Countdown to the 2020 RCSC Election Begins

While there may still be a few days to complete and submit a candidate packet for the 2020 RCSC Board of Directors Election (packet submittal deadline is Friday, October 2 at noon), it is likely that those interested have already completed this task. The number of candidates over the years has varied widely and with four vacancies needing to be filled this year, the Elections Committee has worked hard during this very difficult period to provide a full slate of candidates for your consideration.

So how and when will candidates be announced? Once signatures have been validated, a press release will be issued naming those RCSC



Members who will appear on the ballot in November. This release will be sent to the local media, posted on the RCSC website (www.suncityaz.org) and emailed to Cardholders who have enrolled to receive RCSC News Email Alerts.

RCSC Directors typically serve three-year terms and each year, elections are held to fill the three upcoming vacancies. The three directors whose terms on the Board are expiring at the end of the year are: President Dan Schroeder, Vice President Dale Lehrer and Treasurer Sue Wilson. In addition, two other seats on the Board need to be filled during this election cycle. The top three candidates with the most votes will serve three-year terms; the fourth vote-getter will serve a two-year term and the fifth place candidate will serve for only one year. All candidates must receive a minimum of 100 votes in order to win a seat on the Board. Should there not be five eligible winners, the Board will appoint another Member to complete the term(s).

Those wishing to meet the candidates once they have been announced will have the opportunity at all upcoming Board Meetings on October 12 and 29 and November 9 and 19. Due to COVID-19 sanitation restrictions, there will be no candidate literature placed at the various centers this election. Candidate biography information will be available in upcoming editions of the SunViews newsletter and via the RCSC Web Portal once online voting begins on Monday, November 9, 2020.

In addition, two "Candidate Forums" are scheduled where RCSC Members will have the opportunity to hear those seeking to be elected answer questions presented by both the forum moderator and members of the audience. There will be both an afternoon and an evening session so that those with daytime commitments will also have an opportunity to meet the candidate. Both sessions will be held in the Sundial Auditorium – the first one on Monday, November 2 from 2 to 4pm and an evening session on Thursday,

November 5 from 6 to 8pm. Members are welcome to arrive one-half hour early for social time and to meet the candidates. Please note that physical distancing will be observed and sanitation, face masks will be required; no refreshments will be served.

Should neither forum session convenient, video recordings will also be posted on RCSC's YouTube channel for Members to view at their leisure. Reminder notices will be sent via RCSC News Email Alerts when this information and documentation becomes available.

In addition to online voting, Members may request Absentee Ballots (if necessary) by calling the Corporate Office at 623-561-4600 anytime between November 10 and no later than December 1 if needing to be mailed. All absentee ballots must be received by Election Day (Tuesday, December 8, 2020) which is when in-person voting will occur at Lakeview Center Social Hall #2 only from 8am to 4pm.

Changes are Coming to SunViews

Starting in January 2021, SunViews will have a new look and layout. We will continue to have the news and information you need, but much of it will be a slimmer format and in a more timely fashion. Due to skyrocketing printing costs, SunViews will no longer be distributed directly to homes within Sun City AZ. Copies of this publication will continue to be available at RCSC offices, recreation centers, golf pro shops and bowling centers in addition to online access.

While we realize it is difficult for many clubs at this time who are yet unable to meet due to continued COVID-19 virus concerns and restrictions, we'll be revamping the information that is provided to Cardholders each month within the Club Directory (based upon submitted schedules approved by the Chartered Club Office) but will be eliminating the Club Event section.

Chartered Clubs will continue to receive space for an annual article per the established rotating schedule (Form BP 12-17 (b)) where they can include details about their club that make them unique and special. We're also excited to work with Clubs who might wish to enhance their RCSC webpages with more information. And as always, submittals for "Sun City Gives Back," highlighting the good deeds done by RCSC Clubs both here in the community and beyond may be submitted at any time for publication consideration.

Club Presidents will be receiving additional information soon providing more details regarding this transition. We're excited about these changes and look forward to improving RCSC's online presence and communication with Cardholders.

