The RCSC Board of Directors election results are in. The total number of ballots cast in this year's election totaled 1,213 (127 absentee ballots, 133 ballots at the poll and 953 electronic ballots cast online).

The successful candidates elected to serve on the RCSC Board beginning in 2018 are:

- Dan Schroeder who received 873 votes,
- Sue Wilson who received 752 votes, and
- Dale Lehrer who received 727 votes.

ATTN: RCSC Cardholders

RCSC would like to remind Cardholders of a few items which require your attention when using the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at the following locations: RCSC Monitor Stations (cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are therefore for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Registration for Get Golf Ready classes is underway and the \$99 fee includes 4 days of instruction as part of group of 8 students or less, as well as a 5th day of on-course instruction. The program covers swing fundamentals as well as golf etiquette and an introduction to golf rules. The program is part of a national initiative of the PGA of America to grow the game of golf. The golf professionals also offer private golf instruction at a location that is convenient to the golfer. Contact information for the professionals can be found on the website at www.suncityaz.org under the Golf tab, then Lessons or at one of our golf pro shops.

We now have Ping Demo clubs available at the Riverview Pro Shop that can be used for on-the-course trials; these are available Monday-Friday. We have a selection of drivers, fairway woods, hybrids and putters. A credit card number is required for the demo to cover loss or unusual damage while in your possession. Please remember if you are in the market for a new club we can order from any manufacturer and can match pricing on current year models to the "big box" stores.

Golf Courses

All courses have opened from overseeding. Lakes East, Willowcreek, Quail Run and North are scheduled to lift cart path restrictions on November 24. Should this date change, golfers will be notified via email. We have been receiving positive comments on course condition, post over-seed and they are appreciated. The success of overseeding is not fully realized until after the first frost of the season and the summer bermuda goes fully dormant.

As play increases, so does the stress on our courses. We remind all golfers that we all have a responsibility to keep our courses in good condition. Golfers can assist by filling their divots, raking sand traps, replacing rakes in bunkers parallel to play and repairing ball marks. During times of cart path restrictions, please remember to take your sand bottle to the fairway.

The plans for the Willowcreek greens and turf reduction for both Willowbrook and Willowcreek are now on display in the Willowcreek/Willowbrook pro shop. We encourage anyone that is interested in this project to come in and view the plans. This project is scheduled to begin on March 5, 2018, though both courses will not fully close until April 9, 2018. Both courses will reopen in the fall of 2018 following overseeding.

Snack Shops

Through October, snack shops have held their own, exceeding budget by \$2,266. Snack shops are now operating under winter hours and remain open until 5:00 p.m., except in the rare cases of significant inclement weather. We respectfully remind everyone that all food and beverage consumed in the snack shops or adjacent patios, must have been purchased through the snack shops.

Grounds/Lawn Bowl

The east lawn bowl green at Lakeview has opened for play following summer maintenance. Unfortunately, we will not be able to open the west green for play until the spring/summer of 2018 when the bermuda is actively growing. We have taken advantage of the late growing conditions and applied fertilizer to all Sun City greens. Green speeds range from 10.8 seconds at Lakeview to 14.5 seconds at Bell.

New rock has been installed along the walkway leading to the Lakeview miniature golf area. Two new Tipu trees have been planted on the west side of the Lakeview center, to replace damaged trees. The Tipu trees were selected as they are fast growing and make for a great shade tree.

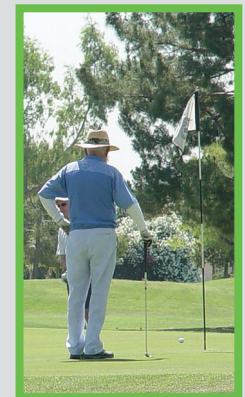

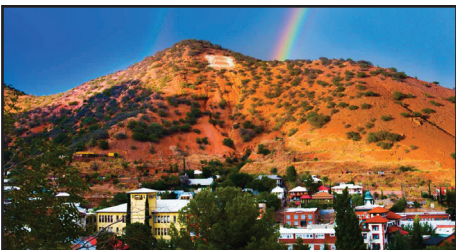

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has completed October 2017 within our operating and capital budget year to date and each division has also ended the month within their overall budget.

