RCSC Cardholders: Please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools.
 Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

The Beat the Pro event held on December 13 raised \$2,091.05 for the Sun City Foundation. Once again the event lived up to its name with 47% of the field playing well enough to "Beat the Pros". Thank you to volunteers John Dockham and Marty Rey that assisted with the event. Thank you also to Chris Linam and Larry Belt for helping to secure prizes for the event. The biggest thank you goes to all those who participated in making the event fun and successful. The 2019 event will be held at South Golf Course and we will be adding a couple of more wrinkles to add excitement to the event.

The free golf clinics, provided by our PGA and LPGA professionals, were once again well attended. For the month, 410 students attended the Saturday golf clinics that began in November and ran into December. Another set of free clinics will be offered in March 2019.

Golf Courses

Mowing heights are lowering slightly throughout the courses, particularly the greens. Bunkers throughout the courses are removing rye grass that may have germinated in bunkers. Sand is added to bunkers on an as needed basis.

The construction of the South Clubhouse has necessitated a new putting/practice area. The putting green will remain roughly the same size as the previous green. The chipping/pitching green will be expanded to accommodate more players. The area will also provide an improved area for practice out of a bunker. In addition to the practice area, South will also be replacing bunker sand throughout the course. Sand will be completely removed from the bunkers, the liner will be fixed as needed and new sand will be added. The work to the practice area and bunkers cannot begin until the bermuda grass is actively growing. As such, we are anticipating starting the project the middle of May 2019.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue in November was affected by the closure of the South Snack Shop during construction. Snack Shops are currently open every day from 6:00am to 5:00pm, and serve breakfast and lunch. The only exceptions to the above times are during periods of inclement weather.

Grounds/Lawn Bowl

All Lawn Bowl greens are open for regular play following a brief, partial closure at Bell following the U.S. Open. Irrigation on all greens has been reduced to an as-needed basis as dictated by our moisture readings. Mowing has also been reduced and is used mostly to remove debris from the greens. Greens are rolled in between mowing to keep the surfaces smooth.

The grounds crew has been busy the last several weeks removing weeds. We have most areas under control, though we continue to experience new growth. Leaves have begun to fall and are cleaned up regularly, though periods of high winds erase this work quickly.

Tips from a Pro

Expedient play makes golf more fun for all!

The game of golf is more enjoyable for everyone if it moves along efficiently. This doesn't mean you have to feel rushed or hurried while hitting your shot. It simply means no matter what the situation is, you prepare yourself for your next shot before it's your turn.

On the tee box this means when someone else is hitting you are checking yardage and deciding which club you will use next and if possible, you have that club out and are taking a practice swing if needed.

On the fairway once you have hit the shot, fill the divot and then get in the cart, perhaps even waiting to replace the headcover, wipe the club, or return it to the bag until the next stop, especially if you are not the driver of the cart.

Near the green it may mean bringing a couple of clubs with you to chip with, (in addition to your putter) if you're not sure of which one you might need, rather than having to make another trip back to the cart.



A few years back, the USGA Pace of Play campaign entitled, "While We're Young" brought back the humor of Rodney Dangerfield from 1980s "Caddyshack" to the real problem golfers routinely encounter on golf courses everyday, everywhere. Please do you part to "pick up the pace!"

On the green it means contemplating the break, line or speed of your putt while others are putting and knowing who you follow so that when it's your turn you're ready to go. Even remembering to tend or take out the flagstick for your group if you're closest to the hole and will be last to putt can save some time.

And lastly, remember not to mark your scorecard until you get to the next tee box.

Remember little things add up to lots of time over the course of a round! It's not about rushing your shot.... it's about preparing ahead of time so you're ready to go when it's your turn. That makes all the difference in the world to those you're playing with! (And those behind you as well!)

GOLF'S NEW RULES: STROKE AND DISTANCE

A new Local Rule will provide an alternative to stroke-and-distance relief for a ball that is lost outside a penalty area or out of bounds. This new Local Rule will be available beginning January 1, 2019.



If the Local flute is in effect, you can still take stroke-and-distance relief, but you will now have the following additional option that comes with a penalty of two strokes:

A DETERMINE SPOT where your ball we out of bounds (left diagram) or is likely to be lost (sight diagram).

New Local Golf Rule in Effect

The RCSC Golf Advisory Committee recently voted unanimously to accept the USGA's new local rule, which provides an alternative to stroke-and-distance relief for balls that are lost outside a penalty area or out of bounds.

- 1. Determine the spot where your ball went out of bounds.
- 2. Find the nearest fairway edge no closer to the hole.
- 3. Drop your ball in the area as defined in the graphics shown on the left.

