Sundial Concert Series Tickets Available to RCSC Cardholders Starting November 1st

Tickets for all individual shows go on sale Monday, December 3 to RCSC Cardholders in good standing only for \$17 per person (again, limit one ticket per full-size RCSC Member or Privilege card presented at the time of purchase). Ticket sales to non-RCSC Cardholders and guests will begin on Wednesday, January 2, 2019 for \$20 per person should any tickets remain.

RCSC Cardholders: Please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.
- Lakeview Hillside Park is now gated and Cardholders must present Member or Privilege card to attendant for access.

RCSC Elections: Announcement of Candidates Coming Soom

While there may still be a few days to complete and submit a candidate packet for the 2018 RCSC Board of Directors Election (the deadline is Friday, October 5 by noon), it is likely that those interested have already completed these tasks.

So how and when are the candidates announced? Once signatures have been validated, a press release will be issued stating those RCSC Members whose names will appear on the ballot come November soon after the verification is complete. Press releases are sent not only to the local media, but are also posted on the RCSC website (www.suncityaz.org) and are emailed to Cardholders who have enrolled to receive RCSC News Email Alerts.

RCSC Directors serve for three-year teams and each year, elections are held to fill the three upcoming vacancies. Those directors leaving the Board at the end of 2018 are Bruce Alleman, Jerry Walczak and Rich Hoffer (who has returned to the Board to complete the term of Ron Smith who resigned earlier this year).

For those wishing to meet the candidates once they have been announced will have several opportunities at upcoming Board/Member Exchanges and RCSC Board of Director Meetings. In addition, candidate literature will be available at various locations, including the RCSC Corporate Offices and on the information table adjacent to Cardholder Services and Clubs & Activities Offices, all located on the lower level at Lakeview Center. Candidate information will also be in upcoming editions of SunViews.

RCSC will once again invite Member Voters to hear from the candidates themselves at two Candidate Forums which will be held in November. There will be both an afternoon and an evening session (please refer to the right for dates, times and locations); however, should these not be convenient video recordings of both session will be posted on RCSC's YouTube channel for Members to view at their convenience. Again, RCSC News Email Alerts will be sent when this information, documentation is available.

Online voting begins Monday, November 12, 2018 via the RCSC Web Portal and will run through Election Day on Tuesday, December 11, 2018 at 4pm. Lakeview Center Social Hall #2 is the only polling location for in-person voting during the hours of 8am to 4pm. Members may also request an Absentee Ballots if necessary by calling 623-561-4600.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds for July decreased by 8.9% compared to prior year, due in large part to the closure of Willowcreek and Willowbrook. Though rounds were down, daily green fee and cart fee revenue exceeded budgeted goals. For the year, total revenue has exceeded both budget and prior year.

We currently have 96 participants signed up to participate in our "Patriot Day" golf event on August 31. This total is slightly ahead of the 88 participants we had last year. "Patriot Golf Day" was organized with the help of PGA of America to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country. Money raised from the tournament will be added to dollars collected by our starters from August 31 through September 5.

Snack Shops

Despite the closure of the Willow snack shop, revenue exceeded budget considerably. For the year, the snack shops have exceeded budget and remain ahead of prior year. Snack Shops continue to have a regularly scheduled closing time of 1:00pm, however, this closing time can be extended based on demand. The snack shop at South has closed in preparation for the clubhouse demolition. Services during this time will be very limited and golfers are encouraged to bring their own water and ice during this time, as well as any food items that are needed.

Courses

Overseeding will begin on October 1 on North, Lakes West and Quail Run. These courses will reopen October 20, with cart path restrictions in place until November 9. The remaining courses will close October 22 and reopen November 10 with cart path restrictions in place until November 23.

The Willowcreek/Willowbrook project will complete on schedule and both courses are expected to open by November 10. The installation of the irrigation has progressed to the back 9. Once completed, nearly 4000 irrigation heads and over 50 miles of pipe will have been installed. The most recently completed parts of the project will have less time to heal than previous projects, which will result in some areas not fully healing before the summer growing season is over. These areas will be the most noticeable in non-over-seeded areas.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

The greens at Bell and Lakeview are progressing as anticipated and will be tested in September to ensure as level a surface as possible. Poles for scoreboards are being relocated to an area farther away from the green surface. The relocation will remove them from the path of irrigation water.

