First, thank you for your service. We know that balancing various priorities and working for the best interest of the RCSC Membership is a daunting, and often thankless task. We appreciate your willingness and commitment to serve.

We know you have already heard from several SCPC members on the need for more pickleball courts with a specific number of additional courts requested. It appears clear the data presented during the SAC meetings (and at prior meetings) more than support the request.

Pickleball is exploding in Sun City as well as in the rest of the country and is a decision factor for those that move here. We had a couple at our Introduction to Pickleball class yesterday that were playing in their driveway because "they want to learn the game and find people to play with."