Management Updates

Financial Report

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended November 2018 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Although maintenance and repairs has caught up some with expenditures for both 2017 and 2018 projects reflected in the Building & Infrastructure division, all divisions have operated within their net operating budgets year to date.

Bowling

Everyone is welcome to attend the annual New Year's Eve Bowling Party at Lakeview Lanes even if you are not a bowler. Stop by Lakeview Lanes or Bell Lanes and reserve your spot.

A presentation of the Specto Coaching System for bowlers was held at the Fairway Center on November 27, 2018. The purchase of the system for Lakeview Lanes is expected before year end as it can be accommodated within the total 2018 bowling budget.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in November were 10.3% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables decreased in November by 3% with both the "current" and "over 30" receivables categories decreasing this month. October assessments went 30 days past due at 5.8% rate and September assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.1% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm were the highest year to date and totaled \$26,740 in November. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$175,146. Payments made in November by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$108,430 from 249 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,291,212 from 2,805 property owners.

In November, property transfer balances decreased by 4% and lender related balances did not increase for the first time in 3 months. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 54% of all receivables and 55% of past due balances. At the end of November, trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 46 and properties owned by lending institutions remained at three.

Human Resources

In managing the 401(k) plan, there are plan documents and notices that we must provide to each plan participant prior to year end. We recently provided the Summary Annual Report (SAR) which is obtained from information found on the annual Department of Labor/IRS Form 5500 Annual Report that we file each year.

We also distributed the Plan's Qualified Default Investment Option (PDIA) to all active participants, former employees with a balance, and any other beneficiaries still entitled to receive benefits from the plan. Recently, we arranged an independent review of the employees' 401(k) Plan focusing on fund performance and the health of the plan. While our funds are reviewed annually with our investment provider, we believe a periodic independent review provides further due diligence. We are now preparing for the annual audit of the 401(k) Plan which is performed by an independent auditor after the close of the year and prior to filing the Form 5500 with the DOL/IRS.

Effective January 1, 2019, Arizona's Minimum Wage will increase to \$11.00 per hour from the current \$10.50 per hour. We will do an across the board increase for those employees whose pay rate is below the new minimum.

Member Services

A record number of Season Tickets were sold during the month of November for the 2019 Sundial ticketed shows. Individual show tickets that went on sale December 3 for RCSC Cardholders were also record numbers.

On December 11, we hosted our annual Christmas Spectacular at the Sundial Auditorium, and it was just that...spectacular! It was standing room only as we were treated to incredible vocals and holiday songs.

The Annual Holiday Celebration was held on December 14 at the Lakeview Center organized and hosted by the RCSC management team. There were two duck races, the hole-in-one contest, the pie-walk and one lucky couple took home a Christmas tree filled with cash! And of course, there was the lighted boat parade that lit up the lake with its pageantry. Proceeds from this event and all the year's fund raising efforts of the RCSC management team go to benefit the Sun City Foundation.

We kick off the ticketed concert series on January 9 at Sundial with a Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis tribute show. Check ticket availability with the Clubs and Activities office at the Lakeview Recreation Center.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Bell Center

 An area at the club mall entrance was closed recently for concrete repair. Concrete slabs had moved creating a tripping hazard. This area had previously been ground down, but continued movement resulted in the need to replace sections of the concrete. Contractor was KAW Construction (Cost – \$4,990).

Grand Ave

The initial comments from Maricopa County on the Plan of Development (POD) submission have been received. The RCSC architect has reviewed these comments and submitted a response as of December 18, 2018. While these comments did not require burdensome changes, we do not have an estimate for the time the review of our responses will take. Completion of final civil engineering designs were pending the initial POD comments and now will be scheduled for completion.

Lakeview Center

- Work continues on the renovation of the Lakeview Center Fitness Restrooms. The sheet rock has been installed and all plumbing and electrical roughed in. Sheet rock fastener installation was inspected and passed. Tape and float is 50% complete. Exhaust and HVAC ductwork is approximately 40% roughed in. Contractors are: Valley Architecture, KAW Construction, Spray Systems, 1-800 Cooling and Supercharged Electric (Cost \$219,133).
- The water temperature in Viewpoint Lake decreased to the point it was the acceptable environment for trout; 800 pounds of Rainbow Trout from Idaho was recently stocked in Viewpoint Lake. RCSC Cardholders are reminded that no fishing license is required and there is a limit of 3 trout per day. Also, no fishing is allowed from the docks (shore only) or near the boat ramp.