Getting onto the RCSC Web Portal

From the RCSC Web Portal, Cardholders can easily make assessment payments, manage email subscriptions, book and edit golf tee times, vote in RCSC Board of Directors Elections and so much more!

Just follow these simple steps and you'll be on your way!

1. Notify Cardholder Services of your email address for your RCSC Cardholder number. Go to <https://login.suncityaz.org/AddEmail.aspx> to securely provide the necessary information to update your email address.
2. Go to www.suncityaz.org and click on Login (right side, top of page).
3. Welcome to the RCSC Web Portal page will display. There is a link from this page to general web portal information, including the Web Portal Instruction Manual.
4. First time users MUST click on the New User Retrieval Password link at the top of the page.
5. Enter your RCSC Cardholder number in the Username field.
6. Click on "Send Password" and in a few minutes, check your email for your password. If you do not receive this email, contact Cardholder Services to confirm the email address that is on file.
7. Return to the RCSC Web Portal Login page and enter both User Name (RCSC Cardholder number) and Password.

Now you're all set to start using the web portal, sign up for RCSC News Email Alerts and more!

Should you forget your password, simply go to the Portal Welcome page and click on "forgot your password?" and enter your User Name (RCSC Cardholder number) then click the Send Reset Link button. You will receive an email with a link to reset your password.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Golf rounds in July increased by 4,825 over prior and represent the most rounds played since 2006. For the year, Riverview has played 34,205 rounds, followed by Lakes West (33,238 rounds), South (32,639 rounds), Willowcreek (31,692 rounds) and North (27,545 rounds). For the month, 59% of rounds played were played by Annual No-Fee and Annual Surcharge Fee Golf Passes.

On September 4 we will be hosting a fundraising event to support Patriot Golf Day and the Folds of Honor Foundation. Due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions, the format will be a straight sheet start beginning at 7am, results will be announced via email with no formal lunch following play. Entry forms are available in all pro shops, entry fees may be paid by credit card or off the cardholder's account. Winners of skins will have the money deposited into their Advanced Deposit account. We currently have 61 participants registered to play, slightly ahead of last year's total at this time.

Snack Shops

Snack shop closing time is now 1pm (3pm starting October 1), after the snack shops close, snacks and beverages are available in the pro shop.

Golf Courses

All major summer agronomic procedures have been completed and overseeding is a month away. Overseeding will begin on September 28 for South, Lakes East, Willowcreek and Riverview. These courses will re-open on October 17 with cart path restrictions in place until November 6. The remaining courses will close October 19 and re-open November 7 with cart path restrictions in place until November 20. We are currently not planning an overlap period during which all courses will be closed; however, we will be monitoring long range forecasts as we near the September 28 start date. Should forecast temperatures prove problematic for overseeding, we will move the start date for the first wave of course closures to October 5. Should this change prove necessary, it will result in an overlap period of course closures as we will not move the second wave of course closures back.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

Bowlers may have noticed the strong discoloring of the greens recently. Unfortunately, a growth regulator was over applied and resulted in the browning of the green surface. This misapplication will not result in any long-term issues and the greens have already begun to get their color back. We have increased watering to aid in the recovery process.

Green speeds and moisture readings are as follows:

Bell South	9.2 seconds	15.6 MQ
Mountainview	8.9 seconds	13.5 MQ
Oakmont	9.0 seconds	999 27.5 MQ

The lack of monsoon activity has resulted in less cleanup work than most summers. However, the lack of moisture has also placed increased stress on plants. To help offset the lack of rain and higher than normal temperatures, watering times in landscaped areas have been increased. The softball field will be closed towards the end of September for overseeding, a definitive date has not been selected.

