Online Voting Continues Through Election Day

The Recreation Centers of Sun City Board of Directors Elections is only a few weeks away and RCSC Members are reminded that early voting continues via the RCSC Web Portal (at www.sunaz. com under RCSC Cardholder Login) through 4pm on Election Day (Tuesday, December 13, 2016).

The candidates seeking election this year to the Board are: Bruce Alleman, Bernice Darish, Jerry DeLano, Stella Van Ness and David Wieland. See page 2 to view the complete Candidate Biography listings.

These five candidates are vying for three 3-year positions and one 2-year

position on the RCSC Board of Directors. Seats being vacated are those currently held by President Dan Schoeder, Treasurer Michael Kennedy and Director Peter Lee. The fourth vacancy, created by a resignation, is currently filled by Director Ron Jesse.

Members who are unable to participate in early voting may also cast their ballot in-person on Election Day from 8am to 4pm in Lakeview Social Hall #2.

Absentee ballots may still be obtained by contacting the RCSC Board Office at 623-561-4600. The last day to request an absentee ballot be mailed is December 2 and all absentee ballots must be received no later than December 13.

"We had a good turn-out at the candidate forums and I feel that Member's concerns were well addressed by the candidates," stated RCSC Board Vice President Rich Hoffer.

Candidate literature continues to be available at various RCSC locations and those candidates in attendance will be introduced at the remaining Board/Member Exchange on Monday, December 5.

Winners will be announced at a press conference and Members will be notified by email blast the morning following the election. Full election coverage will appear in the January 2017 edition of SunViews.





Golf Report

Pro Shops

We will be hosting a Beat-the-Pros on Thursday, December 8 at Willowcreek Golf Course. This event is held in conjunction with other RCSC events throughout the year to raise funds for the RCSC Management Team annual chosen charity. This year the chosen charity is the Sun City Foundation. The Sun City Foundation supports RCSC members who have outlived their resources through assistance with RCSC annual property assessments and transportation. Through the foundation RCSC members are able to continue using the facilities and remain active and social. The format will be a two person scramble.

Through August, total revenue has exceeded budget by \$102,882 and prior year by \$272,210. For the year 93.4% of rounds played of been played by residents and their guests. Total merchandise through August is \$7,500 ahead of budget and \$8,243 ahead of prior year. We thank everyone for their support. Please remember, though we do not carry a regular inventory of golf clubs, we can special order equipment from any supplier. In most cases we can match the price offered at big box retailers on current year items.

Snack Shops

Through August, snack shop revenue is running \$13,243 ahead of budget. The shops that reopened on October 22 are scheduled to close at 3pm, but are given the discretion to remain open as long as demand dictates. We have recently added Pabst Blue Ribbon and Miller High Life to our beer selection.

Courses

Overseeding has progressed largely as expected, with temperatures favorable for germination, although a little too high to put the bermuda into dormancy. Riverview experienced technical issues with various controllers on the course related to firmware located within the controllers. These issues hampered the ability to water areas on several holes and resulted in operating controllers manually.

The South course recently underwent a minor tee box renovation on the 10th and 17th holes. The tee boxes throughout the course have been revamped and the course reopened with a new tee system following overseeding. The tee boxes will closely resemble the setup on all courses, with yellow (tee it forward), red, white, blue and black (championship) teeing options. Yardages and ratings from the previous teeing system have not changed significantly; however, the new system does eliminate the combo tee system, which was a source of confusion.

Gary Brawley, our golf course architect, was present during the recent Willowcreek/ Willowbrook green committee meeting. Gary presented the design of each green to those in attendance and was available to answer any questions or concerns. It is important to note that the design concept for the green renovation on Willowcreek has always been different than North and Riverview. The concept has never been to reimagine the design concept of the current greens. The purpose of this design is to soften the greens that are currently too severe and to change the soil profile to the USGA design. The design of the greenside bunkers will not be changed, with the exception of hole number 5. The bunker that currently guards the front right of the green will be removed, at the request of the committee.

