A Message from Board President Lehrer

Reflecting on This Year's Accomplishments

Let's reflect and rejoice in all we have accomplished together. Despite a rough start, we have come a long way in improving Sun City and our Recreation Centers this year. We have developed a new meeting I like to call "The Exchange" - a fantastic way to come together and respectfully share ideas, make suggestions, and ask questions. Despite a few somewhat contentious meetings over the last few months, I have hope that the genuine spirit of give and take and compromise will return. I hope that respecting others and their opinions can be the order of the day.

The Lakes East/ West Maintenance building is now completed and operational. Even though this building is not for recreational purposes, it allows us to better maintain and expand the life of our golf assets, which is a win for everyone. Stop by the open house on Monday, December 12 from 12:30 to 2:30pm and check out this new facility located at 10406 W. Cameo Dr.

Even with all the rainfall, Viewpoint Lake is gradually emptying. Repairing the lake liner is a significant undertaking but critically needed to address the loss of a decreasing resource - water. Our management team has done an exceptional job meeting regularly with members impacted by this project. When completed, this project will ensure that our lake remains a jewel for Sun City now and in the future.

The Mountain View project is now moving forward. A general contractor has been hired, and the dreams of many are getting closer. Management has been meeting with clubs and activities that will

be impacted during this project. Clubs like Dance for Fitness and Aqua Fitness will be reassigned space and time at existing Centers. The Sun City Players will also need to be temporarily housed during construction. And plans are currently underway to build thirteen regulation Pickleball courts at Lakeview to address this sport's rapid growth and the loss of courts at Mountain View.

Another significant development this year was the successful negotiations with ADWR (Arizona Department of Water Resources). The persistent efforts of our General Manager will result in considerable savings as we move forward with required tuff reductions at our golf courses. Our Director of Golf and Grounds has also been experimenting with new seed that is more drought and heat tolerant. This seed has been used on a trial basis on some small areas and monitoring has produced positive results.

All this behind-the-scenes work is a great example of Teamwork. Looking back at all that we have accomplished in 2022, I am highly optimistic about the new year. Let's all be thankful and kind to one another. Remember Civility in all we do, and choose to be the difference in your life and your community.

Thoughts from a Pro -
5 Expedient Play = More Fun for Everyone

It's that time of year again when the courses are busy with lots of winter visitors and so it's a good time for a reminder about playing "ready golf." What exactly does that mean?

Well, the game of golf is more enjoyable for everyone if it moves along efficiently. This doesn't mean you have to feel rushed or hurried while hitting your shot. It simply means no matter what the situation is, you prepare yourself for your next shot before it's your turn.

On the tee box this means whoever is ready to hit should go ahead. While that person is hitting their shot, you should be selecting your club and be ready to go with your ball and tee in hand!

On the fairway drive to your ball anytime you can (without going in front of anyone) and prepare to hit. Also, once you have hit the shot, fill the divot and then get in the cart, perhaps even waiting to replace the headcover, wipe the club, or return it to the bag until the next stop, especially if you are not the driver of the cart.

Near the green it may mean bringing a couple of clubs with you to chip with, (in addition to your putter) if you're not sure of which one you might need, rather than having to make another trip back to the cart.

On the green it means contemplating the break, line or speed of your putt while others are putting and knowing who you follow so that when it's your turn you're ready to go.

And last remember not to mark your scorecard until you get to the next tee box so that the people behind you can hit their shot to the green as soon as you clear the green and drive away.

Remember - little things add up to lots of time over the course of a round! It's not about rushing your shot...it's about preparing ahead of time so you're ready to go when it's your turn. That makes all the difference in the world to those you're playing with! (And those behind you as well!)

90 Degree Rule

Managing to alleviate stress on golf course can be a constant issue for golf course superintendents. Foot or vehicular can cause soil compaction, soil degradation which can result in thinning turf canopy. The area of turf impact carrying two golfers is at least 48 times greater than the area affected by foot traffic.

A study conducted by a USGA agronomist had very surprising results. The average area of impact on a 6,200-yard golf course was staggering, one riding golfer with a motorized cart on 18 holes covered 4,761,600 sq ft. (1)

At RCSC we allow 5 golfers per tee time which results in a total number of square feet impacted is 19,046,400 sq ft. Peak golf season at RCSC golf courses we can see upwards to 250 golfers a day at an 18-hole golf course. The number of square feet impacted is tremendous.

RCSC golf course superintendents encourage golfers who play at RCSC courses to use the 90-degree rule.

The 90-degree rule is in place to minimize the impact on the turf. When the 90-degree rule is in effect at a golf course, it means.

- Riding in golf carts is allowed
- Those carts can be driven onto the fairway.
- They must remain on the cart path as much as possible, turning off the path only at right angles (90 degrees) to reach the player's ball.

