Guest Passes Now Available Online

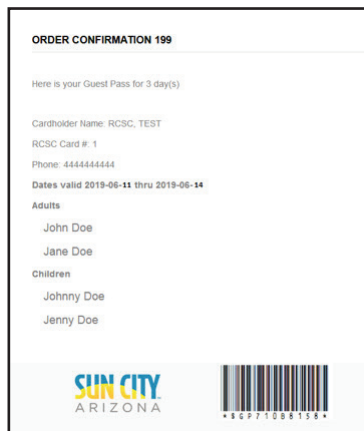
The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. is pleased to announce a new feature that is now available on the RCSC Web Portal: the ability to purchase online guest passes.

From the comfort of your own home (or elsewhere), you'll now be able to purchase Guest Passes when family and friends come for a visit so that they can access Sun City AZ's facilities or amenities during their stay.

Guests will be required to present a printed copy of the Guest Pass to the Facility Attendant when entering and may be asked to present government issued, photo ID to validate their identity. Guests under the age of 19 must continue to be escorted by an adult at all times while on RCSC properties.

Remember – only RCSC Cardholders who have enrolled and have access to the RCSC Web Portal are eligible to purchase and obtain Guest Passes online; those without access must continue to purchase Host Punch Cards at Facility Attendant Stations (with cash or check) and at the Lakeview Cardholder Services Office.

RCSC Offices Closed on Labor Day

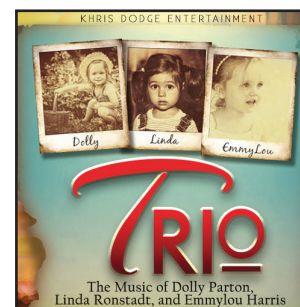

RCSC Elections

Candidate Packets Now Available; Get One Today

RCSC Board of Directors Election
Tuesday, December 10, 2019

Now is time to consider giving back to the community by becoming a candidate for upcoming Board elections.

Candidate packets are now available for this year's election. Those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Corporate/ Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 4, 2019.

There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term. Those leaving the Board at the end of 2019 are President Jerry DeLano, Director Darla Akins and Director Stella VanNess.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not reside with or be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Should be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

If elected, Directors cannot serve on any board of a Chartered Club or green committee or golf association affiliated with RCSC golf courses.

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;

- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize - policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

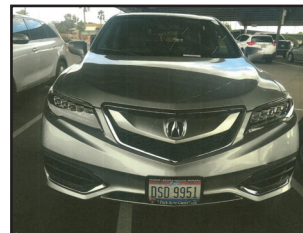
RCSC Cardholders:

Please keep the following in mind when using RCSC Facilities

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas only; not accepted concerts or free events).
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation and if eligible, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendant Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview and RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests should be prepared to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending free concerts and

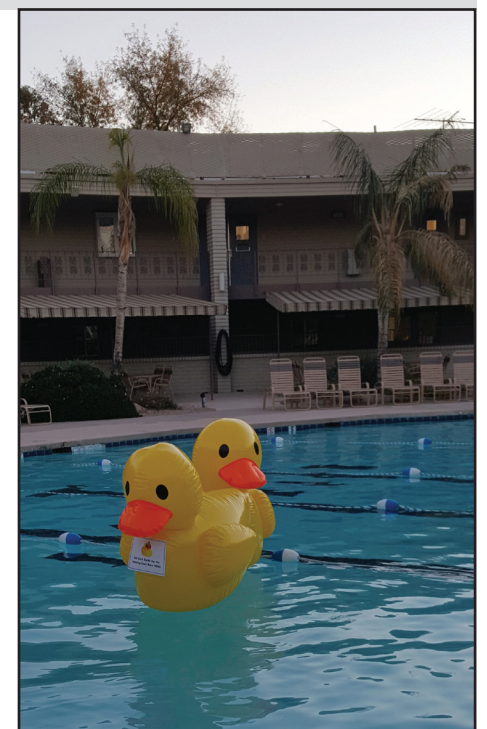

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

An unseasonably cool May resulted in an increase of 2,439 rounds over prior year. The rounds played in the May represented the highest total in the last four years. For the year, Riverview has played 22,092 rounds, followed by Lakes West (22,003 rounds), North (20,182 rounds), South (19,300 rounds) and Willowcreek (19,213 rounds). Year to date 52% of rounds played have been played by holders of an Annual No Fee pass or an Annual Fee pass.