Grounds and Lawn Bowling

Watering on Lawn Bowl greens has been reduced, though it is important to note that the warm October temperatures have not allowed the bermuda grass to enter dormancy. Though watering is significantly reduced in the winter, the bermuda grass still needs water throughout the winter. We have asked the club presidents to encourage their respective clubs to regularly move mat locations throughout the winter, to avoid unnecessary wear in any one area.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed our third quarter with every division in a positive variance position from budget. Gross Income, Wages, Payroll Taxes & Benefits, Repairs & Maintenance and General Operating Expenses all ended September 30, 2016 well within budget. Utilities, however, ended the guarter \$101,069 over budget year-to-date at quarter end. Utility costs are controlled primarily by weather and with a hotter than normal spring and fall we have been unable to operate within our budgeted utility expenses. In the golf division annual golf pass income increased \$40k from prior year, as did Cardholder Green Fees by \$47k. The Public Daily Green Fees increased by \$77k because all courses were open which created more tee times open for public play this year than last. Managing this \$20M operation requires one to balance the needs and wants of the RCSC Cardholders, the RCSC personnel and the corporation. I feel like we do a very good job at keeping all of those in balance.

Bowling:

Signups for the annual New Year's Eve Party at Lakeview Lanes will begin at 9am on November 1, 2016. The party starts at 8pm with a potluck, bowling and prize drawings, the night will end with a champagne toast to ring in the new year. Everyone is welcome to the event even if you are not a bowler, stop by Lakeview Lanes or Bell Lanes to reserve your spot as availability is limited.

On October 15, 2016 Bell Lanes hosted the Sun City Bowling Hall of Fame tournament which was the most successful yet with 81 entries. The Sun City Bowling Hall of Fame committee will be announcing inductees very soon and will follow with an induction dinner.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in September decreased some from last month and were 3% below the monthly average for the year. Overall accounts receivables decreased by 1.3% in September. August assessments went 30 days past due at an increased 5.8% rate while July assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.3% rate. The shift in receivables from current into the past due category continued in September. Payments from our third party collections firm were down again in September with year to date payments totaling \$168,023.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in September totaled \$70,404. Year to date web portal payments total \$744,062. During this time over 2,800 property owners have used the web portal to make payments.

In September property transfer related balances decreased by just under 3% and lender owned related balances decreased by 30%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represent approximately 56% of all receivables due and 55% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased to 44 properties at the end of September. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased this month to 16 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in September were \$577,000, which is \$276,000 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$6,199,100 which is \$2,121,600, or 52%, over budget for the year.

Human Resources:

Recently we completed and submitted wage data that is required by the Occupational Employment Statistics Unit of the Arizona Office of Economic Opportunity. Required was current salaries for every employee by RCSC work location. The information is incorporated in various labor markets and is available anonymously to employers. In addition, the information may be expanded in the future for compliance with the Equal Pay for Equal Work Act.

This year Arizona minimum wage will not be known until after the election on November 8. Current minimum wage is \$8.05 per hour and based on the cost of living index would increase to \$8.15 per hour in 2017. However, Proposition 206 on the November ballot would establish a new state minimum wage of \$10.00 per hour if it passes. If Proposition 206 does not pass, minimum wage may go to the \$8.15 per hour. At \$8.15 per hour approximately 64 RCSC employees will be affected directly. The \$10.00 per hour change will have a much greater impact obviously.

The audit of RCSC's Employees 401(k) plan for calendar year 2015 has been successfully completed and the results have been filed with the Department of Labor along with the IRS Form 5500. This is the first filing we have completed through Fidelity's online web station.

We have completed and submitted a participation review questionnaire required by Blue Cross/Blue Shield. When received, BC/BS uses the information to possibly provide rate relief. Our participation rate is 98% which is an excellent rating.

Member Services:

On November 6 we will have a tribute to the Andrew Sisters as we honor our veterans. This will be a show to remember as we thank our veterans of the past, present and future, as well as their families, for all they have sacrificed for us and our great country!

Project Updates

General Information

Toilets and lavatories continue to be replaced at all on-course golf restrooms.
Remaining locations for toilets and lavatories are as follows: two at South, four at
Willowbrook, two at Lakes West and two at Quail Run. The RCSC plumber is committed to completing these locations in November 2016. Four hollow metal doors will
also be replaced (two at Lakes West and two at Quail Run). Roofing Contractor was
DFG Builders (Cost \$24,104), Doors by D.H. Pace and Painting/Plumbing by RCSC
Skilled Trades. (Cost - \$24,857)