Bowling

On October 21, 2017 Bell Lanes hosted the annual Sun City Bowling Hall of Fame tournament which was very successful with 78 entries. Beginning October 2018, the tournament will be relocated to Lakeview Lanes to accommodate more entries with an additional 8 lanes. The Sun City Bowling Hall of Fame committee will be announcing inductees very soon and will follow with an induction dinner.

Both Lakeview and Bell Lanes will be hosting the Metro Phoenix Senior Open Tournament on January 6-7, 2018. Many of the entries will be from the Metro Phoenix area. The tournament consists of Team, Doubles and Singles events and all USBC certified bowlers, 50 years of age and older, are welcome to participate. On the weekend of January 13, 2018, Lakeview Lanes will host the Metro Phoenix USBC Senior Masters and Queens Tournament to determine the best senior male and female bowler in the Metro Phoenix area.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in October decreased again at 10% of past due balances. Overall past due assessments decreased by 3% in October and have decreased by 5.5% since the beginning of the year. Total accounts receivable decreased by just under 1% in October and is up 0.9% from the beginning of the year. Over 90 day receivables increased by 2% in October while other past due categories saw decreases. September assessments went 30 days past due at a 2017 low rate of 4.5% and August assessments went 60 days past due at an increased rate of 3.4%.

Payments from our third-party collections firm were down significantly and totaled \$2,535 in October with a year to date total of \$126,146. Payments in 2017 continue to be lower than the 2016 year to date total.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal were flat in September and totaled \$101,591 from 218 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,013,047 from 2,217 property owners. This is the first time web portal payments have surpassed the \$1M threshold for a year.

In October, property transfer balances remained unchanged and lender related balances decreased by 40%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 56% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of October trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 52 and properties owned by lending institutions at 10.

Human Resources

The last CPR/AED/First Aid training for the fall was held on November 6. Twenty employees received their certifications during the three training sessions held.

Each year, several months are spent by management working with various providers of employee benefits to assess RCSC's current benefit plans and costs to determine what changes we need to make for the following year. Decisions on plan changes and the cost of those plans have been completed and we are now preparing for open enrollment meetings to present the plans to full-time employees. The 2018 benefits plan highlights brochure is in final draft and meetings are scheduled for early December.

Member Services

Season tickets for the 2018 Sundial winter/spring ticketed concert series are available to RCSC Cardholders only throughout the month of November. On Friday, December 1 we will begin handing out numbers at 5:15am for individual show tickets for RCSC Cardholders only. The Clubs Office located at Lakeview Recreation Center will open at 8:30am for ticket sales. The entertainment lineup can be found on our website at www.suncityaz.org under the Recreation tab.

We've got more fun in store come December as we gather for the Sun City AZ Holiday Celebration at Lakeview Center on Friday, December 8 starting at 3pm and ending with the Lighted Boat Parade at dusk. This fun for all ages event includes the Amazing Duck Race, Pie Walk, Hole-in-One Golf Contest and the infamous Money Tree. We'll have coffee and hot cocoa for purchase in the Social Halls along with gourmet food vendors. Don't forget your camera as we'll once again have our Santa photo station. Donations will gladly be accepted and proceeds from this event will benefit this year's charity of choice the Del Webb Sun Cities Museum.

Mark your calendar for Scott Keo's Michael Buble Christmas Tribute on Tuesday, December 12 in the Sundial Auditorium. Doors will open at 6pm and the show begins at 7pm. This free event is general admission for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests. Come early and enjoy complimentary cocoa and hot cider as we celebrate the season.

These reports were presented at the Board meeting on Thursday, November 16, 2017.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Oakmont Center

- A 16' x 40' cantilever shade structure is being engineered and will be submitted for permit as soon as some important code questions are answered by Maricopa County Planning and Development and Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. Contractor is USA Shade. (Cost – \$24,172)

Sun Bowl Amphitheater

- Forty-eight photo luminescent (glow in the dark) markers were recently installed on the concrete terraced areas of the Sun Bowl Amphitheater to designate elevation changes.