We are now accepting entries for the first Sun City AZ event to be played on our golf simulator, the British Open – Sun City AZ edition. Golfers will get to choose a day and time slot that best fits into their schedule. Play will take place between July 15 and July 19, with four time slots available each day. Applications may be picked up in any pro shop and turned in to the South Pro Shop.

Snack Shops

Snack shops are now closing at 1:00pm on a consistent basis, though will remain open longer depending on demand. After the snack shops close, snacks and beverages are available through the pro shop.

Golf Courses

The bunker liner and sand replacement on the South Golf Course is now complete. Work is now focused on the rebuilding of the practice area. Shaping, irrigation tie-in and drainage are all complete and root zone material is installed. Final grading, sodding of green surrounds and sprigging of the green surfaces will be completed by the end of June.

Final placement of the forward tees on Lakes West has been determined and the locations have been marked. Construction of the forward tees will begin in July, following completion of the South Golf Course Practice area.

On June 24 and June 25 the courses finish up the second of our major agronomic practices, fairway aerification on the Willowbrook Golf Course. Beginning June 27, we begin the most disruptive practice, greens aerification, on Quail Run Golf Course. Both aerification practices are designed to relieve compaction and provide airflow to the root system of both surfaces. Aerification will finish on the Willowbrook Golf Course on August 7. This year we have scheduled an extra day on each course for this process, the extra day will allow more time for clean-up and provide a buffer in the event of equipment malfunctions.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

Routine mowing and rolling has resumed as of this week on lawn bowling greens. Bell was aerified on June 11 and Lakeview on June 13. Cores were pulled and then sand was drug into the holes. After this process was completed the greens were watered, rolled and fertilized. We did not add top dressing during this process as we are working towards lowering the green surface. Beginning the week of June 24 weekly verticutting will be introduced to the routine maintenance schedule. The resurfacing of the Mountain View and Oakmont greens are advancing as expected.

The softball field was verticut and vacuumed on June 19th, this process will continue weekly to eradicate the rye grass and promote Bermuda growth. The field was fertilized on June 24 and followed by an herbicide application to control nutsedge; this application will also impact any remaining rye grass.

Bowling is not only a fun sport, there's also no age limit so it is a great way to spend time with friends and family. And bowling is good for your health as well.

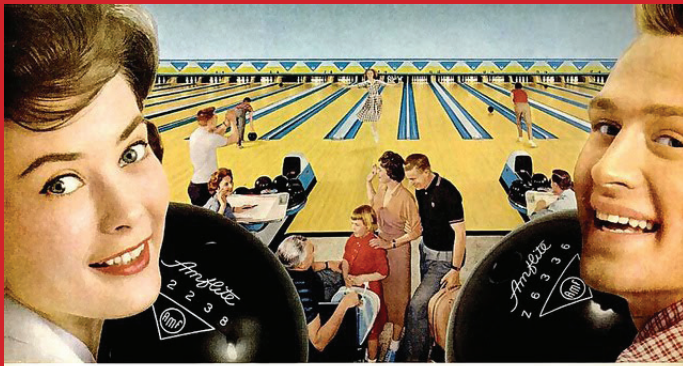

The average bowler walks more than one-half of a mile during a three-game series. Depending on your weight and amount of effort you put into the game, bowling can burn anywhere from 170-300 calories per hour when bowling, according to MayoClinic.com, which is the equivalent of jumping rope for 25 minutes.

Depending upon the weight, as you repeatedly swing and release the bowling ball, you are working to tone your shoulders, arms, chest and legs not to mention strengthening the muscles in your hands each time you pick up the ball.

And strength isn't the only benefit. You'll find improved flexibility and balance with this repeated motion helping your joints, ligaments and muscles along with better hand-eye coordination. With the pins nearly 60 feet away, each roll down the alley is over half of a basketball court.

