With our eye on the future, we are counting on you to help us make good choices. It's a collective process that has proven successful. In an effort to further this process, I will not be writing my monthly column. In its place, I am giving space to a member of the community to share their thoughts on the community we all love. – RCSC Board President Kat Fimmel

Sun City is the City of Volunteers. People who have chosen to give of themselves in so many different roles to help make our community a wonderful place to live.

The people who serve on the Recreation Centers of Sun City (RCSC) Board of Directors are residents who give of their time and various talents and knowledge. Their goal is to steer the day-to-day operations of the RCSC for the best possible outcome. The same is true for their long-term goals for RCSC.

Sometimes residents are confused over the duties of the RCSC Board of Directors. They are not in charge of running Sun City as a community. They have no governing authority outside the RCSC. This means they have no authority to enforce Sun City CC&Rs. Age overlays, code enforcement, and all other covenants, conditions, and restrictions fall under the jurisdiction of the Sun City Homeowners Association (SCHOA). This is a separate organization dedicated to successfully maintaining our community.

The members who have chosen to serve on the RCSC Board of Directors serve in many capacities. Beyond holding Board meetings, they hold monthly Exchange meetings where any member can speak to the Board to address any RCSC related concerns, complaints, or requests. Afterwards, the Board meets to discuss how best to address these member concerns.

Additionally, Board members spend numerous hours preparing for the various committee meetings, following up on actions needed.

Basic Tips for Solid Putting

When it comes to putting there are almost as many different grips, stances, and styles as there are putters! In other words, everyone is individual and what works for one person may not work for another. Preferences vary across the board and that is OK! There are a few things that most good putters have in common…let's talk about them.

First it is important to line up your putt from behind the ball. Use the ball as a reference point or pick an intermediate target on the green but use both eyes facing the hole. Perception with your eyes from the side of the ball will generally not be accurate.

Second, make sure your eyes are above the golf ball on your set-up. Standing over the ball in this way helps you make a straighter back and forth stroke which keeps the ball on line. The further you are away from the ball the more difficult it is to control the direction.

Third, use your hands, arms, and shoulders together to make a pendulum like stroke. This might mean having both arms straight, or one straight and one bent, or both arms with the elbows bent. Regardless of how you start the key is to keep it the same as you make the stroke back and forth. This eliminates the use of the wrists, which is a much riskier way to putt and makes it harder to control direction and distance. If this is difficult for you consider going to a long putter which makes it harder to use too much of the wrists or try your left hand low on the grip.

Remember, once your mechanics are solid and consistent, putting is largely about confidence. Practice pressure- type situations, perhaps a putting contest with a friend, to simulate on course conditions.

RCSC Board of Directors Election Candidates

RCSC Members in good standing are eligible to vote in the upcoming RCSC Board of Directors Election online via the Web Portal through Election Day (Tuesday, December 12) at 4pm.

This year there are six (6) candidates vying for four (4) open positions. Three positions are for three-year terms and the fourth position is for one year.

The top three candidates with the most votes will serve 3-year terms and the fourth candidate elected will serve one year. Candidates must receive a minimum of 100 votes in order to win a seat on the Board. Should an adequate number of votes not be cast for candidates to be elected, the Board will appoint another Member(s) to complete the term(s) which remain unfilled.

While RCSC Members are encouraged to vote online via the RCSC Web Portal, other options are available. Absentee ballots may be requested by contacting the Corporate Office at 623-561-4600 and the last day to request an absentee ballot be mailed is Friday, December 1. Members also have the option of picking up an absentee ballot at the Corporate Office but all absentee ballots must be received no later than December 12.

Tips from Get Fit for Life

Momentum Obstacles During Weight Loss

Losing weight can be an emotional rollercoaster," states Jane Fortier, personal trainer and weight management specialist. "In the beginning, things go great. You're motivated, determined and excited about your plan. The scale moves in the right direction. You feel alive, energized and confident. Just when you think you have everything under control, life begins to shift. The energy level starts plummeting. You aren't nearly as excited as you were weeks earlier. You begin to skip exercise sessions. Junk food slips back into your diet, especially during the holiday season. Your momentum begins to dissipate. Before long, you come to a complete standstill. The little voice in your head says, I'm tired, I don't want to do this anymore."

Basic Momentum Obstacles will always crop-up, with any weight loss journey. Identifying these obstacles, might make a difference in your success:

- Boredom Whether it's eating the same "healthy" foods, sticking to the same exercise routine or just the realization that this is a lifelong journey, boredom inevitably sets in. Remedy: Keep things interesting. Adding variety and switching things up, with both eating and exercise, will make the journey more enjoyable. When you start making excuses for sticking to your plan, boredom is usually the culprit.
- 2. The Dreaded Plateau You are losing weight at a slow but steady pace, then it stops. You haven't seen a change in weeks, and you are feeling discouraged. Remedy: Alter your mindset. Plateaus are not a bad thing, but rather your body's way of adjusting to a lower weight. Staying at a new set-point for a few weeks or even months is a significant accomplishment. The number on the scale may not be changing, but your body composition probably is. Shift your focus from weight loss to improved health! Once you have a better attitude about plateaus, mix up your exercise routine and alter eating habits. The plateau will subside.
- 3. Changes in Routine Life always throws you curve balls: you suddenly face health concerns with a spouse; guests will be visiting from out of town; a two week vacation is coming up; the holiday season has arrived. These routine shifts can make it difficult to squeeze in exercise and stay-on-course with healthy eating. Remedy: Go back to the beginning of your journey. Before you started that journey, you had to figure out the "what, where and how" that you would use. Time to do that again. Figure out how to approach these shifts in routine. Failure to plan is planning to fail. Life is constantly shifting. If staying healthy is important, you must engage in healthy habits always, not just when it's convenient. Think ahead, plan for changes!
- 4. End-of-Day Fatigue and Lack of Sleep As the day wanes on, so does your resolve. Evenings can be tough, especially after keeping it together all day long. If you're skimping on sleep, it makes it

even more difficult to muster the energy to focus on goals, after trudging through a full day's responsibilities. Remedy: Fatigue is indeed the enemy of weight loss. Sleep deprivation messes with your hormones, causing a surge in the hormones that increase appetite and a decrease in the ones that signal satiation. When overly fatigued, impulsive choices interfere with food selection. Making sensible choices becomes more difficult. If you want to have sustained weight loss, you must prioritize sleep in order to eliminate fatigue.

5. Living with Someone Who Is Not Concerned with Weight Loss - We are influenced by those with whom we spend the most time. When your partner is not concerned about losing weight or healthy eating, you may find yourself faced with temptation or coerced in some way. Unknowingly, those partners are sabotaging your goals. Remedy: You must speak up and make your needs known. By voicing your concern, you will open up possibilities for compromise. Don't preach or try to convince your partner to join in a weight-loss program, just ask that he or she support you, in your efforts.

Hopefully, these suggestions will help with overcoming momentum obstacles, when they arise. On the weight loss journey, surround yourself with positive, supportive people, and become your own cheerleader and best friend. 
Water Conservation Tips for Winter Months