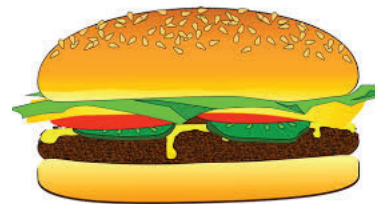

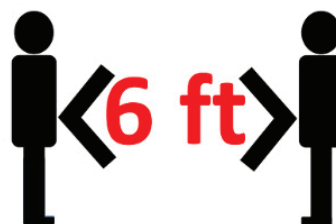

Bowling Centers Now Open

Phase 2 Restrictions & Requirements

Prior to entering RCSC facilities, RCSC has implemented COVID-19 symptom screening with signage. Please read and evaluate whether you meet the criteria to enter RCSC facilities. Anyone with potential symptoms may not enter RCSC facilities. High-risk individuals should remain at home.

- Hand sanitizer is required upon entry to all RCSC facilities and offices. Users may utilize the sanitizer provided by RCSC.
- Bowling Centers will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm.
- No guests or visitors are allowed. All customers MUST individually display their RCSC Member or Privilege Cards to verify eligibility (ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS; KEY FOBS NOT ACCEPTED).
- No league play at this time.
- A limited number of users may be permitted at one time, once capacity has been reached you may be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Face masks are required. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Every other lane open with only 3 bowlers allowed per lane.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- No use of concourse tables and chairs is allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- All Games must be prepaid (maximum 3 games per person).
- Credit Cards only – no cash accepted for payment.

Sun City Pickleball Club

Sun City residents are blessed with great amenities and that includes 20 pickleball courts at Marinette (eight under cover), and seven courts at Mountain View! More courts might be added at Mountain View when that center is renovated in the future. Sun City Pickleball Club has 742 members as of September 1, 2020 and continues to grow.

Throughout our Club season, typically September through April, our Club offers many different activities and internal Club tournaments. The "Pickleball Rodeo" is a favorite for many where members try their pickleball skills at different tasks. We organize several internal Club tournaments, weekly ladders, women's league, clinics, and modified pickleball for those with physical limitations. We also have a friendly rivalry with Sun City West's pickleball Club meeting six times for reciprocal play. Proud to say that this last reciprocal season our Club won all 6 meets!

Our Club hosts three external tournament each year - Sun City Round Up, Sun City SSIPA and Sun City Spring Slam. Last season these tournaments brought 1,320 players from all over the U.S. & Canada to Marinette. These tournaments help fund our Club; special thanks to those Club members who volunteer to help these run smoothly. We'd like to thank the Posse who help to man the parking lots during these events; they do a great job! We are one of the few tournament facilities that have onsite volunteer EMTs from the Sun City Fire Department to attend to any injuries, a huge thank you to those folks. And special thanks to all of the RCSC workers at Marinette who helped with everything, i.e. setting up chairs, hanging banners, clean-up and making it a safe place for all attendees.

With some of the tournament proceeds this year we purchased two sets of bleachers which are on the north courts at Marinette, which will be used for clinic instruction and demonstrations as well as tournament seating. Two ball machines known as "The Lobster" were also purchased, one for each site.

Club activities were cut short by the COVID-19 pandemic and while it's been a trying time for all, we are thankful that RCSC took direction from the CDC and closed down to keep us all safe. Some die hard pickleball players were up in arms, so a couple of ladies got together and diligently set up portable nets at a church parking lot every morning at 7am. There was a small group of players that showed up every day to play. Social distancing was practiced and pickleballs were sanitized after each use. We are very happy that RCSC courts have re-opened for doubles play.

Thoughts from a Pro
Chip Like You Putt

The easiest way to get the ball onto the green when you are close is to use your putter. Why? Because the ball stays on the ground and so it is easier to control the direction. However, when putting off the longer grass controlling distance is a bit harder since the ball must roll over the thicker grass before getting to the shorter grass.

So, the other option is to use an iron (in the same way you would the putter) and putt! This is called a "chip" but referring to it as a putt with an iron may give you a better sense of what the mechanics of the shot should be. Putting with an iron gives the ball a little hop before it rolls which will get the ball up and over the thicker grass. Unlike a putter which is flat, the iron has a lofted face which means you do not have to help it with the hop, but it will do it automatically if you simply putt!