Tips from a Pro

Basic Tips for Solid Putting

When it comes to putting there are almost as many different grips, stances and styles as there are putters to choose from! In other words, everyone is individual and what works for one person may not work for another. Preferences vary across the board and that is OK! There are a few things that most good putters have in common...let's talk about them.

First, develop a consistent way to line up. Some people prefer to pick a spot on the green to putt over, others use the name on the ball to line up to the hole and then use that to line up the putter. Whatever works best for you is fine, but either way start from behind the ball using both eyes facing the hole to find your spot. If you try to line up as you stand above your ball looking at the hole from the side the perception with your eyes will most likely not be accurate.

Second, make sure your eyes are above the golf ball on your set-up. Many times people ask me about how wide or narrow to stand, or how much to crouch or bend over and those things are all just preferences. Get comfortable...everyone is different. Just make sure you get your eyes above the ball so that making a stroke that stays on the target line as it swings back and forth is easier.

Third, use your hands, arms and shoulders together to make a pendulum stroke. This helps to keep the ball on line to the target, and helps consistency with speed. Using the wrists is much riskier and harder to control in both distance and direction. If this is difficult for you consider going to a longer putter which makes it harder to use too much of the wrists or try your left hand low on the grip.

Remember, once your mechanics are solid and consistent, putting is largely about confidence. Practice pressure-type situations, perhaps a putting contest with a friend, to simulate on course conditions.

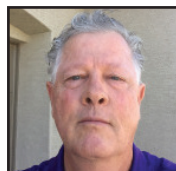

Mild Temperatures Increase Rounds, Revenue and Weeds

Southern Arizona, southern Nevada, the Coachella Valley in California, and central California typically see triple-digit temperatures through much of May and June. Rounds at most golf facilities decrease as golfers try to escape the heat, but this year courses in these areas are generally reporting double-digit percentage increases in golf rounds and revenue over last year as a result of milder temperatures. Although the uptick in revenue is a welcome sight for golf facilities, the weather pattern has resulted in increased weed pressure and slow bermudagrass recovery from overseeding.



Despite preemergence herbicide applied in spring, crabgrass has inundated this bermudagrass area as a result of mild temperatures and above-normal precipitation.

Courses in central California towns such as Fresno, Modesto and Visalia are challenged by significant crabgrass and goosegrass pressure despite having applied preemergence herbicides in the spring. Courses are scrambling to spot treat with postemergence products in high-profile areas, but this leaves visible scars that last for weeks and results are often inconsistent. In many cases, it is best to delay spray applications until next year and potentially expand the preemergence coverage by planning for two spring applications. For grassy and broadleaf weeds, use a combination of preemergence herbicides in the fall and spring, and utilize postemergence winter weed control in dormant turf. For difficult-to-control weeds such as Kyllinga and nutsedge, use a combination of postemergence and preemergence control methods over several years.

A shift to more proactive transition programs for overseeded courses has been widely successful in encouraging bermudagrass recovery. However, despite these improved programs, bermudagrass growth remains stagnant this year due to the mild temperatures and a significant delay in the monsoonal flow of moisture from Mexico. Resist the urge to apply additional nitrogen to encourage growth. Once humidity increases, the bermudagrass growth will increase substantially and excess nitrogen will only increase thatch and mowing requirements.

Every day, every year, golf course superintendents adjust agronomic practices and programs based on local weather conditions and patterns. This year, the primary challenge observed throughout the Southwest has been increased weed pressure and a significant delay in aggressive bermudagrass growth and recovery from overseeding due to mild temperatures in May and June.

As we get ready to face another election cycle, it is likely that political discourse will once again take center stage and cause moments of discomfort for folks on both sides of the spectrum. Some will take to social media while others might discuss matters over coffee or a meal at a local restaurant. Opposing viewpoints make for interesting discussions, but upset and distress should not be the driving force of conversations.

And don’t forget that your clothing makes a statement as well. Slogans on T-shirts and hats may make a fashion statement, but would your mother approve? Would you wear it into your church and to your grandchild’s dance recital?