The grounds crew remains busy with regular maintenance. The extremely active monsoon season has also kept the crew busy with clean up.





Tips from a Pro

Warm-up Properly Prior to Your Round

Warming up prior to playing golf becomes more important the older we get! Just spending a few minutes stretching can help not only your game that day but your body the next! Everyone is different and finding out what works best for you is important, but here is an idea of some things to do to stretch and warm up your body before playing:

- Holding a short iron out in front of your body with palms facing down and on each end of the club bend from the waist and let your arms hang down to stretch your hamstrings (the back of your legs). Hold the club above your head and let your right hand pull it's end down by your right side to stretch your left shoulder and then repeat on the other side to stretch your right. Hold the club across your chest, take your golf stance and twist back (as if making a backswing) and then twist forward (as if making your follow-through) several times to stretch your trunk.
- Use the club as a cane in your right hand and grab your left foot and pull your heel towards your rear end to stretch your quadricep (the front of your leg). Repeat on the other side.
- Take a few practice swings with the iron as your normally would....and then take a few as if you are a left handed player (or as a right hander if you normally swing from the left). It helps works opposing muscles in the swing.
- Begin hitting a few balls, starting with some ½ swing PW shots and then working up to mid irons, long iron or hybrids, fairway woods and last ending with your driver.
- Tee it up and enjoy your round!





As soon as all of the candidate packets are verified after the submittal deadline (October 5, 2018), candidate biographies and platforms will be put together and available for Member review in a number of places through Election Day on December 11, 2018. You can get copies at the various Board Meetings or at the RCSC Corporate Offices at Lakeview. Candidate bios will be published in SunViews and posted on the RSCS Web Portal once elections go online. A table for candidate literature can also be found along with walkway outside of the Cardholder Services and Clubs & Activities Offices at Lakeview.

You'll also have several chances to meet the candidates and get their views first-hand. They are invited to attend Board/ Member Exchanges and Board Meetings where those present are always introduced. There will be two Candidate Forums in November where those running will be able to address various concerns from those in the audience after the formal monitored ques-

tion sessions are complete. One forum will be in the afternoon and another will be held in the evening so hopefully one fits your schedule. If you can't attend either one of these session, we'll be posting video recordings on the Sun City AZ YouTube channel so that you can watch when you have the time. Lastly, candidates will have a table at the Sun City AZ Arts & Crafts Festival held at Sundial the Friday and Saturday after Thanksgiving if you still need to speak with them before casting your vote.

You also have options when it comes to when and where to vote so there really is no excuse! You will again be able to vote online using the RCSC Web Portal starting on Monday, November 12. This means you can vote from any device (any computer, tablet or smart phone) anywhere (back home, right here in Sun City AZ or any place in between). Or you can request an absentee ballot by calling the RCSC Corporate Office at 623-561-4600. Just make sure that your ballot is mailed back soon enough that it arrives here by Election Day.

And for those who prefer to cast their ballot in person, the lone polling place will be in the Lakeview Social Hall #2 which will be open from 8am to 4pm on Tuesday, December 11.

I've told you all I can about taking this final step in the Board election process. Now don't forget to vote! Nothing would make me more proud than to have a record number of ballots cast in this year's election! Let's do it!

Management Updates

Financial Report:

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of August, I will include the Treasurer's Report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of July 31, 2018 was \$14,679,735 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of July 31, 2018 PIF had a balance of \$16,190,559 plus \$685,500 collected in July that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of August 2018. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$5,187,706 as of July month end.

We have ended July within our overall operating and capital budget year-to-date. Every division has a net operating positive variance from budget year-to-date.

Bowling:

The final summer bowling tournament will be held on September 30, 2018 at Bell Lanes. The tournament is a scotch doubles tournament; all senior bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not. The monthly tournaments at Bell Lanes have been the most successful ever. The tournament normally averages 64 bowlers. This summer the tournament has averaged 75 bowlers.