Lakeview Center/Lakeview Lanes

- The swimming pool cool decking replacement project commenced October 2, 2017 as planned and the swimming pool was re-opened to RCSC Cardholders and their guests earlier than planned on November 11, 2017. Contractors were Imagine Architectural Concrete and the RCSC Skilled Trades Department. (Cost – \$113,118)
- Thirteen 48" x 90" window sun screens are being manufactured and will be replaced soon on the west side of Lakeview Center. Contractor is Arizona Sun Screens. (Cost – \$1,677)
- All fourteen shade canopies surrounding the Lakeview pool are receiving new Sunbrella fabric covers. All the covers are to be installed by November 21, 2017. Contractor is Arizona Sun Screens. (Cost – \$15,988)
- The primary sump pump which pumps water from the lower level at Lakeview Center to the sewer has been replaced and is back in operation. (Cost – \$10,225)
- Demolition commenced on the women's and men's restrooms, on the east end of Lakeview Lanes, on Wednesday, November 8, 2017. The remodel includes new sheetrock, lighting, plumbing fixtures, doors, tile, toilet partitions, toilets, lavatories, mirrors and counter tops. Contractors are Doege Development and Supercharge Electric. (Cost – \$94,369)

Sundial Center

- The Sundial kitchen remodel is completed other than a few punch list items. Contractors included the RCSC Skilled Trades cabinetmakers, Ken McIntyre Construction, CCBG Architectural, Olympic Fire Protection, Accel Electric, Sunland Plumbing, Lee's Counter Tops, Resource Flooring, JRM Environmental and Spray Systems Environmental. (Cost – \$66,575)

Bell Center

- A new pair of storefront doors and new automatic door opener will soon be installed on the south side of Bell Lanes. Contractor is DH Pace Door Services. (Cost – \$3,995)

Marinette Center

- Repairs of the Marinette outdoor walking track are completed except lane line striping. The track will be shut down for one day in late November so the striping work can be completed. Track repairs were done under warranty at no cost to the RCSC.

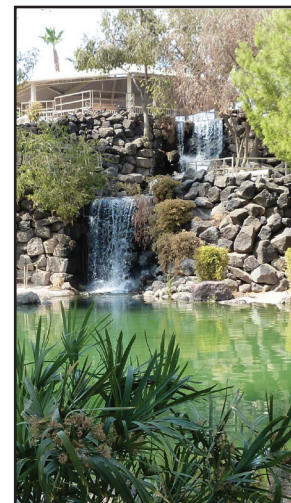

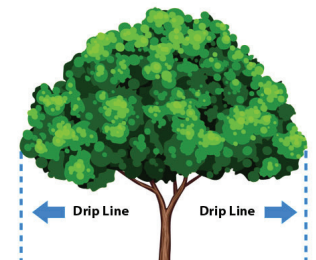
Water Conservation

Water Wisdom Keeps Yard Plantings Healthy

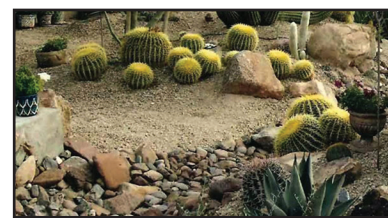
If you know how much water your landscaping needs, you have taken the first step in "Water Wisdom." It's pretty tricky giving your plants enough water without overwatering. We all know what happens if plants are not watered enough: older leaves turn brown or yellow, tend to fall off or curl; new leaves are dull, wilted and/or drooping, and branches and stems may die. However, do you know why new shoots sag and droop if they get too much water? The reason is wet soil starves root systems of oxygen. Other signs of overwatering are pale green or yellow leaves and algae or mushrooms growing on or around the plant. Also keep in mind that watering landscape items more than necessary makes things grow faster and thicker, resulting in more trimming, pruning or mowing. Using fertilizer also increases plant growth and the need for even more water. Follow manufacturer instructions for using recommended (minimal) amounts of fertilizer necessary.