In order to “keep the peace” I would suggest that we keep in mind what our founding fathers stated within the Preamble of the Declaration of Independence so long ago: “We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.”

I would like to feel that anyone using Recreation Centers of Sun City facilities, recreation centers, golf courses and club spaces to know that while they may be free to express their opinions that they should do so without causing turmoil and conflict for others.

Management Report

Financial Report

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended May 2019 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Every division has met or exceeded its net operating budget projections year to date with Bowling and Member Services exceeding both income and expense targets. Golf revenue continues to fall short of budget due to unexpected, inclement weather driving gross income unfavorable by (\$111,754) year to date. However, May year to date gross income improved by \$17.4k over prior month. Golf net operating income remains favorable by \$131,560 primarily driven by decreased spending in utilities and wages. General and Administrative expenses continue to be below budget with May ending \$136,083 favorable to budget.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in May were 12.3% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivable decreased in May by 1.2% and is up 6.0% from the beginning of the year. Overall accounts receivable past due balances have increased 7.56% since the beginning of the year. April assessments went 30 days past due at 6.7% rate and March assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.4% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$8,277 in May. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$43,361. Payments made in May by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$131,073 from 286 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$719,238 from 1,563 property owners.

In May, property transfer balances decreased by 4.4%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 50% of all receivables and 52% of past due balances. Outstanding lender related balances decreased in May. At the end of May trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 37 and properties owned by lending institutions decreased to 5.

Fairway Center

Repaint Fairway Center

- Bid packet has been approved by the Board Bid Commission. Work will be scheduled after the completion of the projects at Bell Center due to the need to close the Fairway pool area to paint in that area. Contractor: Silverado Painting (Cost \$75,000)

Bell Center

Pool Deck Replacement

- Deck installation currently scheduled to begin on 7/8/2019. Contractor: Rubcorp, AZ Safety Surfacing (Cost \$225,000)

Lap Pool Pebble Sheen Replacement

- Work is in progress. Pebble sheen chip out is complete and waterline tile installed. Racing line tile and wall targets scheduled to be completed by 6/27/2019 and pebble sheen installed by 7/3/2019. This project includes the chip out of the existing finish, replacement of pebble sheen surface, waterline tile, depth markers, new drain covers, and LED retrofit kits for lights. Bid packet approved by Bid Commission and contract executed. Contractor: CDC Pools, RCSC Skilled Trades (Cost \$59,263)

Walking Pool Pebble Sheen Replacement

- Chip out completed, wall tile installed, and pebble sheen installation began on 6/17/2019. There were not any structural issues on the bench in the walking pool with the issue being a separation of the old pebble finish from the gunite surface. Completion of the pebble finish anticipated by 6/24/2019 with the pool ready for filling. The repair of the 2" water supply line is scheduled for completion by 6/21/2019 with the pour back of the deck concrete after. This project includes the chip out of the existing finish, repair of broken bench, repair of 2" water supply line, replacement of pebble sheen surface, waterline tile, depth markers, new drain covers, and LED retrofit kits for lights. Bid packet approved by Bid Commission and contract executed. Contractor: CDC Pools, RCSC Skilled Trades (Cost \$60,838)

Outdoor Spa Pebble Sheen Replacement

- Chip out completed, wall tile installed, and pebble sheen installation scheduled to be completed by 6/24/2019 with the spa ready for filling. This project includes the chip out of the existing finish, replacement of pebble sheen surface, waterline tile, depth markers, new drain covers, and LED retrofit kits for lights. Bid packet approved by Bid Commission and contract executed. Contractor: CDC Pools, RCSC Skilled Trades (Cost \$8,068)

Pool Filter and Pump Replacement

- Replacement of the cartridge filters with sand filters for the walking pool and outdoor spa will be completed during the closure for the interior refinishing and deck replacement. Filters have been received and pending installation after the filling of the pool and spa. Contractor: Exceptional Water Systems, Osiris Pools and Spas (Budget \$16,000)

