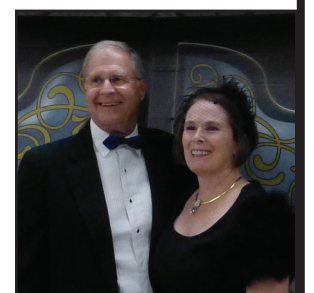
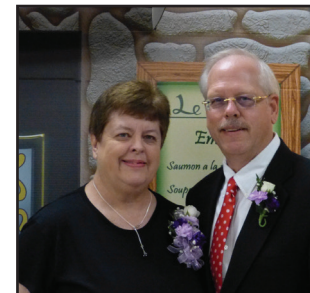

Book Trips & Tours Directly Now, No Longer Through RCSC Clubs Office

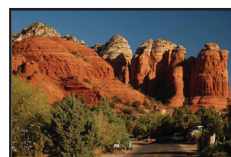
Many were surprised to find no Trips and Tours in the March SunViews and we're sorry for not getting the word out sooner!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendant Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.
- Lakeview Hillside Park is now gated and Cardholders must present Member or Privilege card to attendant for access.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

On Saturday, March 3, the 4th Annual Can/Am tournament will be held at the North Course. The format will be a two-person best ball, with an 8:00am shotgun start. The cup will be awarded to the team with the most winning pairs. In addition to the cup, prizes will be awarded equally between the American and Canadian teams, as well as prizes for longest drive and closest to the pin. A Pebble Beach vacation will be awarded for a hole in one, on hole fourteen.

On Monday, March 5, we will be hosting a demo day at Riverview Golf Course from 9:00am to 2:00pm. Expected vendors are Callaway, Taylor Made, Ping, Cleveland and Wilson. This is a great venue to try out new equipment and knowledgeable people will be on hand to answer questions you may have.

Get Golf Ready classes are in full swing and class openings remain for March and April. Get Golf Ready classes are a great way to take up the game, exposing golfers to the various aspects of the game (putting, chipping, irons and woods). For \$99 you receive four lessons in a group setting, followed by an on course 9-hole playing lesson. The classes are taught by PGA instructors, who also cover proper courtesy and etiquette on the course. To sign up, please contact Chris Linam at (623) 876-8419.

Snack Shops

The dry and warm weather in January led to the Snack Shops exceeding budgeted goals by \$10,642 and we thank everyone for their support. Snack Shops are scheduled to close at 5:00pm, however, as we move into longer daylight hours, closing times may be extended based on demand.

Golf Courses

The overseeding schedule has been slightly modified to correct an imbalance of regulation courses that were closed. The updated schedule is now available and will be posted online. The new schedule now provides two regulation courses open in each wave. We did not receive any requests to alter the original schedule, beyond the concern of regulation course openings.

As part of the renovation process, Willowcreek will be receiving a new pump station, delivery is expected the week of February 19 with disassembly of the current station taking place the same week. Installation of the new station that was scheduled for February 27 to March 1 and startup of the new station to occur March 2 is currently postponed. Once installed the station will be capable of distributing water to the golf course at a rate of 2,675 GPM (gallon per minute) at a pressure of 120 PSI (pounds per square inch). Along with the Willowbrook unit installed in 2016, we will have much greater redundancy in case of equipment failure, as both units are capable of providing water to both courses. Both stations can be turned off remotely by the superintendent if needed. During installation there may be some disruption to play on the 14th hole, which may require movement of the tee markers.

We are moving into our peak season for both weather and rounds played. The warmer weather provides for better growing conditions and wear areas will heal more quickly. Though the healing process is quicker, we still remind golfers to fill their divots and repair ball marks. We also ask that golfers refrain from taking divots during practice swings, as this results in unnecessary damage to the courses.

Grounds/Lawn Bowling

Plans to increase level and playability for the Bell Lawn Bowl Greens are in the final stages of completion. Work is scheduled to begin on the plinth boards in early April and fraze mowing to commence April 16. Both greens will be closed during this process.

Mowing continues on all greens once per week to clean the surface. Rolling of the greens occurs an average of 4 times per week. Stimp readings range from 12.6 seconds at Mountain View to 14.0 at Oakmont.

