkway to the social halls, and the pool area were identified for replacement. The hexagonal shades have deteriorated and are unable to be replaced with like fixtures. An LED sconce fixture was identified for these areas. The fixtures were ordered in late May and have been delayed in delivery from the manufacturer. The 105 fixtures have now been received with the installation beginning on 8/29/2019 and estimated to take 3-4 days to complete. Contractor: Accel Electric (Cost \$41,160)

Library Book Drop

The proposed work scope and costs for this project were approved by the Maricopa County Library District, Friends of the Library, and the RCSC bid commission. The initial contractor meeting was held on 8/21/2019. The project dates are currently being developed and work will likely start the third week in September. Book drop components to be ordered by 8/30/2019. This project includes the placement of library book drops on an island on the north access road behind the library, installation of an access gate in the block wall and lighting upgrades along the access road. The costs of this project are to be reimbursed by the Friends of the Library. Contractor: Regional Paving, Accel Electric, Kingsley Equipment (Cost \$67,403)

Grand Ave

- Review of the submitted bids was completed, and the recommended general contractor and project costs submitted to the Bid Commission on 7/24/2019. The bid commission approved the bid packet and Adolfson & Peterson has been awarded the contract for the completion of the existing building, site work and deceleration lane at the Grand Ave property. The mobilization for this project is expected the beginning of September with a 7-month construction timeframe.
- Progress on the ADOT permit has been made in the past several weeks. Currently
 pending insurance documents for the final permit submission with ADOT. The final
 permit submission is expected to be completed by 8/30/2019.
- We have met with the Vintage Vehicle Club and answered questions regarding space allocation and layout. The club is reviewing the space to determine how best to utilize the space for their anticipated work flows. This space planning is necessary for engineering and mechanical plans to be developed. We are still working on the assignment of the additional club space in the second building on this site.

Lakeview Center

• Upper Restroom Remodel

The architectural plans were sent to contractors for bidding as of 8/22/2019 with responses requested by 9/10/2019. Upon review of submitted bids a general contractor will be selected, and the bid packet submitted for approval by the Bid Commission. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$110,000)

Center Upper Roof Recoat

This work was completed as of 7/26/2019 as anticipated. Contractor: Lyons Roofing (Cost \$46,900)

· Warehouse Roof Recoat

The current roof of the Lakeview Warehouse needs an elastomeric recoating. This project is approved and pending scheduling. Contractor: Lyons Roofing (Cost \$7,072)

• Artists by The Lake Club Room

Work is substantially complete, and the club is moving back into the club room. Work included flooring, ceiling grid, overhead lights, cabinetry, paint and environmental remediation. Contractor: Multiple (Cost \$59,000)

Marinette Center

• Pool Deck Replacement

The bid packet for this project was submitted to the Bid Commission and approved. This project will include the preparation of the de-laminating areas of the current deck and the installation of a rubber decking material throughout the pool, spa and shower areas. Based upon historical usage of this facility this work has been pushed to November and will be completed from 11/11/2019-11/27/2019 with the pool area reopening for the Thanksgiving holiday weekend. With night time temperatures going into the low 50s this is the latest in the year that this work can be scheduled as lower temperatures affect the curing of the surface. This schedule has been reviewed with the Aqua Fitness club and the club is adjusting their scheduling to accommodate the work schedule. Contractor: Rubaroc USA Inc. (Cost \$125,328)

• Pool Filter Replacement

The bid packet for this project was submitted to the Bid Commission and approved. This project will include the replacement of the existing cartridge filters for the pool with deep bed sand filters with glass media. The replacement filters will provide more granular filtering and allow for backwashing of filters rather than manual cartridge cleaning. The replacement of the filters will be done during the closure period for the pool deck replacement. Contractor: Exceptional Water Systems, Osiris Pools (Cost \$31,261)

Spa Filter Replacement

The bid packet for this project was submitted to the Bid Commission and approved. This project will include the replacement of the existing cartridge filters for the spa with deep bed sand filters with glass media. The replacement filters will provide more granular filtering and allow for backwashing of filters rather than manual cartridge cleaning. The replacement of the filters will be done during the closure period for the pool deck replacement. Contractor: Exceptional Water Systems, Osiris Pools (Cost \$20,600)

Pickleball Pavilion Lighting

This project has received bid commission approval. Sample fixtures were installed to assist in the light output color selection. These samples were reviewed with a Pickleball Club resource to determine the correct fixture. The order of the fixtures has been completed and the installation will be scheduled upon confirmation of a delivery timeframe. Contractor: Accel Electric (Cost \$63,992)

Oakmont Center

North Parking Lot Lighting

The approved additional lighting in the north parking lot adjacent to the auditorium was installed as of 8/23/2019. This included the addition of two light poles in the parking lot along with new poles for handicap signage. The lights are operational with final pending items including the stucco of the light pole bases and the installation of the handicap signage. Contractor: Accel Electric (Cost \$6,529)

Sundial Center

Club Restroom Remodel

The architectural plans were sent to contractors for bidding as of 8/22/2019 with responses requested by 9/10/2019. Upon review of submitted bids a general contractor will be selected, and the bid packet submitted for approval by the Bid Commission. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$100,000)

Roof Drain Repairs

The cast iron roof drains over the east club areas were replaced with PVC drains and connected so there is no longer leaking in these drains. These leaks caused drywall damage in the hallway outside the Silverstones club and on the wall above the spas. The project to paint the hallway above the pool area has been pending this repair and will be scheduled. Contractor: Sunland Plumbing (Cost \$19,514)

Silverstones Club Room

The painting of the Silverstones club room began on 8/5/2019 and has been completed. The delivery of the display lighting components has been delayed with the lighting still pending at this time. The club will be moving back into the space and the lighting coordinated upon receipt of the components. This project included drywall repair, printing of the club room and installation of LED lighting in the display cases. Contractor: Exquisite Painting, Accel Electric (Cost \$12,678)

East Parking Lot Lighting Improvements

Additional lighting is being added to the solar canopies on the east side of the center to provide better night time illumination adjacent to the building. Similar fixtures have been added to other centers and provided the desired lighting improvements. Fixtures have been ordered and installation to be scheduled upon delivery. Contractor: Accel Electric (Cost \$7,667)

South Pro Shop

All bids for the parking lot paving have been received. The recommended contractor will be presented to the bid commission for approval, along with the additional costs for the patio counter, pendant lighting and building signage by 8/30/2019. The asphalt work is scheduled for completion during course closure for overseeding in the fall.