Putting with an iron is a simple concept and it will make it a bit easier if you adjust the set up as if you were putting. In other words, stand over the ball like you do with your putter, choke down a bit to make the iron more the length of a putter and even use your putting grip.

Lastly experiment with different irons to see which ones work best for you. The more loft of the iron you choose the more it hops and the less it rolls. Most people find it helpful to have two clubs to use for chipping...one the does a little hop and a bigger roll like a 7 iron and perhaps one that does a bigger hop and a lesser roll like a pitching wedge.

Chipping can be fun and easy if you keep it simple. It also can save you lots of extra shots around the green if you practice and become consistent and confident.

A Moment with President Schroeder

Looking Towards the Future

Let's take a moment and think about all we have that's good and look ahead to when everything gets back to normal. This has been a rocky road for everybody - one way or another. Lots of people have expressed their concerns and disappointments, approvals and appreciation for what has happened over the last six months. And I'm sure there will be plenty more exchanges as we head into the future.

I would like to ask you one simple question - Did you move to Sun City AZ because it was a great value? For many, the answer is yes. The recreational facilities and activities offered to cardholders here can't be beat at the price we pay. Every other Sun City community in the nation and similar age-restricted developments, no matter where they are located throughout the country, cost far more. Things here will get back to the way they were - I promise.

Another reason some folks mention for locating here is the cleanliness and safety of the community. Do you realize that's the result of volunteers who join the Prides and the Posse to make it so? Other issues of concern for residents may be addressed by various community organizations but ultimately, many of these issues must be taken up with the proper governmental agencies who oversee this area of non-incorporated Maricopa County.

Though the Posse does a great job in providing services to the community such as vacation watch and the RUOK program, the ultimate policing authority for the area is the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office. Face it - Crime is everywhere. We all have a responsibility to live by the golden rule, watch out for our neighbors and report any suspicious activities and incidents that may occur to the agency responsible.

The Sun City Prides work tirelessly to pick up trash and keep much of the roadside vegetation on the major arterials throughout the community neat and trimmed. However, the streets, signs and traffic controls are overseen by the Maricopa County Department of Transportation. Through the Sun City Home Owners Association's Road and Transportation Committee, acting as a liaison to relay resident's concerns, the bottom line is that decisions on these matters happen elsewhere.

Complaints and concerns about bars and rehab facilities and vacant storefronts fall under Maricopa County zoning, permitting and licensing agencies. Neither RCSC nor SCHOA have any jurisdiction over what happens with commercial properties.

Some feel there may have been too many restrictions over the last few months. Still others want it all but seem unwilling to listen, consider the consequences or pony up the additional costs that would be required. But the past is the past.

So how do we start looking toward the future and make sure things happen for the good of all? Some might suggest that if you think you can do better, why not run for the Board? Well... if you've not committed yourself by now it is too late for this year.

And while being on the Board might not be everyone's cup of tea, learning, understanding and participating in all aspects of Sun City AZ life is something everyone in the community ought to consider. Start by getting involved; be a part of the solution by becoming a volunteer if you're willing and able.

Another way to improve what lies ahead might be to research and find the answers to your questions. While RCSC provides Cardholders with a wealth of information in a variety of ways, some wish to be spoon-fed only the details for which they are concerned - unwilling or unable to help themselves, consider the full picture or how their issues and wishes might affect everyone else.

Management Report

Project Updates

Financial Report:

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended July 2020 within its operating and capital budget year to date. All Divisions, with the exception of Bowling and Food Service, have met or exceeded their net operating budget projections year to date with total operating income \$60k (~1%) favorable to budget and operating expenses \$896k (9%) favorable to budget. Bowling and Food Service declines are driven by the COVID-19 closure and restrictions with Bowling remaining closed until Phase II of the reopen plan. Income favorability is driven by higher than budgeted income in the Building & Infrastructure and Golf Divisions. Operating expense favorability is primarily driven by lower payroll, utility and general operating expenses across multiple Divisions. Year to date operating excess without projects favorability is \$928k (38%) favorable to budget. RCSC is continuing to see the effect of the COVID-19 related shutdown with July monthly operating income shortfalls in Bowling and Food Service totaling \$56k. However, Golf operating income excess of \$77k in July offset the shortfall.

