Election Outcome to Influence Future of Sun City

In just about another week or so, we'll know who will have been elected to serve on the RCSC Board of Directors for the next several years. The seven candidates whose names are on this year's ballot – Steve Collins, Kat Fimmel, Martin Heinrichs, Dale Lehrer, Karen McAdam, Sheila Rooney and Sue Wilson – will represent RCSC Members and make decisions that will have ramifications well into the future.

With five seats needing to be filled this election, every vote cast is especially important as all winners must receive a minimum of 100 votes. Besides the three Directors whose terms expire at the end of December currently held by President Dan Schroeder, Vice President Dale Lehrer and Treasurer Sue Wilson, there are two other seats on the Board currently filled by appointees Ron Jesse and Jerry Walczak that will become vacant.

Based upon ballots cast, the top three candidates with the most votes will serve full three-year terms; the fourth vote-getter will serve a two-year term and the fifth-place candidate will serve for only one year. Should there not be five eligible winners, the Board will appoint additional Member(s) as necessary.

Candidate biography information can be found in this edition of SunViews (see pages 17-18) and via the RCSC Web Portal once Member have logged in to vote. Video introductions of the candidates may be viewed on the RCSC YouTube channel (accessible from the RCSC website at www.suncityaz.org) and the two candidate forums, held in early November, are also posted for Members to view if they did not attend.

Online voting continues until 4pm on Election Day (Tuesday, December 8, 2020). Members have until December 1 to request Absentee Ballots (if necessary) by calling the Corporate Office

at 623-561-4600, and all absentee ballots must be received by Election Day. In-person voting on Election Day will take place at Lakeview Center Social Hall #2 only from 8am to 4pm.

Those elected to serve will be sworn in at the RCSC Board of Directors meeting on Thursday, December 17, 2020 at 9am in the Sundial Auditorium and will begin their terms on January 1, 2021. Officers will be selected and committee assignments announced later in January.

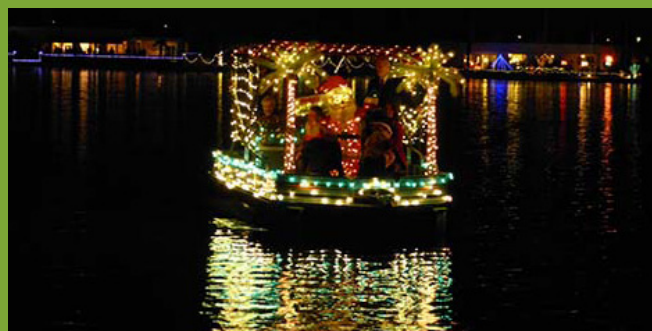

Changes to Sundial Winter/Spring Concert Series

RCSC has determined that we will be unable to offer season tickets for the Sundial 2021 Winter/Spring Sundial Concert Series. RCSC's January 2021 concerts have been postponed due to continued rules and regulations regarding COVID-19 and the unknown time when these may be relieved.

Depending upon further developments we hope to proceed with concerts at Sundial in February and March, however, time will tell. Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Through September total revenue is 9.8% above budget and 14.3% above prior year. For the year golf has recorded 257,278 rounds played, the highest recorded total since 2008. Total rounds recorded in September were 20,105, the highest recorded total since 2006. Annual No-Fee rounds account for 13% of total rounds played and Annual Fee rounds account for 43% of total rounds played. For the year Riverview has recorded the most rounds, followed by Lakes West, Willowcreek, South and North. For the executive courses Lakes East has recorded the most rounds, followed by Willowbrook and Quail.

The “Beat the Pros” event scheduled in December has been cancelled. The major function of this event is to help raise funds for the Sun City Foundation, however, with current COVID-19 restrictions in place we cannot be confident that the event could be held in such a fashion to facilitate fund raising efforts.

Free golf clinics scheduled for November were cancelled, no decision has been made regarding the free clinics scheduled for March. We currently do not have any Get Golf Ready classes scheduled for November, December or January. We are hoping to offer a short schedule of Get Golf Ready Classes beginning in February. Individual private lessons are still available from the golf professionals, their contact information can be found on the RCSC website (www.suncityaz.org) or in the pro shops.

