Goodbye Host Punch Cards; Hello Online Guest Passes

The Recreation Centers of Sun City will no longer sell Host Punch Cards in order for Members' guests to use community amenities and facilities.

Guest Passes are already available for purchase online via the RCSC Web Portal, which allows you to purchase only the specific days your guests will be using RCSC facilities and/or participating in various activities that require guest fee charges - right from the comfort of home (or anywhere else with an internet connection).

In order to purchase Guest Passes online, you must have an RCSC Portal Account. Please refer to "Getting Started on the RCSC Web Portal" instructions for further assistance: https://suncityaz.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/04/Getting-Started-on-the-RCSC-Web-Portal-2024-04.pdf (or turn to page 10 for additional assistance).

To Purchase Guest Passes:

Log into your RCSC Web Portal Account and select "Guest Passes" from the top menu. Choose the number of days desired (up to seven max), then enter Start and End Dates along with the Number of Guests.

Each guest must be entered separately using full legal name per government-issued ID (which is required to be shown to Facility Attendant/Monitors upon arrival at center). Once all guests have been entered, select "Accept Terms" and complete Cardholder Information as required. Continue to the payment screen (Purchase Guest Pass button) and enter credit card information (Visa, MasterCard and Discover). Confirm your purchase and print the document. Note: You may need to scroll down to find the "PRINT GUEST PASS" button at the bottom of the screen.

Your guests are now ready to enjoy all that Sun City AZ has to offer. And since your online purchase included verification of Member Account Information, adult guests can visit the facilities unescorted. If you escort a guest to an RCSC facility but forget your paper Guest Pass, the Center Associate will be able to pull up your Guest Pass details showing dates and Guest names.

RCSC Members/Cardholders without computer access can complete purchases of Guest Passes by accessing Customer Service Kiosks located at three convenient locations – Bell and Fairway Centers at the fitness/pool check-ins stations and at the Lakeview Center inside the Cardholder Services Office (lower level, limited to office hours

only). It should be noted that purchases made at kiosks will require that Members already have an RCSC Web Portal account established in order to purchase a Guest Pass. Those RCSC Members/Cardholders needing further assistance if they are do not have any computer/electronic accessibility will need to visit the Cardholder Services Office to complete the purchase of Guest Passes.

Please Note: RCSC will continue to honor previously purchased Host Punch Cards; however, we encourage Members to use existing supplies within the next 12 months. Your cooperation and understanding as we streamline and update this process is appreciated.

Let's Say "So Long" to Comment Cards & Start Submitting Service Requests

We're pleased to present RCSC Members with a new web-based platform that allows you to share compliments, comments, and concerns – right at your fingertips, from any device! As of June 1, paper comment cards will no longer be available as we transition to this new cuttingedge platform. Here's everything you need to know:

- Convenient Web Access: Simply visit https://suncityaz.citysourced. com/ to get started. It's user-friendly and accessible from any device with an internet connection.
- Personalized Experience: Create your account using your email address to track your submissions and receive email responses; anonymous submissions cannot be accepted.
- Accessibility Options: For those without access to a computer or smart device, the same kiosks located at the Bell and Fairway fitness/pool check-in stations in addition to the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview (see above for details) are available.
- Enhanced Tracking & Reporting: With this new system, we'll have better tracking capabilities, internal analytics and reporting to address issues promptly and make improvements as needed.
- Your Feedback Matters: We've listened to your concerns about the old paper-based system, and we're thrilled to bring you this innovative solution. Your satisfaction drives us forward, and we can't wait for you to experience the difference!

Consider Attending Candidate Info Sessions

Of all the ways one can find meaning in life, I'm quite partial to one Jordan Peterson offered in a college commencement address.

"My observation," he said, "was that most people find the cardinal meanings in their life not as a consequence of the development of their self, whatever that is, but in service to other people, in the adoption of responsibility....That's where you find the abiding meaning in your life, and you need that meaning to sustain you through suffering."