Grounds crews continue with normal winter maintenance. The exception is the search for a solution to "light pollution" along the bottom of the fence of the Pickleball Pavilion at Marinette. The current solution is the use of brick to block the light, which will have the added benefit of preventing balls from becoming stuck under the fence.

This report was originally presented at the RCSC Board of Directors meeting held on Thursday, February 22, 2018.

Architect's Report

Renovation Work Gets Under at Willowcreek/Willowbrook

Improvements to the Willowcreek and Willowbrook Golf Courses are underway.

Last month, Wadsworth Golf Construction got started with the installation of the new irrigation system along with the back nine greens and new forward tees on Willowcreek. Construction started on hole 18 green so the contractor will be able to tie-into the irrigation mainline at Willowbrook Hole 1 tee so they will be able to have water with them in the new system the entire time while the renovation of the irrigation lake on Willowcreek is taking place.

In addition, Pacific Aquascapes has also started the reconstruction of the irrigation lakes to provide additional water storage and will be lining the lakes to

prevent any future loss of irrigation water to ground seepage.

Here are some interesting facts:

- Nearly 57 miles of new irrigation pipe will be installed.
- Over 7,000 tons of new sand has been screened for installation on the greens and tees.
- The new pump station at Willowcreek will be able to pump 2,700 gallons per minute.

Construction will continue backwards around Willowcreek, with an anticipation date of crossing over to the front-nine side of Willowcreek early April. The target grassing date for the Willowcreek greens is July 13 to be able to provide the optimal time and duration to grow in the greens for a fall opening.

RIGHT!

- 1) Close the gap/hole with putter by patting down the ball mark.
- 2) Insert *Green-Save* tool on the high side behind ball mark and push the back toward the center.
- 3) Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- 4) Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- 6) Never use loosened turf for repair.



WRONG!

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system



RIGHT!

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.

A Moment with President DeLano

The Quandary of the Quorum

Very few in Sun City AZ may recall where they were the evening of February 26, 2018. That's because very few were at the RCSC Annual Membership Meeting. And once again there was not a quorum.

Could it be that the significance of a "quorum" – the smallest number of people who must be present in order for decisions to be made – is greatly exaggerated? RCSC Corporate Bylaws state that a Membership Meeting will be held with the presence of a quorum of Members.

Fact is that a quorum has never been present at any of the Membership Meetings since 2009; which would have been the only agenda item, to approve the 2009 minutes, had a quorum existed. And that was back when there was only a 100 Member quorum requirement and just 168 Members attended.

A look back at the history of how we arrived at the present quorum number might be of benefit.

In 2009, there were two quarterly Membership Meetings with a quorum present in September and November. That likely occurred because there was a very controversial subject on Members' minds – the quorum requirement. Prior to that time, a Membership Meeting quorum had not been met since January 26, 2006. In 2009, RCSC's legal counsel advised the Board of Directors at that time that less than one-half one percent (0.3%) of the total Membership were able to create a quorum which left RCSC and its Members at risk of being controlled by small minority, possibly to the detriment of the community as a whole.

The Board of Directors formed an ad-hoc committee of Members to study the quorum question. After considerable discussion, on May 27, 2010, the quorum number was set at 1,250 (this number currently represents 3.75% of RCSC's Members). It should also be noted that if the Board of Directors were to not set a quorum requirement, Arizona law under ARS Title 10 states a quorum will be 10% percent of the Members (today that would be just over 3,300).

Efforts over the years to increase attendance at the Membership Meeting have included all day events with free food, entertainment and prizes. While member participation was up during these years (2013, 2014), it still proved ineffective in securing a quorum (nearing 500 and 600 registered Members respectively). Since the increased costs for these meetings was not effective in creating a quorum, RCSC switched to evening meetings with considerably less cost and in hope to attract Members busy during the day with other commitments which has produced even fewer attendees (less than 300).

The RCSC Board of Directors has ten monthly Board Meetings each year together with an equal number of monthly Board/ Members Exchanges. Meetings are now recorded and posted on the Sun City AZ YouTube channel for viewing by those unable to attend which has been very well received. "Meet with The Board," started in 2017, allows Members to meet with Directors to discuss personal, private issues.