The Bowling division is now entering their busy season. Most fall leagues will begin the first week of September. Several tournaments are scheduled October through December including the recently confirmed Maricopa County Women's tournament for the weekend of November 17, 2018. A list of upcoming bowling tournaments and events are listed in the weekly email "Your Sun City AZ Week" or you can view the list online at www.suncityaz.org under Bowling.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in July were 11.2% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables offset the decrease in June and increased in July by 1%. The flow of balances into the Over 30 Day category was at a 42% rate and represent the highest balance for this category so far this year. The Over 90 Day category decreased again and continues to be at the lowest level in five years. June assessments went 30 days past due at a significantly increased rate of 7.3% and May assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.3% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$18,082 in July and are 23% over the 2017 year to date amount. Payments made in July by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$13,368 from 252 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$881,485 from 1,933 property owners.

In July, property transfer balances increased by 5.8% and lender related balances decreased by over 60%. Lender related balances are at the lowest level since this began being tracked in 2013. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 55% of all receivables and 53% of past due balances. At the end of July, trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 42 and properties owned by lending institutions at 10.

Human Resources:

Under the Affordable Care Act (ACA), employers are required to provide all new hires with a written notice about the ACA's health insurance exchanges, which are also known as marketplaces. Notices must be provided at time of hire. The Department of Labor issued new versions of the notices this month. In the notice, employers must also explain that employees may lose their employers' nontaxable contribution to health benefits if they elect to obtain coverage through the marketplace. Human Resources has revised documents in the new hire orientation process to assure notices are provided and new hires understand their options.

Since early August, we have seen an increase in hiring which is typical for this time of year. Eight new hires have been added to the staff. In preparation for the reopening of Willowbrook and Willowcreek golf courses there will be several new hires and some internal transfers.

Member Services:

Unfortunately, due to the unpredictable monsoon weather the Dive-In Movie/Ice Cream Social was cancelled in August.

Believe it or not, the time is here. The Sun Bowl fall series begins Sunday, September 28, 2018 at 7:00pm. So, grab a lawn chair and join us as we welcome to the stage Johnny K and Kompany!

The 2019 Sundial Season Ticket Concert Series is booked, and it has been released in the SunViews and on the suncityaz.org website. Season tickets for RCSC Cardholders only will go on sale Thursday, November 1, 2018 at 8:30am. Individual concert tickets will go on sale to RCSC Cardholders only starting December 1, 2018.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Bell Center:

- Landscape lighting in the pool area at Bell Center was repaired and LED fixtures added to improve the aged landscape lighting in this area. Contractor was Supercharged Electric (Cost – \$3,000).
- Work on the indoor spa at Bell Center is continuing. The new floor drain installation and repair of the floor is completed. The interior pebble sheen finish of the spa is currently being replaced. The installation of the Rubaroc floor covering is scheduled for the late September due to required concrete curing time.
- Work in the Artistic Stained Glass club to replace the flooring, paint the club room space and complete some woodworking tasks for tables and slot storage has been completed with the club moving back into the space as of August 10, 2018. Contractors are Spray Systems, DFG Construction and Desert Coatings (Cost – \$28,640).

Lakeview Center:

Work is progressing in the Women's Social Club Room at Lakeview Center. Demo
within the club room, including the removal of the fireplace and hearth, has been
completed. Framing, electrical rough in and drywall has begun. Additional work
to include flooring, painting, blinds and lighting updates. Completion is anticipated by September 15. Contractors are Devil Dog Demolition, DFG Construction,
Resource AZ Flooring, Imagine Painting (Cost – \$31,950).

South Golf Course:

 Work continues with the general contractor, Robert Porter Construction, as we await final permit approval to commence construction.

Water Conservation

Fall is a Great Time to Check Your Irrigation Timer

You can literally save thousands of gallons of water by properly setting your irrigation controller. Now that the hot, dry summer is over, this is the perfect time to change your watering schedule. Here are some easy steps to take and get the job done quickly.