Lapidary Club Room

- Work is in progress. Bid packet approved by the Bid Commission. Club items/equipment have been moved out of the room. Demo of floor and remediation of environmental issues complete. Old light fixtures have been removed with electrical for new lights being roughed in. Pending next are the grinding of the floor in preparation of staining and sealing, and the installation of ceiling grid and new light fixtures. Project on target for completion by

the end of July. Work will include flooring, ceiling grid, overhead lights, cabinetry, and environmental remediation. Contractor: Multiple (Budget \$75,000)

Repaint Bell Center

- Work is in progress. Work began in the pool area to complete this area during the pool closure. As of 6/20/2019 this area is almost complete. Project cost was higher than budget due to the extensive prep work and priming required to ensure paint adhesion to the stucco. Project includes painting of all buildings, doors, wrought iron and gates, light canopies, and block walls. Contractor: Ghaster Painting & Coatings (Cost \$166,235)

Silvercraft Club Room

- All bids have been received and the bid packet to be submitted to the Bid Commission by 6/28/2019 for approval. Work will include flooring, ceiling grid, overhead lights, cabinetry, paint and environmental remediation. Target is to begin work upon the completion of the Bell Lapidary club room work. Contractor: Multiple (Budget \$78,000)

Table Tennis Flooring

- This project includes the removal of the current VCT flooring, environmental remediation, floor prep and replacement with padded flooring material. Costs for the environmental remediation and floor prep increased cost over projected budget. Awaiting a secondary proposal for the floor demo and remediation for revised project costs. Upon receipt of this proposal the bid packet will be submitted to the Board Bid Commission for approval. This approval submission is projected to be completed by 6/28/2019. Contractor: TBD, AZ Resource Flooring (Cost \$30,816)

Library Book Drop

- Bids for the project have been received. The project will be presented for approval the week of 6/24/2019. This project includes the placement of library book drops on an island on the north access road behind the library, installation of an access gate in the block wall and lighting upgrades along the access road. The costs of this project are to be reimbursed by the Friends of the Library. Contractor: TBD (Cost TBD)

Social Hall Restroom Remodel

- This project is the renovation of the restrooms at the Bell Center Social Hall. Due to delays in the review and updates of the design documents we will be unable to complete the work within the closure window. Unfortunately, this project will be delayed until 2020. The environmental remediation will be completed in July to resolve this issue. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$90,000)

Social Hall Kitchen Retrofit

- This project is the retrofit/remodel of the kitchen at the Bell Center Social Hall to a warming kitchen and replacement of the appliances. There is additional work in this kitchen with respect to cabinets, flooring and lighting. The scope may permit this project to be completed within the closure window in 2019. Awaiting the bid proposals for this work, including timeframes, for submission to the Board Bid Commission. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$20,000)

Grand Avenue

- Bids from 4 general contractors were received by the 6/18/2019 deadline. These bids are currently being reviewed with the bid packet pending submission to the Bid Commission for this review.
- The permit for the deceleration lane from ADOT is still pending.
- Time has been spent with the Vintage Vehicle Club on the use of the space allocated for their club. The club has the space shell and is currently evaluating how to use the space. A subsequent meeting will be scheduled to plan this space. No progress on allocating the open club space in the second building has been made.

Lakeview Center

Upper Restroom Remodel

- Final architectural designs took longer than anticipated to be completed due to additional mechanical review from a change in the layout. The revised plans have been received and are pending review. Anticipate submission to the Board Bid Commission is early July and completion of the project during the summer months. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$110,000)

Center Upper Roof Recoat

- No status change on this project. The upper roof on the Center building will have an elastomeric recoating applied. This project is approved by the bid commission based upon the size and lead time for the project it is to be completed in July. Contractor: Lyons Roofing (Cost \$46,900)

Artists By The Lake Club Room

- Work will include flooring, ceiling grid, overhead lights, cabinetry, paint and environmental remediation. Bid packet submitted to the Board Bid Commission and approved. Move of club items out of the room to begin 7/1/2019 with environmental remediation scheduled to start on 7/8/2019. Estimated to be a 6-week project to complete. Contractor: Multiple (Cost \$59,000)