Snack Shops

Year-to-date Snack Shop gross revenue through August is \$137,000 behind budget. Reduced seating due to COVID-19 restrictions is the primary driver. Snack shops are scheduled to close at 3pm in October, however, are given the discretion to remain open longer based on demand.

Golf Courses

Overseeding began on September 28 at Lakes East, Riverview, South and Willowcreek and has mostly germinated as expected. Areas that have shown weakness have been reseeded. We will be starting with green heights slightly higher than normal due to the above normal temperatures. These courses will reopen October 17, with cart path restrictions in place until November 6. The remaining courses will close October 19 and reopen November 7, with cart path restrictions in place until November 26.

With the change to the 3-cart rule possibly becoming permanent, it will be more important than ever for golf carts to travel on the cart path as much as possible. Studies from the USGA show that one golfer and one cart impact an area of 61,845 square feet per round. The more time spent on cart paths will help to reduce the area of compaction.

Lawn Bowling

Lawn Bowl pace is quickening slightly and becoming more uniform overall. Lawn Bowl pace now ranges from a slow of 11.2 seconds on Lakeview East to a high of 12.6 seconds on Bell North. Moisture readings continue to trend downwards, with the exception of Mountain View which required additional watering to combat hot spots. The Moisture Quotient (MQ) readings range from a low of 10.9 at Bell North to a high of 15.4 at Mountain View.

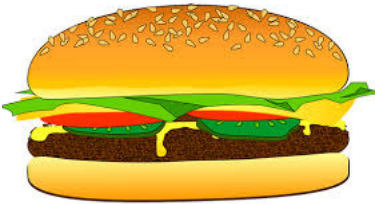
Sun Bowl & Softball

The softball field and areas around Sun Bowl were overseeded the week of September 28. Weak areas received additional seed and mulch as needed. The softball field opened for play October 19. Grassy areas around Lakeview were overseeded the week of October 5. Cardholders are advised that walkways around Lakeview may be wet during the day.

Bowling Centers & League Info

Phase 2 Restrictions & Requirements

Prior to entering RCSC facilities, RCSC has implemented COVID-19 symptom screening with signage. Please read and evaluate whether you meet the criteria to enter RCSC facilities. Anyone with potential symptoms may not enter RCSC facilities. High-risk individuals should remain at home.

- Hand sanitizer is required upon entry to all RCSC facilities and offices. Users may utilize the sanitizer provided by RCSC.
- Bowling Centers will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm.
- No guests or visitors are allowed. All customers MUST individually display their RCSC Member or Privilege Cards to verify eligibility (ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS; KEY FOBS NOT ACCEPTED).
- A limited number of users may be permitted at one time, once capacity has been reached you may be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Face masks are required. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Every other lane open with only 4 bowlers allowed per lane.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- No use of concourse tables and chairs is allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- All Games must be prepaid (maximum 3 games per person).
- Bowling leagues resumed effective 11/9/2020.

All leagues must comply with the following guidelines, NO EXCEPTIONS:

- Pulling mask down from nose AT ANY TIME is not allowed.
- Face masks/coverings must be worn AT ALL TIMES – NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Face masks/coverings must cover nose and mouth and be affixed behind the ears or tied behind the head.
- Only the active bowler is permitted to be up and out of their chair, all other players must remain seated.
- Bowlers are not allowed to “mingle” or “visit” other lanes throughout the league, bowlers must remain seated in the area of their assigned lane.
- Prior to league start time and during league play, 50 / 50 pots, card games, Break the Bank and mystery scores will not be allowed due to social distancing. Any activity that requires a bowler to leave their assigned area to sign up or participate is not allowed.
- All personal effects and equipment are to be kept in the area of the assigned lane.
- Sharing of equipment is not allowed.
- A minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing is mandatory, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- “High Fives”, “Fist Bumps” and any other type of physical contact is not allowed.
- Only rostered bowlers (maximum 4 per team) that are participating in league play are allowed in the bowling center.
- Spectators and non-players will not be allowed in the bowling centers at any time.
- Bowlers are not allowed to mingle, linger, visit or socialize in the building after their league session is complete unless becoming a customer of George’s Café.
- Due to Covid-19 restrictions only single lanes will be used which may require larger leagues to bowl at different times depending on league size and lane availability. Odd lanes (1,3,5 etc.) will be used on the first shift and even lanes (2,4,6, etc.) on the second shift.