Basic Controller Features

- **Stations** control the valves that release the water to the irrigation **Zones** in your yard or garden. Put plants with similar water needs on the same station or zone. This allows for more efficient watering since all emitters and/or sprinklers on a single valve will run for the same amount of time. Multiple stations or zones allow you to customize watering amounts for different types of plants by allowing for different run times for different valves.
- The **Start Time** is the time at which a specific valve will open to irrigate a station or zone.
- The Run Time or Station Duration is the time, in minutes, a specific valve will stay
 open and therefore water a zone.
- **Semi-Auto** lets you run through an entire program (A, B, or C) whenever you want a supplemental watering.
- Off or Stop will stop programs from running until you toggle back to 'Run'. Your programs will be saved. This is great during rainy periods.
- The Manual button allows you to run a single valve for the amount of time you select. This is helpful when you want to tune-up your irrigation system and check for leaks, misaligned sprinkler heads or clogged drip emitters.
- A Program is where you store all of your settings. It consists of a set of stations set
 to specific start times and run times. Here, multiple programs A, B, & C allow you to
 run different valves on different days with different run times. Make sure each program runs stations with similar plant water needs to maximize irrigation efficiency.

Programming Your Controller

- 1. For easy programming, first slide the "Set Program" (1) toggle to the middle, and then start in the upper left corner of your controller and move clockwise through the settings. Start with program A (2).
- Set the dial to current time and use the +/- buttons to locate the current time of day. Turn the dial one click to the left and use the +/- buttons to locate the day of the week. You only have to do this once (3).
- 3. Turn the dial to the "valve run times" to select a station and use the +/- buttons to enter the amount of watering time for that valve, which sends water to a particular zone in your yard or garden (4).
- Turn the dial to start times and use the +/- buttons to select time you'd like your irrigation to begin. You can have three different start times per day, but typically you only need one



- 5. Now turn the dial to "schedule" the days you want your irrigation to run or the numbers of days to skip in between watering. Use the +/- buttons to enter this information (6).
- 6. Now repeat steps 3, 4 & 5 for each station/valve you are controlling, and program A is complete. Use programs B & C for other zones that require difference frequencies of watering, such as turf, Xeriscape, vegetable gardens, etc.

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Sleep Deprivation Slows Down Weight Loss

"Losing out on sleep creates a viscous cycle in the body, making it more prone to factors that contribute to weight gain," states Jane Fortier, fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life. "The more sleep-deprived a person becomes, the higher the level of cortisol (stress hormone) in the body. High levels of cortisol automatically increase appetite. One doesn't become ravenous for salads, but rather the high sugar, high fat and "bad for you" foods. When the body experiences stress, it tries to produce serotonin, a hormone that has a calming effect. The easiest way to accomplish this is by eating high-carb foods that produce a neurochemical reaction. These foods may bring satisfaction and stress relief, but they set into motion a pattern of poor glucose management and fat storage.

Lack of sleep hinders the body's ability to process sweet stuff. When sleep deprivation sets-in, cell mitochondria that normally help digest fuel, begin shutting down. Sugar then, remains in the blood, resulting in high blood sugar levels. These elevated blood sugar levels result in elevated insulin levels. Sleep deprivation can make fat cells 30 percent less efficient at managing insulin. It's almost like a switch is thrown for fat storage. Fat loss becomes difficult"



"Lack of sleep boosts levels of Ghrelin," Fortier continues. "Ghrelin is the hormone that triggers hunger. In addition, lack of sleep decreases levels of Leptin, the hormone that signals satiety. Studies have shown that sleep-deprived people eat an average of 300 more calories per day, and can gain up to four pounds a week, depending on the severity of the deprivation and the confusion with these hormones."

Luckily, there are easy ways to make sure sleep never gets in between you and your weight loss goals. Implementing the following 10 Steps can have a huge impact on your sleep pattern. Make sleep a priority. It's physically unhealthy to lose sleep. The fix requires both a behavioral and conceptual shift. Sleeping isn't downtime. You "feed your body" when you sleep, just as eating feeds your body when you are awake.

Ten Steps for Better Sleep:

- Try to get 7-8 hours of sleep each night
- Keep a consistent bedtime and wake-up time
- Lower lights an hour before going to sleep (blue-spectrum light from bulbs suppresses production of melatonin)
- Don't text, email, watch videos or check social media in bed (devices shoot blue light)
- Wake-up to natural light. (it cuts off hormones that make you groggy)
- Don't drink caffeine after 2pm
- Don't "sleep in" on weekends (this confuses the body as much as jet lag would)
- Exercise regularly, in order to sleep better and more deeply
- Stop alcohol intake no less than an hour before bed (alcohol negatively impacts quality of sleep)
- Keep your room dark, quiet and cool