It's important to know types of plants, how frequently they need water, and seasonal water variances. Also, watering depths and widths can play an important factor; both depend upon the size and type of plant. Depths are pretty simple. It's suggested to water ground-cover plants, cacti and annuals at a depth of 1 foot (grass recommendation is 10"). Medium plants (shrubs, hedges etc.) should be depth-watered at no more than 2 feet; and trees should be watered at a depth of 3 feet. Depth watering also helps roots grow deeper, increases the water a plant receives and virtually eliminates evaporation and runoff waste.

As for the "width," most plants pick up water at the "drip line," or the area beneath the outer edge of the plant's canopy (think of the way rain runs off of an umbrella). Always wait until a plant is well-established to apply water at the drip line: shrubs are considered well-established after one year and trees after three. If you can't move your irrigation to match plant growth, a great way to "drip line water" is to use buckets with small holes poked in the bottom. Place buckets on the drip line and fill with water. The slow drain into the soil is perfect for outdoor plants, mimicking a slow, soaking rain. If you only have one bucket, let it drain in one spot then move it along until you have gone all the way around the tree or shrub you're watering. What a great way to use water collected while waiting for the shower to warm!



And of course, it's not news to mention that watering should be done early in the morning, preferably a couple of hours before sunrise to help stop evaporation from both sun and wind. Be sure to pull weeds on a weekly basis. Weeds steal water from plants.



Don't forget rainwater is (flashing lights and big red arrow here) free and beneficial for plants. Direct rainwater with berms and swales from rooftops or areas that pool in your yard to plants and trees. A rain gauge is beneficial due to the fact that if a rain event delivers a half-inch or more, you can skip the next irrigation cycle.

And of course we all know that mulching over a plant root zone aids in reducing evaporation. If you don't like the look of mulch, you can cover organic mulches with granite for a cleaner look. It's best to keep mulches 2-4 inches from plant stems.

Even if you only use little bits of the information here it is still a drop in the bucket, so to speak. If you have access to the internet, there are "waves" of water conservation tips out there. Take a minute to look some water conservation tips when you can because as we all know...

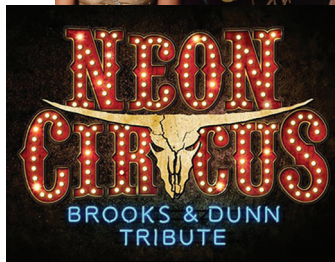

It's the beginning of a new year and a time for rejuvenation!

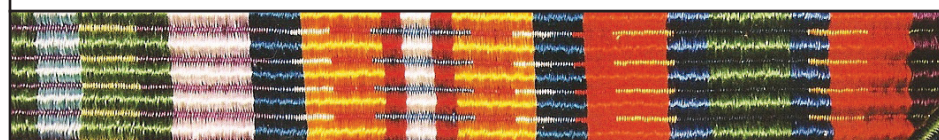

Sun City Gives Back

Sew N Sew Quilters Embrace Veterans

A 94-year old World War II veteran was honored recently by members of the Sun City Sew N' Sew Club of Lakeview Recreation Center with a beautiful hand-made "Quilt of Valor" that recognized his service to his country.

Edward "Ed" Lehn who served in the United States Navy from 1941 to 1945 thanked Sew 'n Sew club members Georgia Thesing and Mary Holland. Lehn's rank was a Store Keeper 3rd Class.

Lehn graduated from high school in June and joined the Navy in December 1941. The ship left port in Boston a short time later.

Lehn served aboard the USS San Diego, a light cruiser that saw action in the Pacific Theater. The ship received 14 Battle Stars and sailed more than 334,000 nautical miles.

Lehn's son, Edward the III, said that his father has said little about those four years. "He never talked about it," he said. Asked if he could remember any scary moments, the WWII veteran said with a chuckle, "It was scarier on land than on sea."

Asked what the ship's mission was, "To sink the enemy ships," he said. "Anything mobile that was on the water it could have been a ship or a submarine."

Lehn showed everyone a commemorative book detailing the life and time of the men who served aboard the USS San Diego. The commemorative book detailed all of the battles and risks the ship faced.