Marinette Center

Pool Deck Replacement

- Work for this project likely to be pushed until the August/September timeframe. Formal bid packet for Bid Commission is pending. Contractor: TBD (Cost \$125,000)

Pickleball Pavilion Lighting

- The desired solution has been reviewed with the Pickleball Club. The club is comfortable with this solution under the understanding that the lighting levels will be approximately 100 foot candles at play level. This is in comparison to the current light levels of approximately 35 foot candles. The bid packet for this project to be submitted to the Bid Commission by 6/28/2019. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$180,000)

Oakmont Center

Pool Shade Structure

- The problem encountered on this project is the classification of the existing building, inclusive of the attached patio structure, and the new canopy. Based upon the classification of these buildings a setback between the two structures of 20' is required. Maricopa County disagreed with an opposing interpretation submitted for the permit. Due to the required setbacks the installation of the canopy is not possible, and this project will be cancelled. Additional umbrella shades can be used to provide shade in this area.

Sundial Center

Club Restroom Remodel

- Final architectural designs took longer than anticipated to be completed due to additional mechanical review from a change in the layout. The revised plans have been received and are pending review. Based upon project priorities this project will be delayed in starting until late summer. No change on this project as of 6/20/2019. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$100,000)

South Pro Shop

- No progress to date on the pending tasks that include wall coverings, pendant lighting at the seating bar, asphalt repair at the north and south ends of the parking lot, and building signage at the entry. The asphalt work is scheduled for completion during course closure for overseeding in the fall.

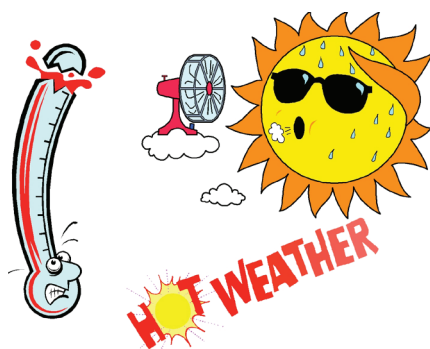

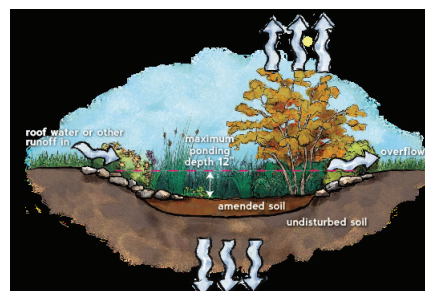
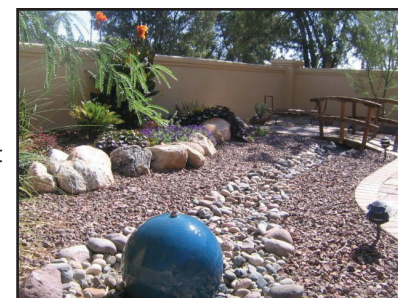
Rainwater Harvesting: Is it worth the effort?

We live in the Sonoran Desert where the average annual rainfall measures about eight inches and generally falls over a total of 36 to 40 days. With monsoon season still with us for a while, it is a good time to consider whether rainwater harvesting is worth the effort. According to some sources, it most certainly is.

Can you guess how many gallons of water fall on a home with only 1,500 square feet of roof (about the average size in Sun City) during a rainfall that delivers a half-inch of rain? How does 500 gallons sound? Unbelievable perhaps, but true. There are multiple ways to put this water to use and more ways of collecting it than simply using a rain barrel.

If rain pours off your roof and onto your driveway, only to run down the street and into the storm drains, something as simple as a gutter suitably positioned to redirect the water is a great place to start. Gutters can also rechannel those monsoon rains that, if not diverted, can pool around your home and harm foundations, rot wooden walls or, at the least, stain the walls.

So you have redirected the water away from your house and into your yard, but now what? If the water runs freely into your yard, is there a place where it runs or pools naturally? Perhaps this would be a good spot to put in a swale or a berm to redirect the water to plants, or even just to slow it down before it reaches any pavement and is lost to storm drains. We have all seen a "swale;" those decorative "rivers of rock" in the front yards of many Sun City homes. Not only are they attractive, but serve a true purpose by re-channeling water to plants and/or slowing its progress to the streets and storm sewers, which allows more rainwater to filter through the ground into aquifers.