Online voting for the RCSC Board of Directions Election continues through December 8

Thoughts from a Pro For Consistent Golf Shots, Work on Tempo!

Most golfers consider consistency to be one of the most difficult things to achieve in the game. If this is true for you, working on tempo may be the key.

Think of tempo as the rhythm that your golf swing has. It may be slow, fast, or somewhere in between. What matters most is that it is smooth and allows the swing to be balanced. Balance is crucial since we are swinging at a small ball with a relatively small clubhead. This does not allow us much room for error, and therefore the more balanced we are in the swing the greater our chances of connecting become!

To work on tempo, choose a short-mid iron and practice swinging with a sense of being smooth. Example: "one and two", or "back and through", or "turn and hit" ... whatever works best. Try and make both sides of the swing (the back swing and the down swing) feel even.

Second, check the follow-through at the end of the swing for good balance. If the tempo was smooth you should be in balance at the end of the swing, facing the target with all the weight on the forward foot. (left foot for right handers) This position should be easy to hold until the ball comes to rest.

Last, once tempo and balance are achieved begin moving to longer clubs keeping the swing the same.

Management Report

Financial Report

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended September 2020 within its operating and capital budget year to date. All Divisions, with the exception of Bowling and Food Service, have met or exceeded their net operating budget projections year to date with total operating income \$44k (~1%) favorable to budget and operating expenses \$869k (6%) favorable to budget. Bowling and Food Service declines are driven by the COVID-19 closure and restrictions. Bowling did reopen in August, but income remains lower than budget. Income favorability is driven by higher than budgeted income in the Buildings & Infrastructure and Golf Divisions. Operating expense favorability is primarily driven by lower payroll, utility and general operating expenses across multiple Divisions. Year to date operating excess without projects favorability is \$899k (43%) favorable to budget. RCSC is continuing to see the effect of the COVID-19 related shutdown with September monthly operating income shortfalls in Bowling, Food Service and Member Services totaling \$132k. However, Golf and Building & Infrastructure combined operating income excess of \$83k in September offset a portion of the shortfall.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in September were 6.6% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivable increased in September by 2.0% and is up 18.5% from the beginning of the year. Overall accounts receivable past due balances have increased in September by 5.5%. August assessments went 30 days past due at a 7.1% rate and July assessments went 60 days past due at a 4.2% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$55,630 in September. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$135,540. Payments made in September through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$130,457 from 283 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,534,599 from 3,671 property owners.

In September property transfer balances increased by 4.4%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 55% of all receivables and 56% of past due balances. At the end of September trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 21 and properties owned by lending institutions remained at 3.

Project Updates

Bell Center

- Social Hall Restroom Renovation

This project includes a full upgrade and renovation of the social hall restrooms making them ADA compliant. The demolition work began on 8/31/2020. Plumbing,

electrical rough-in, framing and drywall hanging, tape & texture tasks are complete. Tile work is underway. Project is scheduled to complete by mid-November, concurrent with the kitchen renovation. Contractor: K.L. McIntyre (Cost: \$160,487)

- Social Hall Kitchen Renovation

This project includes the full renovation of the social hall kitchen which will replace flooring, lighting and cabinetry in the kitchen and the trash receptacle areas. The demolition work began on 8/27/2020. Plumbing, electrical rough-in, and drywall hanging, tape & texture tasks have been completed. Painting, cabinet install, and flooring tasks are next. Project is scheduled to complete by mid-November, concurrent with the restroom renovation. Contractor: K.L. McIntyre (Cost: \$126,926)

Grand Center – Building I

Most pending items have been completed within the club rooms with a few minor items remaining, mainly tied to product shipping delays. (9 fans, floor outlet covers)

Minor repair issues which are warranty related are being resolved by the General Contractor, Adolfson & Peterson.