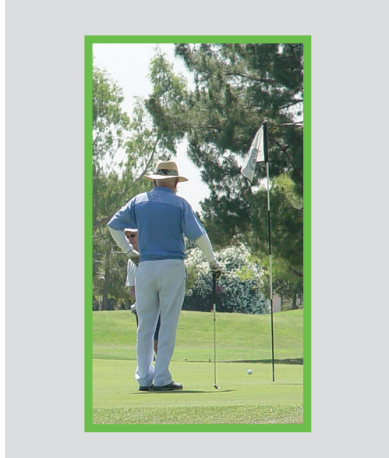

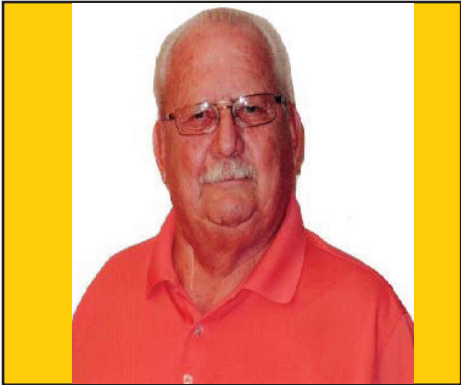

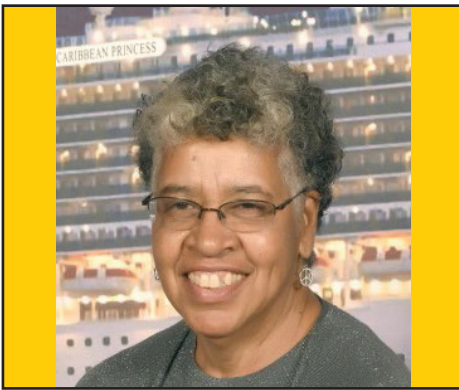

WHO ARE WE?

Across the nation, thousands of independent non-profit organizations called Friends of the Library exist to support their local libraries. They all have one common goal—to help the libraries thrive by providing assistance at all levels, from fundraising to staff support to community programs. All members are volunteers.

Water Conservation

Tips for Saving Water Over the Holidays

'Tis the season for giving - and for saving water with these simple tips. Cheers!

- Buy recycled paper products as those require much less water in their manufacturing than those made from virgin paper. Or better yet, use real plates and glassware for your party rather than waste going to the landfill.
- Check your bathroom fixtures for malfunctions or leaks. With company visiting there more potential for plumbing issues. Just a faulty toilet flapper can waste as much as 200 gallons per hour.
- Cook food in as little water as possible which also helps preserve nutrients. Try roasting vegetables and let the oven do double-duty when cooking holiday meals.
- Turn the water off while you lather when washing hands.
- Consider swapping meat for a vegetarian meal. It takes almost 1,800 gallons of water to produce just a pound of beef. If you were to skip meat one day a week, you'd conserve 65,000 gallons of water in a year. Wow!
- Don't use water to thaw food. Plan ahead and defrost food in the refrigerator.
- Use your dishwasher and run only full loads rather than hand washing.
- Use the leftover ice from your holiday party cocktails to water indoor plants.
- Rather than letting the faucet run, rinse vegetables in a pan of clean water instead.

Tips from Get Fit for Life

Exercise Mistakes Can Lead to Joint Injury

Seasoned exercisers and weekend-warriors will occasionally suffer joint injury. Those injuries could be avoided, with careful attention to some common pitfalls, when exercising:

- Doing too much, too soon – Whether coming back from an injury or starting a new exercise program, there is a tendency to push too hard. Joint injury is common when you don’t allow the body to adapt slowly to exercise. As an aging adult, every system in your body needs time to adapt to exercise: your muscles, circulatory system, ligaments, cartilage, bones, and joints. Ease into an exercise program, regardless of how motivated you are to get that workout going. If all goes well, progress sensibly, with the intensity, duration and frequency of what you are doing. It’s important to remember that a myriad of physiological changes are occurring in the body, after the age of 50. Exercise can help to deal with those changes, but caution should be used, as you delve into the “start-up” phase.
- Performing the same exercises all the time – Too much of a good thing, when exercising, can become a bad thing. Using the same workout approach, week after week, can trigger negative results. Your body likes change. Switch-up your cardio machines, and use various workout approaches with them. Change your strength routine with completely different exercises for each muscle group. Challenge your body with new stretches – this will bring better results, with fewer injuries. Taxing the same muscles and joints in the same way, week after week, can easily lead to overuse injury and cartilage decline. Moving muscles and joints in different directions, with varied intensities, will improve mobility and fitness, as well as increase bone density.
- Exercising with improper technique and form – If the seat or resistance level on a cardio machine is set improperly, knee or hip injury can occur; if pivot-point and range-of-motion settings on weight machines are overlooked, shoulder, elbow, knee or hip joint problems can develop; if gait patterns, alignment, and form are poorly executed with body-weight exercises (squats, lunges), the body is at risk with every movement. Diligence and attention to detail is necessary, if joints are going to perform correctly through the required range of motion. Proper form is the key to exercise results, and joint security. Focusing carefully on form and exercise execution is a must. Some exercises may be entirely contraindicated, due to existing physical concerns and issues. This fact needs to be respected, in order to remain injury-free.
- Non-supportive footwear – Although saving money and fashion trends are the primary motivators in footwear purchases, those same motivators may be leading to joint concerns. Wearing shoes with too little support, and ones that don’t lend themselves to specific anatomical and mechanical issues (over-pronation, supination) will put knee & hip joints at risk. Exercise footwear is best purchased from a professional, who can analyze needs and issues, and recommend appropriate shoes for each exercise activity. Proper footwear is far more important than most people realize.

Whether you are a seasoned exerciser or new to the workout world, a Get Fit for Life personal trainer can help you avoid the exercise pitfalls that result in joint problems. Trainers monitor form, technique, cadence, breathing, and all of the elements that result in correct exercise protocol. All medical issues are taken into consideration, before a program is designed.