If you are feeling ambitious, that natural low spot in your yard is the perfect place to put some desert-friendly plants, an area we can refer to as a "raingarden." This type of landscaping not only helps conduct water to plants, but aids in directing and filtering water to local aquifers. This is exactly how aquifers regenerate. While lakes, rivers and ponds receive water through rain and runoff, an aquifer is replenished by seepage through various levels of rocks and dirt until it reaches

a place where it can no longer permeate. Those layers of rocks, dirt, sands, etc. actually filter rainwater, helping to purify it.

Of course, there's always the obvious rainwater collection: the rain barrel. Probably the easiest solution with oodles of information to "google" out there. Rain barrels can be simple, above-ground collectors, or one can fashion a more elaborate system that goes underground, with pumps and other fancy gadgets. However, plastic barrels that connect to downspouts are the simplest to maintain, move and care for and finding a style made from recycled materials is easy, making your harvesting even more eco-friendly. Overall, they are the most economical. If the thought of attracting mosquitos makes you squeamish, there's even a remedy for that - "Mosquito dunks" are reported to be safe not only for wildlife, but for pets and people as well.

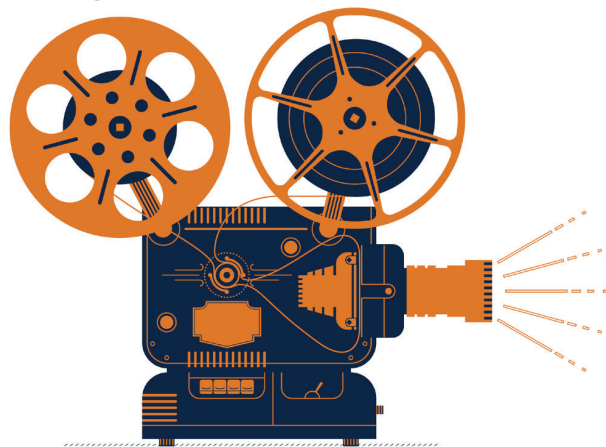

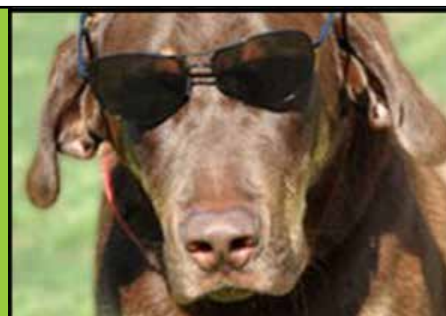

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Cardio Exercise vs. Strength Exercise

"With this particular debate, one is not "better than the other," states Fitness Specialist Jane Fortier. "Cardiovascular exercise and Strength training are both important for overall health. When put together, they can help achieve personal fitness goals and ward off disease, better than either one, alone.



Both cardiovascular and strength equipment are available for use by RCSC cardholders in all seven Sun City Fitness Centers.

Can a person lead a generally healthy life, if doing only cardio? Probably. Is the same true, if doing only strength? Possibly. But, when cardiovascular workouts and strength training are combined, the end result has a greater positive impact on long-term health and fitness."

As cardiovascular exercise begins, the heart starts pumping faster and breathing accelerates. These may seem like basic responses from a body under stress, but so much more is physically happening that leads to improved health and functionality. Faster breathing, increases the amount of oxygen in the blood. A quicker heartbeat, increases blood flow and capillary dilation. Both processes allow even more oxygenated blood to move toward working muscles. Over time and with continued engagement, the heart becomes stronger just like any other muscle. The lungs become more efficient. As oxygen is delivered more effectively, hemoglobin levels rise, insulin sensitivity and glucose tolerance improve, mood-enhancing endorphins are released, and the risk of cardiovascular disease lessens.