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of August, the following Treasurer's Report is included in this management report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of July 31, 2020 was \$15,558,984 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of July 31, 2020, PIF had a balance of \$17,708,892 plus \$612,914 collected in July that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of August 2020. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$5,373,119 as of month end. The corporation operated within its budget year to date 2020.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in July were 6.4% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivable increased in July by 1.1% and is up 10.9% from the beginning of the year. Overall accounts receivable past due balances have decreased in July by 1.2%. June assessments went 30 days past due at a 4.6% rate and May assessments went 60 days past due at a 1.6% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$25,013 in July. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$73,354. Payments made in July through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$147,301 from 323 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,250,033 from 3,057 property owners.

In July property transfer balances increased by 7.9%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 52% of all receivables and 51% of past due balances. At the end of July trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 24 and properties owned by lending institutions decreased to 3.

WiFi Upgrades

Additional delays on the scheduling of cabling occurred. Completion of the required cabling and equipment installation is scheduled for the week of 8/31/2020.

Bell Center

- Social Hall Restroom Renovation

This project includes the full renovation of the social hall restrooms including the inclusion of accessible facilities. Bids from contractors were received and the bid packet has been approved by the Board bid commission. The demolition work will begin on 8/26/2020. The work is projected to be completed in 9 weeks. Contractor: K.L. McIntyre (Cost: \$160,487)

- Social Hall Kitchen Renovation

This project includes the full renovation of the social hall kitchen will replace flooring, lighting and cabinetry in the kitchen and the trash receptacle areas. Bids from contractors were received and the bid packet has been approved by the Board bid commission. The demolition work will begin on 8/26/2020. The work is projected to be completed in 12 weeks. Contractor: K.L. McIntyre (Cost: \$126,926)

Grand Center – Building I

- Clubs have moved into Grand Center and are operating on revised summer hours of 8:00AM-4:30PM daily.
- Most pending items have been completed within the club rooms with several minor items remaining.
- The RCSC Grounds Department is working on the landscaping on the site and is expected to complete this work in September.
- Pending is the 103rd Ave monument sign and building signage. Final signage design has not yet been completed.

Grand Center – Building II

- The bids from contractors were reviewed and the bid packet presented to the Board bid commission for review and approval. The bid commission has approved the selection of Robert E. Porter Construction, Inc. to complete this project.
- A letter of intent has been provided to the general contractor to allow the engagement of subcontractors while the construction contract is finalized. The contract is expected to be fully executed by the end of the month with general contractor mobilization beginning shortly thereafter.

Lakes East/West Maintenance Yard

- No changes during the month of August.

Mountain View Center

- No planning or design work completed since the last report.

Solar:

New Issues:

- **Mountain View – # 14**

Inverter had a clock failure. 7/13/2020 B&I reset, tested battery (3.0 volts), set date and time, issue resolved.

Issues Resolved:

- **Fairway Center – # 10**

On 8/24/2020 an ABB inverter from the Lakeview Lanes site was moved to Fairway Center and installed to replace this damaged inverter. Because this site uses ABB inverters throughout, an ABB inverter is required to maintain the production data communication. New ABB inverters are no longer provided by the manufacturer, so a relation of an inverter is necessary. A replacement SMA inverter will be placed at the Lakeview Lanes site and will integrate with the other SMA inverters at this site for communications. This inverter has been received and is pending an electrical transformer replacement before it can be installed. This is projected to be completed the week of 8/31/2020.

Open Issues:

- **Oakmont Rec Center – # 01/02/03/04/05/06**

The inverters at Oakmont Center are not reporting production data. This has been an outstanding issue since July 2018. The production meter shows overall production data for the site, but the individual inverters are not reporting production to the Also Energy aggregation reporting site.