Marinette Center

 Replacement of door sensors were required on the two entry doors at Marinette Center to fix problems with the existing sensors that caused the doors to cycle incorrectly. Contractor was DH Pace (Cost – \$2,894).

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Exercise Mistakes That Lead to Joint Injury

Seasoned exercisers and weekend-warriors will occasionally suffer joint injury. Those injuries could be avoided with careful attention to some common pitfalls when exercising:

- Doing too much, too soon Whether coming back from an injury or starting a new
 exercise program, there is a tendency to push too hard. Joint injury is common
 when you don't allow the body to adapt slowly to exercise. As an aging adult,
 every system in your body needs time to adapt to exercise: your muscles, circulatory system, ligaments, cartilage, bones and joints. Ease into an exercise program,
 regardless of how motivated you are to get that workout going. If all goes well,
 progress sensibly, with the intensity, duration and frequency of what you are doing.
- Performing the same exercises all the time - Too much of a good thing, when exercising, can become a bad thing. Using the same workout approach, week after week, can trigger negative results. Your body likes change. Switch-up your cardio machines, and use vari ous workout approaches with them. Change your strength routine with completely different exercises for each muscle group. Challenge your body with new stretches – this will bring better results, with fewer injuries. Taxing the same muscles and joints in the same way, week after week, can easily lead to overuse injury and cartilage decline. Moving muscles and joints in different directions, with varied intensities, will improve mobility and fitness.



- Exercising with improper technique and form If the seat or resistance level on a cardio machine is set improperly, knee or hip injury can occur; if pivot-point and range-of-motion settings on weight machines are overlooked, shoulder, elbow, knee or hip joint problems can develop; if gait patterns, alignment, and form are poorly executed with body-weight exercises (squats, lunges), the body is at risk with every movement. Diligence and attention to detail is necessary if joints are going to perform correctly through the required range of motion. Proper form is the key to exercise results and joint security.
- Non-supportive footwear Although saving money and fashion trends are the
 primary motivators in footwear purchases, those same motivators may be leading
 to joint concerns. Wearing shoes with too little support, and ones that don't lend
 themselves to specific anatomical and mechanical issues (over-pronation, supination) will put knee and hip joints at risk. Exercise footwear is best purchased from
 a professional, who can analyze needs and issues and recommend appropriate
 shoes for each exercise activity. Proper footwear is far more important than most
 people realize.

Whether you are a seasoned exerciser or new to the workout world, a Get Fit for Life personal trainer can help you avoid those exercise pitfalls that result in joint problems. LaTouch Wellness Massage Therapy Shares... How Your Body Speaks to You

The mind is reflected in every part of the human body. Through the body we can get in touch with emotional issues that we have been repressing, denying or ignoring. As I sit and type this paper, I feel tension in my shoulders. I often experience this when I'm on the computer composing material. Feeling this type of tension is like having the weight of the world on your shoulders. I keep reaching back giving myself a massage, stretching my neck and repeating affirmations.

Our bodies always speak to us, the question is are we listening, and if we're not it begins to scream. A scream can be in the form of chronic and consistent pain, a body disorder or dysfunction and eventually disease. The role of the mind and emotions affect our state of health. This is only a part of the overall picture, but it is the part that is invariably overlooked. By understanding this relationship, we can gain insight and can play a greater role in our own health and well-being. There have been great contributions made in this area of health care, through such individuals such as Dr. Andrew Weil who is the founder and director of The Center for Integrative Medicine at University of Arizona. Dr. Weil, practices integrative medicine--which considers the whole person, not just the symptoms--he makes this practice completely mainstream through his books and CDs.



Most of us tend to think of our bodies and minds as separate systems and believe they function, for the most part, independently. All our thoughts and feelings get translated into chemicals that fire off throughout our body, altering the chemical composition and behavior of the cells. If we are aware of which area of our body is painful, we can begin to focus on that area, possibly give our self a self-massage and start to work with some of the emotional components related to that area.

In her book, "Heal Your Body," Louise L. Hay states if you tend to carry tension in your shoulders, the emotional component correlates to our ability to carry our experiences in life joyously. We can improve our emotional state by implementing positive affirmations, such as "I choose to allow all my experiences to be joyous and loving." Another affirmation might be "I relax and release my perceived burdens."

Implementing complimentary self-care practices can be very beneficial in reducing stress and improving our health and well-being. Additional practices could include guided meditation, and a very simple acupressure technique called EFT, Emotional Freedom Technique. In the next article, we will explore the benefits of these two techniques, in greater detail.

Massage helps us to manage stress and can also be used to address a number of health issues. 





We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.