Lakeview Center

- A new floating dock has been ordered for Viewpoint Lake. The new dock will
 accommodate RCSC's existing boats with a couple of additional spaces for other
 lake boats and future growth. Installation of the new dock is scheduled to commence Monday, November 14, 2016. Contractor is Floatation Systems and the RCSC
 Skilled Trades team.(Cost \$62,996)
- The old plumbers snake found in the clay club drain line was successfully removed.
 In addition, the drain pipe was water jetted and the sink area in the carpenters shop reinstalled. Contractor was Sunland Plumbing. (Cost \$3,800)
- The security fencing at Lakeview Hillside Park continues to progress with gate installations and final touch up work to be completed in early November 2016. Contractor is Save-On Fence. (Cost – \$21,800)
- The main entrance doors into the wood shop were replaced with bronze storefront doors on October 21, 2016. Contractor is D.H. Pace. (Cost – \$2,825)

Bell Center

- Renovation of the two main Bell Library restrooms is progressing well with floor and wall tile nearing completion. Following this tile work the toilets, lavatories, partitions and mirrors will be completed. The restrooms are expected to be thoroughly cleaned and re-opened in November 2016. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$100,000)
- Preparations to remodel the Bell Visitor Center are well underway. Asbestos testing
 has been completed and both Sun City Fire and Maricopa County Building permits
 have been secured. The project is currently out for bid with three general contractors and a permit application for a temporary visitor center office submitted. Additional details will be shared in the November B&I report.

Sundial Center

- A new ceiling which includes new LED light and track light fixtures has been installed in the Palo Verde Artist Club. Contractors were Kowalski Electric, Ace Acoustics, SES Electronics, Olympic Fire and Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$25,532)
- Three new power drop cords have now been installed in the Silver Stones clubroom. Contractor is Kowalski Electric. (Cost \$1,342)

Marinette Center

- The remodel of the auditorium, social hall ceiling, main restrooms, kitchen and installation of two new swimming pool restrooms is progressing well and expected to reopen in November 2016. Remaining work to be completed includes the installation of the cabinets and tops in the kitchen and two restrooms, installation of appliances, toilets, lavatories, restroom partitions, interior doors and some various detail work. Contractors are DVP Professional Builders, Accel Electric and Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$259,015)
- Plans are underway to pulverize, repave and restripe the west parking lot at Marinette Center. This work will commence November 16, 2016 and is expected to be completed November 23, 2016. Contractor is Regional Paving. (Cost \$148,600)
- Plans are also underway to seal coat and restripe the south parking lot at Marinette.
 This work will occur immediately following the repaving of the west parking lot.

 Contractor is Regional Paving. (Cost \$4,575)

Lakes East/West

 The entire parking lot at Lakes East/West/Talisman Hall has been seal coated and restriped. This work occurred the week of October 17, 2016. Contractor was Regional Paving. (Cost \$11,340)

Willowcreek/Willowbrook Maintenance

 Construction of the new maintenance building has commenced and plans are underway to demolish the current Willowcreek/Willowbrook maintenance building. The new steel maintenance building will serve the golf maintenance staff and the RCSC Skilled Trades department. Contractors are DVP Professional Builders and Bunger Steel. (Cost – (PIF) \$1,881,825)

Willowcreek/Willowbrook Pro Shop

 The Pro Shop at WC/WB has been re-carpeted. Contractor was Resource Carpet. (Cost – \$8,519)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 286 work orders during the last two weeks of September 2016 and the first two weeks of October 2016.

Centers Operations

- Congratulations to Cory Hedges at Lakeview for his recent 5-year anniversary and to Kurt Beck at Oakmont for his 10-year anniversary with the RCSC. Both make great contributions to the successful operation of their respective centers.
- New umbrellas were recently installed at the pickleball gathering area at Mountain View.
- Now that fall has arrived, pool heaters and the thermal solar systems have been turned on. Even though it is hot during the day, the night time temperatures are dipping down into the 60's and 70's which necessitates heating the pools. Pool thermal blankets at all centers (except Sundial) coupled with thermal solar heating systems at Marinette, Bell, Oakmont and Mountain View significantly reduce the RCSC's energy costs for heating swimming pool water.

Water Conservation

Did You Know These Interesting Water Facts?

That leaving a garden hose running unchecked while you finish scrubbing the car wastes at least six gallons of water per minute? It does depend on the length and diameter of the hose as well as water pressure, but still, what a horrible waste to see it running down the street! If you use a nozzle, you can save, save, save.

Not only does steaming vegetables conserve more of their nutrients, but also uses less water than boiling them? The water left over from steamed vegetables has nutrients in it, so save that for making soup stock or gravy. If that seems unappealing, at least let it cool off and try giving it to your pet. If they won't drink it, pour it on your favorite plant.