The Kortman technician has been working with both Also Energy and Fronius to resolve the communication issues after the replacement of the data logger. Both Also Energy and Fronius indicate the configurations are correct and the data logger should be communicating. The physical wiring has been verified to be good. This is being escalated at both Also Energy and Fronius for a resolution.

- **Lakeview Rear – # 01/02/03/04**

Similar to the Oakmont site the inverters at the Lakeview Rear site stopped communicating with the Also Energy data logger and thus the Also Energy aggregation reporting site. The Lakeview Rear inverters are Fronius models similar to Oakmont Center with these two sites being the only Fronius inverters in the RCSC Solar environment.

Pending confirmation of restored functionality at Oakmont Center.

- **Lakeview Lanes – # 01/02/03/04/05/06/07/08/09**

Production results significantly lower than expected for this group of inverters. Four of the replacement SMA inverters were installed at this location and the production output was similar to the PowerOne/ABB models removed. DC voltages from the solar panels were field tested and did not indicate significant under supply of voltages. Additional investigation needed on these inverters to identify a cause of the under production and if preventative maintenance tasks positively affect performance.

The transformer at this location will be replaced the week of 8/31/2020 to resolve several issues at this site. After this replacement additional work on the under production can continue.

Production Data:

After including June production data, the lifetime to date production versus expected went down again slightly and is over expected by 5.44%. The percentage of inverters producing above expected reduced by 3 inverters to 79%. Two of these inverters had small reductions of less than 0.06% that moved the overall inverter production from just over even to expected production to just under expected production.

Water Conservation

Fall is a Great Time to Check Your Irrigation Times

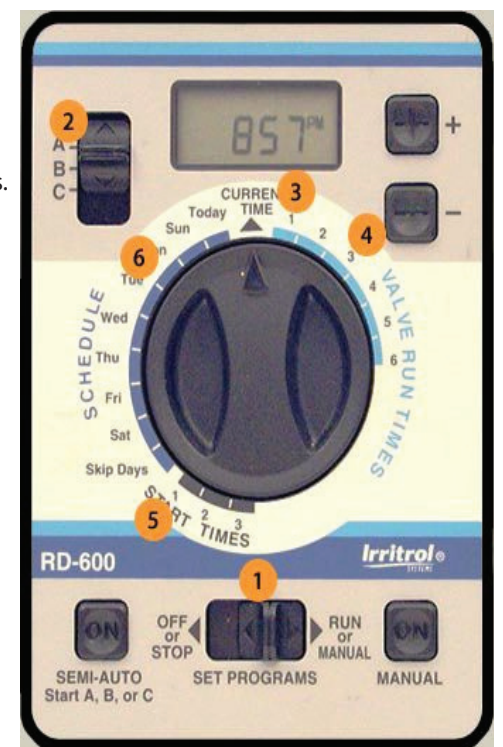
You can literally save thousands of gallons of water by properly setting your irrigation controller. Now that the hot, dry summer is over, this is the perfect time to change your watering schedule. Here are some easy steps to take and get the job done quickly.

Basic Controller Features

- **Stations** control the valves that release the water to the irrigation **Zones** in your yard or garden. Put plants with similar water needs on the same station or zone. This allows for more efficient watering since all emitters and/or sprinklers on a single valve will run for the same amount of time. Multiple stations or zones allow you to customize watering amounts for different types of plants by allowing for different run times for different valves.
- The **Start Time** is the time at which a specific valve will open to irrigate a station or zone.
- The **Run Time** or **Station Duration** is the time, in minutes, a specific valve will stay open and therefore water a zone.
- **Semi-Auto** lets you run through an entire program (A, B, or C) whenever you want a supplemental watering.
- **Off or Stop** will stop programs from running until you toggle back to 'Run'. Your programs will be saved. This is great during rainy periods.
- The **Manual** button allows you to run a single valve for the amount of time you select. This is helpful when you want to tune-up your irrigation system and check for leaks, misaligned sprinkler heads or clogged drip emitters.
- A **Program** is where you store all of your settings. It consists of a set of stations set to specific start times and run times. Here, multiple programs A, B, & C allow you to run different valves on different days with different run times. Make sure each program runs stations with similar plant water needs to maximize irrigation efficiency.