With all the obvious and well-researched benefits of cardiovascular exercises, does one need to worry about adding strength training? The answer is, YES. Chronological aging brings a loss in muscle mass - as much as three to five percent per decade, after the age of 30. That loss of muscle results in increased weakness. These two factors bring about a reduction in daily movement, poor balance and coordination, and a greater risk of falls, resulting in fractures. Strength training is known for its ability to build lean muscle mass. Lifting free weights, using weight machines, working with resistance bands, or engaging in body weight exercises, will overload muscles, causing little micro-tears in the fibers. The body responds to this damage, by repairing the tears. The result of this "breakdown/repair" process is thicker muscle fibers and greater muscle mass. But strength training isn't just about increasing muscle—it can also prevent injuries, help maintain weight loss, reduce the symptoms of many chronic conditions, and improve stability, mobility and balance. Building lean muscle mass boosts metabolism and burns more calories throughout the day, which positively affects weight loss and weight maintenance. The healthy stress put on the body, during strength exercise, has been shown to slow bone loss, and ultimately increase bone density. Regular strength training can even boost brain cognition and self-esteem.

"Alone, neither cardiovascular exercise nor strength exercise offers the complete fitness package," Fortier states. "Both have numerous health benefits, with some results overlapping. These exercise venues enhance one another. Regardless of the end goal, adding variety into a workout, by incorporating both cardiovascular exercises and strength training can improve health and overall personal fitness. Everyone is different, of course, and there is no one-size-fits-all approach, when it comes to the specifics of a workout regimen. We all have different goals, which means we each will benefit from a workout tailored to those goals."

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.

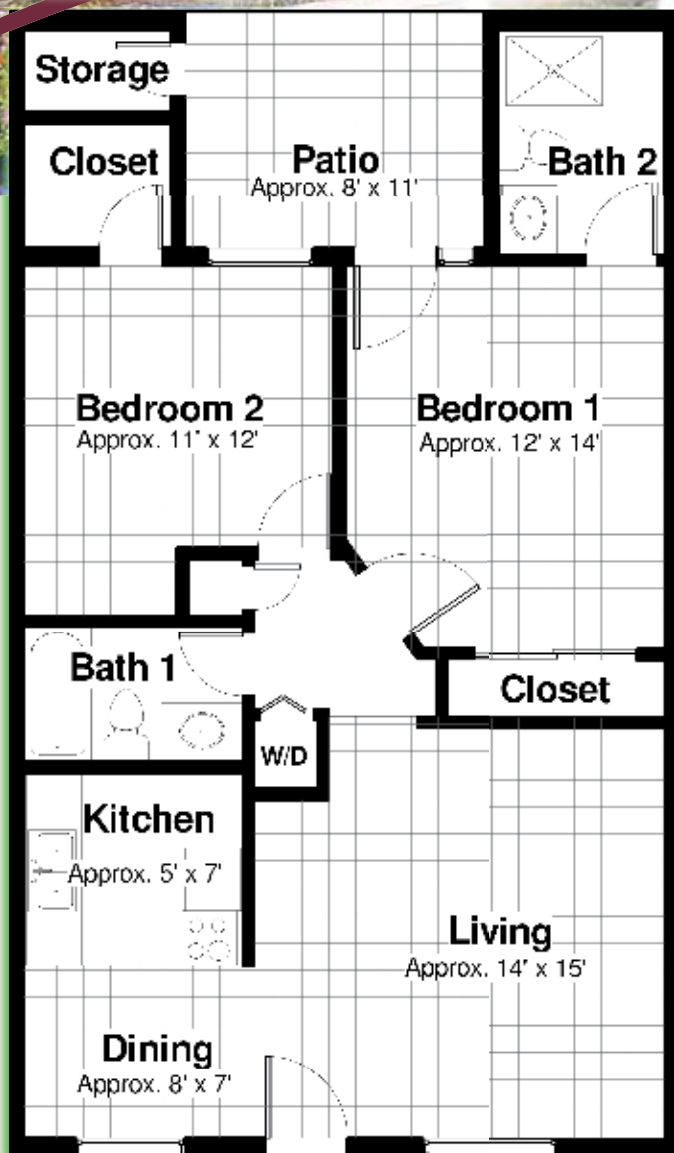