The RCSC Grounds department has completed the landscaping on the site, except for planting a few trees pending cooler weather.

Grand Center – Building II

RCSC has contracted with General Contractor (GC) Robert E. Porter Construction, Inc. to construct this project.

The GC commenced work on the project on 9/14/2020. Earthwork, pouring of the foundation and addition of masonry stems has been completed. Underground plumbing is currently being installed.

Bi-weekly progress meetings are being held with RCSC, CCBG Architects, and the GC all in attendance.

Duration of the project is projected to be 6 months

Lakes East/West Maintenance Yard

Pricing for a steel-building concept was received in July from Arizona Corporate Builders. Commitment to this pricing was required within 30-days and would have locked RCSC into the preliminary building footprint we provided. Other issues using this concept include having to work with 2 primary contractors. A General Contractor (GC) would be required to prepare the foundations and finish the building upon steel erection. The second contractor, Arizona Corporate Builders, coming in mid-point to work for 2.5 months constructing the steel shell. This is not an ideal situation for coordination or efficiency, and as stated, does not allow for ideas to evolve through the progression of the design. So, an August decision point with no final design (RCSC had not contracted the archi-

tect at this point) and no GC selected drove us to explore a more traditional design-bid-build concept for this project using concrete masonry unit (CMU) construction.

The CMU concept offers many advantages and a good return on construction investment:

- High Durability – Masonry is solid and will not dent from hail or errant golf balls off the adjacent driving range. Durability means less repair costs as well.
- Fire Resistant - Potentially lower insurance rates.
- Better insulated (R-values) - CMU walls insulate against outside temperature better than most metal walls to help reduce heating and cooling costs.
- Design Flexibility – CMU product is readily available in the market. Masonry walls can be adjusted at any time to suit to field conditions or emergent design changes.
- Reduced Sound Transmission – CMU is especially effective in reducing unwanted noise.

Mountain View Center

No planning or design work completed since the last report.

North Snack Bar

Added a programmable timer for the patio fan. Contractor: Accel Electric (Unbudgeted project. Cost: \$1218)

Sundial

Added a programmable timer to control the Bocce Court lights. Contractor: Accel Electric (Budgeted at \$3000; Cost: \$464)

Renovated the Camera Guild room for the Piano Club. Work included moving and reconfiguration of existing cabinets, painting, electrical outlet additions, 2 piano moves and addition of sound-proofing acoustical ceiling tiles.

Contractors: Accel Electric, Exquisite Painting & Ace Acoustics (Unbudgeted project. Cost: \$10,500)

New Issues:

- Oakmont Rec Center - Inverter #06

On 9/21/2020 Curt from Kortman went to Oakmont to work on the communication between AlsoEnergy and Fronius. He found 2 inverters tripped and 3 inverters shut off at the breaker. He reset the inverters all inverters came back online except inverter number 06. Fronius was called, they will send out a warranty replacement. Due to COVID-19 they are slow to send out the replacement.

- Oakmont Rec Center – Inverter #04.

On 9/22/2020 B&I checked on inverter 04, it had a code 516 and was not producing. Called Curt from Kortman. On 9/23/2020 Curt called Fronius they will send out a warranty replacement. Due to COVID-19 they are slow to send out the replacement.

Issues Resolved: n/a

Open Issues:

- Oakmont Rec Center - # 01/02/03/04/05/06

The inverters at Oakmont Center are not reporting production data. This has been an outstanding issue since July 2018. The production meter shows overall production data for the site, but the individual inverters are not reporting production to the AlsoEnergy aggregation reporting site. A new data logger has been replaced but unable to con-

nect. AlsoEnergy and Fronius state it should be communicating. Kortman performed continuity check on all three wiring conductors from inverter to AlsoEnergy enclosure; the wiring is good. Fronius and Kortman are working together to find a work around to get the inverters communicating with AlsoEnergy, however Kortman cannot address this issue until Fronius sends a replacement for inverter number 6.