DROP IT

A Library patron will be able to drop off books from a vehicle without coming into the Library. The drop will be on the North side of the Bell Recreation Center. The short term parking area in the front of the Library will be eliminated.

Many could be thanked for bringing closure to this project, including the Friends Board of Directors for pushing to get it completed. Most of all, however, this project is being completed because of Sun City citizens. Through their bequests from their estates, funds were available to afford projects like this one. The Board cannot express enough thanks to those who made this possible.

SHOP IT

Books Around the Corner is the Friends of the Sun City Libraries, Inc. current major fund producer. Its proceeds go to support Sun City Libraries' programs, equipment, and materials. The Bookstore has a well organized, robust variety of books, magazines, puzzles, CDs, and DVDs, all priced very reasonably. Located in the Sun City Library at



the Bell Recreation Center and operated by an all volunteer staff, shoppers can't go wrong. Watch for author of the month half price sales, and other special seasonal sales. Water Conservation

Don't Waste Water on the Wash (Laundry Tips)

Laundry day doesn't mean wasting water if you follow these simple super saving tips:

- Re-use Towels. The towel used to dry off after a shower or a visit to the pool does
 not need to be laundered after each use. Hang it up and re-use it instead. Laudering towels when they actually need to be washed is more efficient.
- Use Less Hot Water. Save money in the laundry room by not using hot water as warming up the water is the most energy-intensive part of the laundry process.
 Use warm or cold water when possible, and you'll instantly save on water energy costs.
- 3. Run Full Loads. Rather than running many small loads, save them to run larger, fuller loads of laundy instead. Every time the machine is used, you're consuming water, so consolidating washes is more efficient.
- 4. Use Size Cycles. When you need to run a small load, take advantage of the washer's "small load" setting, which uses less water since you're washing fewer items.
- Skip the Extra Rinse. Many washing machines have an option for an extra rinse cycle, so skip this step to save water. Use the right amount of soap in the first place, and you won't need an extra ring
- 6. Insulate and Lower the Temperature on Your Hot Water Tank. Your hot water tank will function most efficiently when it's insulated, so be sure to insulate it well especially if you have an older model. Likewise, turn down the tank's temperature to 120 degrees instead of anything higher, which would be both unnecessary and costly.
- 7. Upgrade Your Washing Machine and Hot Water Heater to Energy Efficient Models. When your existing appliances need to to replaced, opt for more efficient models, You can save as much as 7,000 gallons per household per year and frontloading washers tend to be even more efficient. Likewise, cost savings of using an efficient water heater will make the purchase worthwhile, not to mention you may be eligible for government rebates for tankless and solar units. Ask dealers for details and research the internet for additional purchase savings.

Sun City Gives Back

Garden Club's Monarch Waystation Provides Protection

Earlier this spring, the Garden Club of Sun City was given the honor of being certified and registered as a Monarch Waystation by Monarch Watch to create, conserve and protect Monarch habitats (WWW.MONARCHWATCH.ORG).

The goal is to save and increase the declining monarch butterfly population. The Monarch butterfly population has decreased by over 80%. In order to facilitate this goal, we created a monarch waystation with milkweed host plants & nectar flowers to support & feed monarch butterflies and caterpillars. We will raise monarchs in a protective caterpillar nursery, then tag and count the butterflies as they are released. Yes! You read that correct. The butterflies will be tagged!

The hardscape for the monarch waystation has been completed with fencing, pathways, shading and installed pavers for the caterpillar nursery. The planting of 22 milkweed bushes that consists of five varieties - desert, tropical, Arizona milkweed, pine needle and butterfly. The other plants are 75 nectar flowers including snail vines to offer wind protection and a safe place to sleep. Butterflies like landing pads like zinnias, sunflowers, cosmos, Echinacea and daisies.

The garden also contains a donated solar water fountain that provides water for birds and butterflies.

Twenty-five milkweed seedlings were grown under grow lights in private homes that included tropical, Arizona and butterfly types.

A caterpillar nursery is also being constructed. We have the base completed but still

need more milkweed seeds, organic potting soil, queen's wreath vines, and Mexican flame vines.

Future plans are to build an arch over the entry wreath vines, plant vines on trellises at the back



of the waystation, collect and save milkweed seed pods to grow and perhaps sell milkweed plants, and lastly, to educate the public about monarchs including school children and local gardeners at open houses, etc.

What can you do to help save the Monarch Butterfly? Please stop using herbicides and pesticides. That includes neem oil. Instead of using dangerous chemicals try mixing 1 quart water with ¼ cup hydrogen peroxide (35% hydrogen peroxide use 1 teaspoon).

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

What Makes a Lifetime Exerciser?

Why is it that some individuals make exercise a priority in their lives, while others struggle to exercise at all? LEs might attach a reoccurring reward to exercise: a relaxing massage after a tough workout; coffee and a muffin after a long hike or bicycle ride. 



We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.