Technology has given us a device that will turn your shower water to a trickle after it has reached a comfortable temperature for bathing and you're not ready to get in yet? This means you can finish your shave, drink your coffee or brush your teeth and your hot shower water is waiting without blasting streams of wasted water down the drain. Basically, the unit is a "standalone thermostatic shut-off valve" and its function is to save the hot water that's wasted during the shower warm-up process. Visit http://thinkevolve.com/ for more information. Amazing!



That compared to a standard washer built only 20 years ago, a new Energy Star certified clothes washer uses about 70% less energy and 75% less water? Perhaps it's time to replace that old washer? Compare that new washer at approximately 10-13 gallons per load (depending on the make of machine) to the "old-school" model that uses 29-45 gallons (or more!) per load.

That drying your clothes on a rack or clothesline actually saves water? That's because it saves the copious amounts of water it takes to manufacture the electricity required



to run the dryer. If it's time to get a new clothes dryer, find one with a moisture sensor. This can help cut energy use up to 15% and the dryer will never run longer than it has to. If the model or make that is most appealing to you is not made with a moisture sensor, see if it's available with a temperature sensor. This can still cut energy use up to 10%. If you use softener sheets, be sure to clean those sensors once in a while. The softener sheets can cause a build-up on the sensors, making them less efficient. And it's worth mentioning that any dryer is much more efficient if you clean the lint trap after every load.

Recycling one pound of paper – approximately the same amount found in a typical daily newspaper – can save about 3.5 gallons of water? Nice! Recycling paper uses 50% less water and saves 60% of the energy needed to manufacture paper from new materials.

The energy saved from recycling one glass bottle can run a 100-watt light bulb for four hours or a compact fluorescent bulb for 20 hours? It also causes 50% less water pollution (and 20% less air pollution) than manufacturing a new bottle from raw materials. A modern glass bottle would take 4,000 years or more to decompose; even longer if it's in a landfill. Interesting fact: glass (and aluminum) can be recycled an infinite number of times.



Tips from Get Fit for Life -

The Importance of Posture

"Good posture is necessary to keep the body aligned correctly. As we age, shoulders slump and the head moves forward. This phenomenon takes a serious toll on the spine, shoulders, hips, and knees", states Jane Fortier, fitness professional for Get Fit for Life.

"Poor posture can lead to a cascade of structural flaws, resulting in back and joint pain, reduced flexibility, and compromised muscles. When the body is poorly aligned, joints function incorrectly, causing some muscles to work harder than others. Overworked muscles become tense, while others weaken. These muscular imbalances slowly evolve into poorer posture."

The cycle of poor posture can be broken, with consistent attention to the following fitness objectives:

Strengthen Core –
 which includes ab dominals, lower back,
 obliques, and hips. If
 any core muscles are

weak, other muscles have to compensate, resulting in loss of motion, balance and stability.

- Fix Rounded Shoulders which results from sitting at a desk or computer, texting
 and smartphone usage, driving in a car with bucket seats, watching TV from a Lazy
 Boy recliner, reading for extended periods of time, cooking at the counter or stove,
 working at the sink, etc. In these forward positions, the muscles in the chest, shoulders and hips shorten, as the muscles in the upper and middle back weaken.
- Neutralize Tilted Hips –a condition that develops from sitting too much or spending hours in activities where the legs are bent. An anterior pelvic tilt in the hip area indicates weak hamstrings, gluts and abs, and tight hip flexors and thighs.
- Retract a Forward Head this head alignment develops after hours, days and years
 of working at a desk, driving a car or truck, watching TV, sitting at a computer, and
 more recently, using a tablet or smartphone. These activities tighten the front and
 side neck muscles, while weakening the deep, rear muscles of the neck. Muscles in
 the front of the neck must be strong enough to hold the head so that the ears are
 directly over the shoulders.

Designing a workout that includes all of the exercises needed to improve posture might seem a little overwhelming. A Get Fit for Life personal trainer can create an exercise program that addresses posture, or any issue that concern an active aging adult. 

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.




OPEN DOOR POLICY

To return to the values of the American Revolution, the newspapers offer a public forum in which citizens can express their opinions anonymously (edited to keep the discussions as open as possible, within the bounds of fair play). There are also letters to the editor and guest commentaries from experts on various topics.