Lakeview Rear - # 01/02/03/04

Like the Oakmont site, the inverters at the Lakeview Rear site stopped communicating with the AlsoEnergy data logger and thus the AlsoEnergy aggregation reporting site. The Lakeview Rear inverters are Fronius models like those at Oakmont Center with these two sites being the only Fronius inverters in the RCSC Solar environment. Pending confirmation of restored functionality at Oakmont Center.

Production Data:

After including September’s production data, the lifetime to date production vs expected went down again slightly and is over expected by 5.09%. The percentage of inverters producing above expected reduced by 1 inverter to 78%. The inverter had small reductions of less than 0.06% that moved the overall inverter production from just over even to expected production to just under expected production.

Changes to SunViews Distribution

Due to skyrocketing costs, starting in January 2021 SunViews will no longer be distributed directly to homes within Sun City AZ. Copies of this publication will continue to be available at RCSC offices, recreation centers, golf pro shops and bowling centers in addition to online access.

SunViews will have a new look and layout that we hope will have the news and information you need, but in a slimmer format. Much of the current SunViews content will be posted online or emailed so it will be communicated to Cardholders in a more timely fashion. We will also be working on additional ways to communicate with Cardholders in the future so look for more changes to come.

While we realize it is difficult for many clubs at this time who are yet unable to meet due to continued COVID-19 virus concerns and restrictions to know exactly what the future will bring, information about club hours and meetings will be provided to Cardholders each month within the Club Directory (based upon submitted schedules approved by the Chartered Club Office) but we will be eliminating the Club Event section.

Chartered Clubs will continue to receive space for an annual article per the established rotating schedule (Form BP 12-17 (b)) where they can include details about their club that make them unique and special. We’re also excited to work with Clubs who might wish to enhance their RCSC webpages with more information. And as always, submissions for “Sun City Gives Back,” highlighting the good deeds done by RCSC Clubs both here in the community and beyond may be submitted at any time for publication consideration.

Club Presidents have received information providing more details regarding this transition. We’re excited about these changes and look forward to improving RCSC’s online presence and communication with Cardholders.

Water Conservation

Did You Know These Interesting Water Facts?

That leaving a garden hose running unchecked while you finish scrubbing the car wastes at least six gallons of water per minute? It does depend on the length and diameter of the hose as well as water pressure, but still, what a horrible waste to see it running down the street! If you use a nozzle, you can save, save, save.

Not only does steaming vegetables conserve more of their nutrients, but also uses less water than boiling them? The water left over from steamed vegetables has nutrients in it, so save that for making soup stock or gravy. If that seems unappealing, at least let it cool off and try giving it to your pet. If they won't drink it, pour it on your favorite plant.

Technology has given us a device that will turn your shower water to a trickle after it has reached a comfortable temperature for bathing and you're not ready to get in yet? This means you can finish your shave, drink your coffee or brush your teeth and your hot shower water is waiting without blasting streams of wasted water down the drain. Basically, the unit is a “standalone thermostatic shut-off valve” and its function is to save the hot water that's wasted during the shower warm-up process. Visit <http://thinkevolve.com/> for more information. Amazing!



That compared to a standard washer built only 20 years ago, a new Energy Star certified clothes washer uses about 70% less energy and 75% less water? Perhaps it's time to replace that old washer? Compare that new washer at approximately 10-13 gallons per load (depending on the make of machine) to the “old-school” model that uses 29-45 gallons (or more!) per load.



That drying your clothes on a rack or clothesline actually saves water? That's because it saves the copious amounts of water it takes to manufacture the electricity required to run the dryer. If it's time to get a new clothes dryer, find one with a moisture sensor. This can help cut energy use up to 15% and the dryer will never run longer than it has to. If the model or make that is most appealing to you is not made with a moisture sensor, see if it's available with a temperature sensor. This can still cut energy use up to 10%. If you use softener sheets, be sure to clean those sensors once in a while. The softener sheets can cause a build-up on the sensors, making them less efficient. And it's worth mentioning

that any dryer is much more efficient if you clean the lint trap after every load.