Service goes hand in hand with volunteerism, a quality Sun City residents have embodied for decades. Sun City as we know it today would never exist were it not for the thousands of folks who have selflessly poured themselves into service that focused not on themselves, but on the greater good of our community. Volunteers get tired, of course, and probably question their involvement a time or two; sometimes they even have to step away from what their hearts originally led them to, but I'd be willing to bet that there's a deep and lasting satisfaction that fills their souls and crowns their efforts with meaning. It's just one of countless opportunities our members have to serve, and maybe it's one you might consider. RCSC is governed by an elected board of nine members, and on the second Tuesday in December five open slots will be filled by the popular vote of our membership. The number is higher than the usual three who are concluding a three-year term, as two resignations this year leave additional spots open.

Comments Presented at 4/25 BOD Meeting

Good Morning, how is everyone doing today? Thank you for being here, and hello to all of those who will watch this on the internet.

Wow, time flies when you are having fun, and when you work where Recreation is our First name, it should be fun, most of the time anyway.

I have been in this GM role for almost 7 months now, and it has been fun, exciting, and challenging, never dull and boring, that is for sure. And even at my advanced age, there is still much for me to learn.

Here are a few things that you may find of interest...

Please know how it saddens me, and bothers me, that so many of you were put through the distress, trauma, and emotional pain of being told both of our Sun City County Libraries were being closed, to repurpose the areas, or to save money. That simply was not true, only the Fairway Library was being discussed for possible closure, due to safety concerns.

My mistake was working with the Maricopa County Real Estate Department that initiated the discussion with me in February, rather than dealing directly with the Maricopa County Library District. This has been remedied a couple weeks ago, when we had a great meeting with the Library District, and should have a new five year lease for both libraries, in the near future, and well before the current lease ends.

Next, let's talk about the infamous 20 million dollars of deferred maintenance, that was mentioned last summer. Some folks may have thought these were emergency repairs that needed to be done immediately to keep us operating in a safe manner. Please know we always focus on critical safety items immediately, if not sooner.

So where did the 20 million number come from...? When you have as many assets as we do, it is prudent to keep track of them with regard to their installation or purchase date, original cost, expected life, and repair

and or replacement cost. The expected life, repair costs, and replacement costs are estimates, and rarely are set in stone, in fact they are known to change over time. What this asset list becomes is known as a reserve study, it tells you approximately how much money you should have in reserve each year to keep all your assets in good shape.

Our reserve study last summer showed we would need about 20 million to catch up, this was the source of the now infamous 20 million in deferred maintenance. Work on the reserve study started last year, and continues today, with a new project manager focused on updating the expected life and cost assumptions. The work on the reserve study should be substantially complete in May, in time to be folded into the new five-year plan. It looks like the deferred maintenance number will be closer to 16 or 17 million, and with 6 plus million in the works this year, we should be down to almost 10 million by the end of the year. We have the funds to cover these expenses over the next few years, and beyond.

Let's talk about the new first ever five-year plan team, this is a management team comprised of roughly 1/3 Long Range Planning Committee members, 1/3 Budget, Finance, and Audit Committee members, and 1/3 management senior leadership. First of all, thank you, thank you, thank you, the team has taken a process that was only in my head during my General Manager interviews, then put into some words in December, and given to the team in January. They have flushed it out into a more robust process with an initial output delivered to a joint session of LRP and BFA, with a few interested members in mid-April.

The final output of the team will be a five-year operating and CIF (Capital Improvement Fund) budget, and ten-year PIF (Preservation and Improvement Fund) budget.

These will be submitted to the board and both committees mid-May. Again, thanks to the team, this effort will feed right into the new budget process schedule.

And lastly, I'd like to talk about our Centers, and the new leadership structure in place, and how that will simplify some communication needs. There are many things happening at every center here, some you never notice, others you can hardly miss.

We need to communicate better about the major items in every center, in real time at each center. This especially applies to the very obvious, for example at Bell, the indoor spa and the automatic entry doors to the pool/fitness area. Work is being done on both, but the status is not well known or understood.

To remedy that, each center will develop and make available the Top 10 items being worked on, with a comment on the status, and estimated completion date.

Also, our video team aka In-Focus will be making a series of videos, each highlighting one center, talking with each center leader and others. This video series should be starting in the next month or so.

So as usual there is a lot going on here, things are changing in many positive ways, and it will continue...