Programming Your Controller

1. For easy programming, first slide the "Set Program" (1) toggle to the middle, and then start in the upper left corner of your controller and move clockwise through the settings. Start with program A (2).
2. Set the dial to current time and use the +/- buttons to locate the current time of day. Turn the dial one click to the left and use the +/- buttons to locate the day of the week. You only have to do this once (3).
3. Turn the dial to the "valve run times" to select a station and use the +/- buttons to enter the amount of watering time for that valve, which sends water to a particular zone in your yard or garden (4).
4. Turn the dial to start times and use the +/- buttons to select time you'd like your irrigation to begin. You can have three different start times per day, but typically you only need one (5).
5. Now turn the dial to "schedule" the days you want your irrigation to run or the numbers of days to skip in between watering. Use the +/- buttons to enter this information (6).
6. Now repeat steps 3, 4 & 5 for each station/valve you are controlling, and program A is complete. Use programs B & C for other zones that require difference frequencies of watering, such as turf, Xeriscape, vegetable gardens, etc.

Phase Two of RCSC Reopening Plan

On August 27, 2020, Maricopa County met Moderate Reopening Status in the following three metrics: 1) Cases per 100,000 individuals, 2) Percent positivity, and 3) Hospital Visits for COVID-like illnesses in the region allowing RCSC Fitness Centers to re-open with limited capacity on Friday, August 28, 2020 and Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. ("RCSC") to move into Phase Two of its re-opening plan. The following is the criteria for use of RCSC facilities:

REQUIREMENTS FOR USE OF ALL RCSC FACILITIES

- Prior to entering RCSC facilities, RCSC has implemented COVID-19 symptom screening with signage. Please read and evaluate whether you meet the criteria to enter RCSC facilities. Anyone with potential symptoms may not enter or use RCSC facilities. High-risk individuals should remain at home.
- Hand sanitizer is required upon entry to all RCSC facilities and offices. Users may utilize the sanitizer provided by RCSC.
- A limited number of users may be permitted at one time, once capacity has been reached you may be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Face masks are always required while indoors except in showers, indoor pools and indoor spas. Outdoors face masks are required in the walking pool. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Strict 6 feet of physical distancing is required while in the fitness centers, indoor walking track, locker rooms and restrooms regardless if in same family. All other RCSC facilities require a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- No cash accepted for payment.

BASKETBALL – CLOSED UNTIL PHASE 3

BILLIARDS - Reopened 9/4/2020

- Billiards will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm. Face masks are required. Only 2 players per table. Use of only every other table allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment (pool sticks, cue ball, pool balls, etc.), including table railing, seating, counters and side tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOATING, PADDLE BOATS – CLOSED UNTIL PHASE 3

BOATING, ROW BOATS

- Only 1 person per boat. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing while on RCSC property, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- RCSC will sanitize life vest, oars and cushion after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment not sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOCCE

- Use of every other rink with only 3 bowlers allowed at end of each rink in use. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOWLING – Reopened 9/4/2020

- Bowling Centers will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm.
- Face masks are required. Every other lane open with only 3 bowlers allowed per lane.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- No use of concourse tables and chairs is allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

DARTS – Reopened 9/4/2020

- Darts will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm – 3pm.
- Face masks are required. Only 2 players and 1 table and 2 chairs per machine allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

DOG PARK

- Hand sanitizer required upon entry. Only 1 person per bench. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs with maximum of 2 chairs per table and always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

FISHING

- Only 1 person per bench. No use of gazebos. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

FITNESS INCLUDING INDOOR TRACK

- All Fitness including the Indoor Track at Fairway will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 12pm – 1pm.
- No guests allowed.
- Face masks are required. Each fitness center will allow 25% capacity at one time. Once capacity has been reached, you will be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Cardholders must go directly to Fitness Area OR Track at time of check in and must check out with the Facility Attendant prior to leaving or using any other amenity.
- Strict 6 feet of physical distancing is required while using fitness, indoor walking track, locker rooms and restrooms regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- Every other piece of cardio equipment will be turned off to maintain at least 6 feet of space between users.
- When using strength machines or other equipment, users are required to maintain strict physical distancing of 6 feet or more.
- No outside equipment allowed into the facility, including but not limited to, mats, exercise balls, weights, and foam rollers.
- Cardholders are encouraged to bring their own water with secure lids to rehydrate.