Could it be that the quorum is not as important as some have thought? Is it possible that RCSC Members are comfortable delegating responsibility to their elected Board Directors? Are they pleased in general with the operations, amenities and activities available and do not feel that RCSC meeting attendance is necessary?

Never forget! Your Board of Directors and RCSC Management continues to welcome Members' concerns and recommendations. Besides our regularly scheduled meetings, our doors, telephones, and email contacts are always available for you to use in communicating your thoughts and ideas with us.

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has ended January 2018 within its operating and capital budget. Thanks to the favorable weather for golfing in January, we have exceeded our income projections by \$86,917. This has its down side as well as generally we receive considerable moisture in January which has a significant effect on the condition of our golf courses.

Bowling

The Bowling Department has confirmed that the Arizona State Senior bowling championship will be held at Lakeview Lanes and Bell Lanes on the weekends of October 20 and October 27. The Arizona State tournament will likely produce \$6-7k of unbudgeted income.

As fall leagues are nearing the end of their season, the bowling centers are preparing contracts for the 2018/2019 season. Leagues will receive a cover letter highlighting any changes in their contract, start times and pricing. There are no price increases for the 2018/2019 season.

At the beginning of the season we had requested email addresses from league bowlers to communicate changes, updates, meeting dates, start dates, upcoming events, etc. directly to each bowler. Previously, we had relied on league officers to communicate this information to each bowler. This has been very successful!

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in January were 12.75% of past due balances. Overall past due assessments offset last month's increase with a 1% decrease in January with total accounts receivable decreasing by 7.3% in this month. Over 90 day past due assessments were at their lowest level in 6 years. December assessments went 30 days past due at an increased rate of 6.1%. November assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.7% rate. The 30 to 60 day rate for the month of November was 47% which is lower than the average rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm in January started the year strong totaling \$22,836 which is a 23% increase over 2017. Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal also started the year strong in January and totaled \$113,114 from 263 property owners.

In January, property transfer balances decreased by 10% and lender related balances decreased by 50% as properties turn over. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 53% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of January, trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 46 and properties owned by lending institutions at 20.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in January were \$577,400 which is \$269,700, or 70%, over the amount budgeted. A reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources

We have completed OSHA Form 300A "Summary of Work-Related Injuries." The form is posted on employee bulletin boards in all work locations until April 30. Reported were 15 work related injuries in 2017 with 91 days away from work and 53 days of restricted or light duty work. It also reports our annual average number of employees to be 389.

Recently RCSC's Loss Control Specialist from CopperPoint, our workers comp insurance carrier, met with RCSC's management team to discuss workplace safety. He presented training materials available through the carrier and discussed his role as it relates to RCSC. CopperPoint has provided workers comp coverage to RCSC since July 1, 2017.

We are in the process of providing information for employee benefits plans to our various providers for Non Discrimination Testing (NDT) for the 2017 calendar year. We have provided information for the 401(k), the 125 Flexible Spending Account and the medical plans. The NDT is the first step in the completion process. The information is used in preparing IRS Form 5500 to submit to the IRS.

Member Services

Do not miss the RCSC Annual Membership Meeting this coming Monday, February 26, here in the Sundial Auditorium at 6pm. Your RCSC Member Card must be presented to register.

We have had some amazing entertainment in February! Starting with December '63 and their amazing costume changes, then the original Buckingham's with hit after hit and Mirage with an ever popular Fleetwood Mac tribute. We also brought you free of charge the Grammy Award Winning Micki Free performing on wooden flutes in full Native American Regalia in the beautiful lagoon and waterfall setting at the Lakeview Center.