Recycling one pound of paper – approximately the same amount found in a typical daily newspaper – can save about 3.5 gallons of water? Nice! Recycling paper uses 50% less water and saves 60% of the energy needed to manufacture paper from new materials.

The energy saved from recycling one glass bottle can run a 100-watt light bulb for four hours or a compact fluorescent bulb for 20 hours? It also causes 50% less water pollution (and 20% less air pollution) than manufacturing a new bottle from raw materials. A modern glass bottle would take 4,000 years or more to decompose; even longer if it's in a landfill. Interesting fact: glass (and aluminum) can be recycled an infinite number of times.

If you didn't know it before now, now you do! Don't forget - we're all in this together.

Phase Two of RCSC Reopening Plan

On August 27, 2020, Maricopa County met Moderate Reopening Status in the following three metrics: 1) Cases per 100,000 individuals, 2) Percent positivity, and 3) Hospital Visits for COVID-like illnesses in the region allowing RCSC Fitness Centers to re-open with limited capacity on Friday, August 28, 2020 and Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. ("RCSC") to move into Phase Two of its re-opening plan. The following is the criteria for use of RCSC facilities:

REQUIREMENTS FOR USE OF ALL RCSC FACILITIES

- Prior to entering RCSC facilities, RCSC has implemented COVID-19 symptom screening with signage. Please read and evaluate whether you meet the criteria to enter RCSC facilities. Anyone with potential symptoms may not enter or use RCSC facilities. High-risk individuals should remain at home.
- Hand sanitizer is required upon entry to all RCSC facilities and offices. Users may utilize the sanitizer provided by RCSC.
- A limited number of users may be permitted at one time, once capacity has been reached you may be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Face masks are always required while indoors except in showers, indoor pools and indoor spas. Outdoors face masks are required in the walking pool. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Strict 6 feet of physical distancing is required while in the fitness centers, indoor walking track, locker rooms and restrooms regardless if in same family. All other RCSC facilities require a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- No cash accepted for payment.

BASKETBALL – CLOSED UNTIL PHASE 3

BILLIARDS - Reopened 9/4/2020

- Billiards will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm. Face masks are required. Only 2 players per table. Use of only every other table allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment (pool sticks, cue ball, pool balls, etc.), including table railing, seating, counters and side tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOATING, PADDLE BOATS – CLOSED UNTIL PHASE 3

BOATING, ROW BOATS

- Only 1 person per boat. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing while on RCSC property, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- RCSC will sanitize life vest, oars and cushion after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment not sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOCCIE

- Use of every other rink with only 3 bowlers allowed at end of each rink in use. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOWLING – Reopened 9/4/2020; Leagues Reopened 11/9/2020

- Bowling Centers will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm.
- Face masks are required.
- Every other lane open with only 4 bowlers allowed per lane.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- No use of concourse tables and chairs is allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

DARTS – Reopened 9/4/2020

- Darts will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm.
- Face masks are required. Only 2 players and 1 table and 2 chairs per machine allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment,

including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

DOG PARK

- Hand sanitizer required upon entry. Only 1 person per bench. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs with maximum of 2 chairs per table and always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

FISHING

- Only 1 person per bench. No use of gazebos. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

FITNESS INCLUDING INDOOR TRACK

- All Fitness including the Indoor Track at Fairway will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 12pm – 1pm.
- No guests allowed.
- Face masks are required. Each fitness center will allow 25% capacity at one time. Once capacity has been reached, you will be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Cardholders must go directly to Fitness Area OR Track at time of check in and must check out with the Facility Attendant prior to leaving or using any other amenity.
- Strict 6 feet of physical distancing is required while using fitness, indoor walking track, locker rooms and restrooms regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- Every other piece of cardio equipment will be turned off to maintain at least 6 feet of space between users.
- When using strength machines or other equipment, users are required to maintain strict physical distancing of 6 feet or more.
- No outside equipment allowed into the facility, including but not limited to, mats, exercise balls, weights, and foam rollers.
- Cardholders are encouraged to bring their own water with secure lids to rehydrate.
- No use of auditoriums, social halls, hallways or other indoor RCSC facilities for walking.