In honor of his service Ms. Thesing and Ms. Holland applauded Lehn's efforts in the war with the Quilt of Valor that the Sew 'N Sew club had made.

The Club makes more than 25 quilts a year. Ms. Thesing said that she puts the quilt kits together and the members make them. This is their fourth year making the quilts as a group. The club then gets the names of veterans from the various military groups including the VFW.

Each quilt carries with it a label that was designed by Ms. Thesing's quilting club in Minnesota that says, "May this quilt keep you safe from harm. May it be a good luck charm. I do not know your name nor the mountains you faced. But what you hold in your arms is a quilter's embrace."

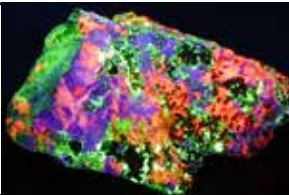

*Tips from Get Fit for Life -***Bulking-Up vs. Toning-Up**

"When I talk with people about strength training, I often hear the statement: I don't want to bulk-up, I just want to tone-up," states Dick Fortier, co-owner of Get Fit for Life. "Toning-Up requires becoming leaner (which means losing fat) and improving muscle definition and strength. Strength exercise does precisely that! To better understand this whole idea of toning and bulking, let's clarify some common misconceptions.

Lifting light weights will tone your body and lifting heavy weights will bulk you up.

While there is some truth to the idea that lifting lighter weights for more reps does a better job of increasing muscle endurance, lighter weights will not help you "tone" better than heavy weights. Lifting heavier weights builds muscle strength and tissue, thereby helping to increase metabolism and fat burn. To gain good muscle tone, fat burn is necessary. Lifting heavier weights with fewer repetitions (8 – 12 on average) and working the muscle group to fatigue is more effective at reaching toning goals than lifting lighter weights. Lifting heavier weights is more time efficient too.

Building Muscle and Bulking-Up are the same thing.

If you have avoided lifting weights because you thought building muscle would bulk you up, you were wrong. When you lift weights that are challenging, you create micro-tears in the fibers. These tears are then repaired by the body in the next "day's rest." It's this phenomenon that makes muscles stronger and builds tissue. Muscle tissue is dense and tight to the bone, adding little volume to the body. Muscle tissue is what burns body fat. That fat burn creates a leaner body. Bulking-Up requires specific lifting techniques with extremely heavy weights and many hours in the gym, not to mention a restricted diet and possible supplements. Bulking-Up is not the strength exercise format the average "active aging adult" would want to pursue, especially if toning were their goal.

Lifting light weights won't help you get stronger.

The secret to getting stronger isn't about the amount of weight you lift. It's about working your muscles to fatigue – that point at which you can't do another repetition. If you insist on lifting lighter weights, it is going to take you longer to reach that state of fatigue. Using a lifting cadence that gets the most out of the three movements of each repetition can assist with reaching fatigue. Most people's time is valuable. Although lifting light weights can eventually result in more muscle strength, it makes sense to lift a heavier weight for time efficiency. When bone density is an issue, lifting heavier weights activates the cells that build bone density much more effectively than lifting light.

Women and Men should lift weights differently

Despite gender, to lose weight, tone-up and get lean, a person must have a strength training plan in place that works every major muscle group in the body at least 8 – 12 repetitions per set, using a weight that is heavy enough to make the last two repetitions extremely hard to perform. Only then, is the body challenged enough to change, grow and adapt, making one stronger, leaner, lighter in weight, and better toned. This principle holds true for both men and women, regardless of what strength exercise they are performing.

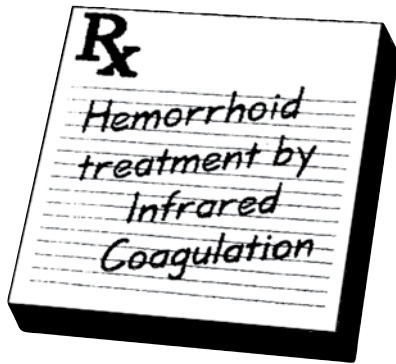

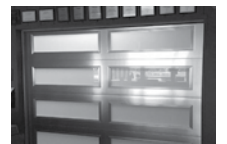