March is another full month of smashing entertainment! As a matter of fact, it is so extensive we have struggled with how to bring you an abbreviated version of all that is to come.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Oakmont Center

- Fabrication and installation of the cantilever shade structure are awaiting Maricopa County permit approval. Contractor is USA Shade. (Cost – \$24,172)

Lakeview Center/Lakeview Lanes

- The renovation of the east restrooms at Lakeview Lanes has been completed and reopened on Saturday, February 17. The remodel included new sheetrock, lighting, plumbing fixtures, doors, tile, toilet partitions, toilets, lavatories, mirrors and counter tops. Contractors were Doege Development and Supercharge Electric. (Cost – \$94,369)
- Demolition of the interior of the old Skilled Trades building is complete. Sheetrock repair and paint prep are almost completed. Permits have been filed for the addition of the required exhaust fan for venting the space of fuel fumes. Still pending are painting, window A/C replacement and fencing. This space has been approved for use by the Vintage Vehicle Club. Contractors are Ken McIntyre Construction, American Fence, and RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$24,475)
- The changes to the Clubs and Events office to add another service desk for club support has been completed. This was completed by RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$1,500)

South Golf Course

- The site plan and construction detail drawings are in progress with a completion date anticipated by March 1, followed by permit submission. Construction bid specifications will be developed during the first permit review so this project is ready for bid requests after first review is complete. This project is still on target for a May start that will begin with the demolition of the current building. CCBG Architects will complete the design drawings and act as the Construction Management administrator.
- Concrete repair to the entry drive of the South Golf Course Maintenance yard began February 21, 2018. This project will remove existing concrete and be replaced with a new 3,000-pound mix with reinforcement steel and pins connecting to the adjoining slabs. This access drive will be closed for approximately 10 days while the new slab cures. The contractor is DFG Construction. (Cost – \$8,875)

Sundial Center

- Work will begin this month on irrigation repairs that are causing leaks in the asphalt at Sundial Center. This repair will require approximately 400 linear feet of boring to install new irrigation pipes. The use of boring will reduce the impact to the asphalt surface and parking lot disruptions during the repairs. Contractor is Total Cable Contractors and RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$9,000)

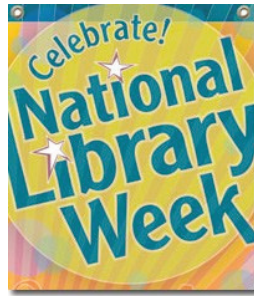

Water Conservation

Baby Steps Can Inspire Others to Conserve

Hopefully the baby steps in water conservation we've shared with you in this column have become commonplace in your daily routine - things like turning off the tap while brushing your teeth or shaving, catching the cold water in a bucket to use on plants (indoor and outdoor) while warming up the shower, or washing vegetables in a basin instead of under running water. And it is quite likely that your family and friends have been influenced by your water-wise lifestyle.

Why not get serious now and set a goal to reduce both your indoor and outdoor water use? A good target is to use less than 100 gallons per person per day and here are a few tips to help reach that goal.

When purchasing new, water-related products, look for a "WaterSense" label (a conservation line since 2006). WaterSense labels can be found on showerheads, toilets, bathroom faucets or attachable aerators, irrigation controllers and, yes, now even entire homes! There truly are homes out there that are labeled WaterSense and have all the necessary fixtures and systems to help people conserve water and other energies.



While the biggest culprit for indoor water usage comes from flushing the toilet, it is unlikely you'll be replacing your existing toilet with a low-flush model unless you're remodeling your bathroom. Just remember, "If it's yellow let it mellow!" and you'll be saving about 3-1/2 gallons for each non-flush.

The washing machine is the next water waster in your home. Stick with full loads as often as possible or set your water level as appropriate, using cold water only whenever possible as heating water also uses large amounts of energy. One good thing in Sun City is most of us have more efficient electric water heaters vs. natural gas water heaters which are less efficient and lose some heat in ventilation.

Now you do understand that water and energy are interconnected, right? It takes energy to treat waste water, so by conserving water you are also conserving energy. Water is used to generate electricity, so by conserving energy you are also conserving water. So it really does pay to do laundry in cold water and to turn off the lamp that really isn't needed. If nothing else, you reduce your electricity bill. But wait - If it reduces your electric bill, then you must be conserving energy and if you're conserving energy you're conserving water. Got it!?

Lastly, let's tackle the shower! The average shower lasts 8.2 minutes and uses approximately 8.5 gallons if you are using a standard showerhead that runs at 2.5 gallons per minute. WaterSense showerheads must prove to use no more than 2 gpm; but to top that, there are showerheads out there that only use 1.25gpm and are "pressure compensating" for low water pressure, supplying that forceful shower that we all love.