GOLF COURSES, PRO SHOPS, SNACK SHOPS

- Face masks required inside Pro Shops and Snack Shops.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family unless riding in same golf cart, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Chairs may not be moved from one table to the other.
- RCSC will sanitize rental carts, snack shop tables and chairs and patio tables and chairs after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment except that sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

HILLSIDE PARK

- Only 1 person per bench. No use of gazebos allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

HORSESHOES

- Only 3 players (effective 9/1/2020) at end of each court in use. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

LAWN BOWLING - Updated 10/15/2020

- No guests allowed.
- Use of every rink with 2 bowlers allowed at end of each rink.
- Use of every other rink with 3 or 4 bowlers allowed at end of each rink in use.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.

- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

LOCKER ROOMS, LOCKERS, CHANGING STALLS, SHOWERS, RESTROOMS

- No guests allowed.
- Always requires a strict minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing.
- Face masks are required while indoors except in showers, indoor pools and indoor spas.
- Lockers are not available, consider limiting personal belongings.
- Reduced number of changing stalls and benches available.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- Thorough hand washing strongly encouraged.

MINIATURE GOLF

- Only 3 golfers (effective 9/1/2020) allowed per hole. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- RCSC to sanitize putters, balls, and scoring pencil after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment not sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

PICKLEBALL

- Four players per court (effective 9/1/2020). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of seating, benches, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

POOL, LAP OR SWIMMING

- No guests allowed. If lanes are provided, only one swimmer/user per lane. Sign up required to use lap lane(s) with 30-minute time limit.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

POOL, WALKING

- No guests allowed.
- Masks are required in walking pool. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

RACQUETBALL, HANDBALL, WHISPERBALL

- Only 1 player per court. No guests allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

SHUFFLEBOARD – Reopened 9/4/2020

- No guests allowed.
- Face masks are required at indoor courts. Only 2 players allowed at end of every other court.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment (cues, disks, pins, etc.), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

SOFTBALL & OUTDOOR TRACK - Updated 9/21/2020

- Game play on the softball field may resume on October 19, 2020. No contact allowed. No guests allowed.
- A minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing is required, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible. Must chalk a line 6 feet behind home plate for visual cue to catcher in adhering to physical distancing.
- Must sanitize player seating areas after the team has batted. Players are to be seated in the dugout, fence line benches, picnic tables, and first row of bleachers so that all players are physically distanced. Players should stay in one seating location for the half inning while on offence to eliminate the need to sanitize during the offensive half of the inning. These seating areas must be sprayed with sanitizer upon going into the field for the next defensive half inning.

- Spectators are permitted provided that 6 feet physical distancing is adhered to at all times. Picnic tables and bleachers may be used by spectators. If bleachers are to be used, then available seats must be identified to ensure 6 feet physical distancing. The Softball Club will be responsible for ensuring both players and spectators comply with the 6 feet physical distancing requirement. The club shall provide sanitizing spray for use by spectators on seating after use. Spectators may bring their own seating provided that the placement and use of personal seating follows the 6 feet physical distancing requirement.
- Limited use of stadium seating, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided.

SPAS

- No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool or spa deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TABLE TENNIS

- Face masks are required. Only 2 players per table. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TENNIS

- Four players per court (effective 9/1/2020). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pavilion seating, benches, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TRACK - OUTDOORS

- No guests allowed. Only 1 person per bench.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

WALKING

- All indoor walking allowed only at the indoor walking track at the Fairway Center. No guests allowed.
- No use of auditoriums, social halls, hallways or other indoor RCSC facilities for walking is allowed

Our club has a tournament every year with singles and doubles events for both 'recreational' players and 'advanced' players. We also have a yearly club-provided luncheon, conditions allowing.