Bragging to others about what a great shower you get with your water-conserving showerhead may inspire someone else to make the switch, which would be a win-win, at least for water conservation! Now take it one step further and employ a military shower (remember that's "wet, turn off the water, lather and then rinse," think about all the water you'll be saving Not only are showerheads available that have "on/off" switches to assist with a military shower but there are also "shower flow control soap/soak valves" available that attach between the showerhead and shower arm. Sort of like a "pause button" while you soap and shampoo. The example at the right sells for as little as \$5 to \$6.



We all need to take baby steps and more to conserve - for today and tomorrow, and for future generations. As former United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon once said, "There is no plan B because there is no planet B."

More than ever, we need to make sure that -

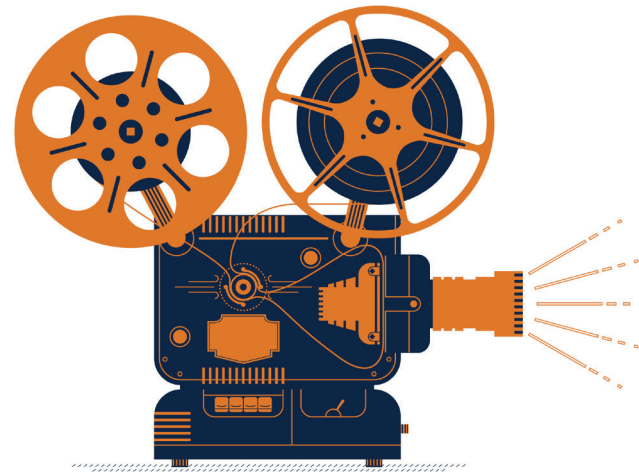

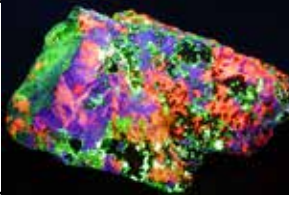

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Improve Bone Health with Strength Exercise

Bone health and muscle strength were concerns of Bev Schumacher, when she decided to work with Get Fit for Life trainer, Jane Fortier.

"Everyone loses bone after the age of 50," states Fortier. "It's part of the physiological changes of chronological aging. Women lose roughly 10% of their bone density within 5 to 7 years after menopause; men lose bone more gradually, but they are still at risk. Bone loss is a silent disorder – you can't feel your bones becoming weaker. A break or fracture (usually in the hip, wrist or spine) is what brings the problem to light. That break or fracture can be the result of a bone loss disease called Osteoporosis. Only a bone density test (dexascan) can reveal the extent of bone loss. A T-score between -1.8 and -2.4 indicates Osteopenia, which means a bone density loss of 10-15%; a T-score higher than -2.5 indicates Osteoporosis, which means a density loss of 25-40%."

"Osteoporosis", Jane further explains, "causes bones to become weak and brittle. In extreme cases, the bones are so brittle that a fall, simple body movement or coughing could cause a fracture. Heredity, age and lifestyle have an effect on bone health. Bones are very active biologically. They are made up of cells that are constantly dying and being replaced. Osteoblasts are the cells that replace lost bone. Stimulating the production of osteoblasts is imperative for someone with Osteopenia or Osteoporosis. Whether you face bone-density problems, or simply want to avoid getting them, regular weight-bearing exercise is a MUST.

"Not any old weight-bearing workout gets results," notes Fortier, who personally has dealt with osteoporosis. "Resistance exercise, that requires muscles to work against gravity, has the most bone-building benefit. Bone responds to intensity, not duration. It reacts to a force greater than what it is used to, not a repetition of the same force. Strength exercise has the ability to progressively and continually challenge muscles that are connected to bones, thus activating osteoblasts. Strength exercise that involves as many different muscles groups, in as many different functional movement patterns as possible, is the best. And, with a regular and well-designed exercise routine, you can gain enough muscle strength to catch and protect yourself, if a fall starts to occur. The importance of this fact can't be stressed enough, when you live with bone density issues. I have stopped myself from falling, several times, because of core and lower body muscle strength", states Fortier.

Get Fit for Life trainers custom design programs to fit individual needs and issues. A workout that addresses load, intensity and variety, the key elements for activating osteoblasts, would be important for someone facing bone health issues. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.

Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