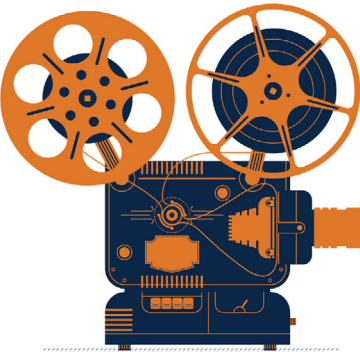

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Mindful Exercise Gets Results

“When exercising, it’s easy to slip into a mental to-do list or listen to music/books/or a podcast to take your mind off the physical demands you are putting on your body”, states fitness specialist Jane Fortier. “This approach can prove destructive, if used on a regular basis. If you aren’t getting the results you want from your workout or seem to be in a monotonous whirlwind, it’s probably because you need a more “mindful approach” to exercise.”

Mindful exercise, involves focusing on each individual movement during the workout. These movements are what help you achieve small goals. Recalling small goals during exercise is a motivator to gaining larger ones. Don’t get discouraged by a few super-buffed people around you. Focus instead, on how your own muscles respond to each exercise, and how much stronger they become with each repetition. Mindfulness gives a purpose to a workout. Staying mentally focused on each exercise boosts the effectiveness of the entire workout.

Studies reveal “increased muscle activity”, when concentrating intently on the muscle being worked in a particular exercise. The mind/muscle connection is important. During each exercise be mindful of which muscle is responsible for performing the move(s). Approach your workout by muscle group rather than by machine number. Focusing on each specific muscle group will force it to work 100%, instead of recruiting other muscles for help. Think about the last time you did crunches or ab exercises. Were you focused on your core muscles, or were you thinking about how much longer, until you could stop? The abdominals are one muscle group that commonly suffers from a poor mind/body connection. During a crunch, most individuals use momentum to produce the movement instead of contracting the actual muscles. By simply telling yourself to 'squeeze and pull in the navel, more muscle activation will be produced.

You don't have to be a bodybuilder to benefit from making the mind/muscle connection. Whatever your workout, focusing on the movements will help you learn new techniques and get more out of the experience. If you are using an aerobic machine, be mindful of your heartrate, or perceived exertion rate. Pay attention to how you are breathing and whether you have broken a sweat. Use interval patterns or vary the resistance and speed to achieve maximum results. If you are on a strength machine or using free weights, pay attention to posture, breathing, and muscle tissue at work, throughout the entire set of repetitions. If your mind wanders to other things, mistakes are made in each of these areas. Taking a mindful approach to exercise ensures that form and technique will be correct. This leads to safer workouts and less risk of injury.



Focus on the muscle you are using as you perform each exercise.

When you are tuned into your body, you'll pick up new sensations that you might miss, if you were mentally checked-out. Removing your attention from a magazine, phone, or the person next to you, will allow you to notice things that could slip-by unnoticed. Are you pushing harder with one leg than the other? Is your back rounded when it shouldn't be? Are you using body leverage to move the weights, rather than muscle? This new awareness will improve exercise form and reduce injury. Focusing on your movements will increase your workout satisfaction. Greater satisfaction leads to greater adherence, which leads to improved results. If you're just going through the motions, it may be time to put more mind into your workouts.

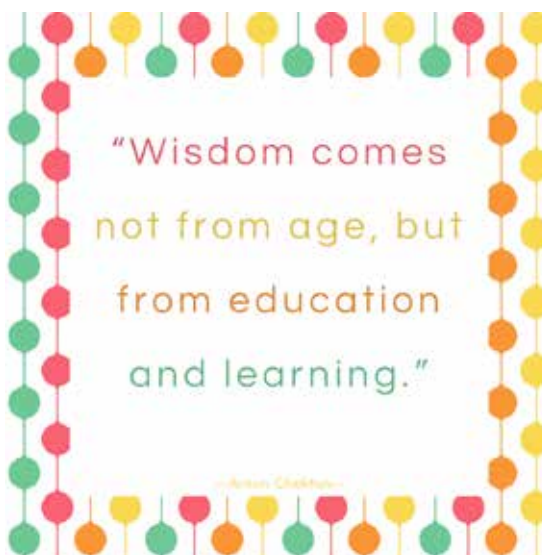