GOLF COURSES, PRO SHOPS, SNACK SHOPS

- Face masks required inside Pro Shops and Snack Shops.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family unless riding in same golf cart, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Chairs may not be moved from one table to the other.

MINIATURE GOLF

- RCSC to sanitize putters, balls, and scoring pencil after each use.

- No guests allowed. If lanes are provided, only one swimmer/user per lane. Sign up required to use lap lane(s) with 30-minute time limit.

- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.

- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

POOL, WALKING

- No guests allowed.
- Masks are required in walking pool. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.

- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

RACQUETBALL, HANDBALL, WHISPERBALL

- Only 1 player per court. No guests allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

SHUFFLEBOARD – Reopened 9/4/2020

- No guests allowed.
- Face masks are required at indoor courts. Only 2 players allowed at end of every other court.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment (cues, disks, pins, etc.), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TABLE TENNIS

- Face masks are required. Only 2 players per table. No use of ball machine(s). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TENNIS

- Four players per court (effective 9/1/2020). No use of ball machine(s). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pavilion seating, benches, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TRACK - OUTDOORS

- No guests allowed. Only 1 person per bench.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

WALKING

- All indoor walking allowed only at the indoor walking track at the Fairway Center. No guests allowed.

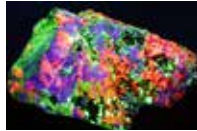

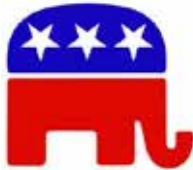

Struggling With Body-Image

"No matter how much you exercise or how carefully you watch what you eat, everyone suffers body-image issues, from time to time", states fitness professional Jane Fortier. "As someone who has battled weight more than 55 years, I have dealt with this first-hand. Occasionally, we all need a little boost in our "exercise self-esteem." Perhaps one of the following mantras will give you the boost you need, when discouragement sets in, and those exercise efforts seem in vane"

"When life throws you curves, embrace them!" Whether your current body curves are the result of being overweight, thin, or somewhere in between, embrace the body you have right now. Bird legs or thunder thighs, your legs take you where you want to go. Skinny arms or bat wings, your arms allow you to hug your kids and grandkids. Love your body, it's a gift! You CAN improve how you look and how your body functions, through exercise - be patient, be diligent, stay committed. But above all, be thankful for the body you have.

"Happiness isn't size specific." Contrary to what the media might lead us to believe, happiness doesn't come from having a perfect looking body. Happiness is a choice, not a condition. We need to choose to be happy with life as it presents itself right now, and stay positive as we work to make our level of physical fitness better. Happiness is not dependent on how you look, but on how successfully you deal with life each day.

"You are so much more than the number you see on the scale." The scale measures the effect of gravity on your body. That's it! The scale can't tell you how good you feel. The scale can't tell you how much you're loved. The scale can't tell you how much you should love yourself. It can't even tell you how strong you are. As you exercise, the number on the scale will eventually drop. If you need to chart something numeric in your quest to get fit, track inches lost. This is a much more accurate measurement of body composition changes. If you are married to the scale, get a divorce!

"Exercise because you love your body, not because you hate it." Exercise should never be punishment for something you eat. It's the reward for caring about your body. Exercise should make you feel good and strong and energized. Exercise for overall body improvement, rather than focusing just on calories burned and specific body areas you want to change. We're all human. We all have flaws. Your body is yours - you should respect it for what it can do, and its potential for improvement. Exercise allows you to unfold the full potential of your body. Embrace that opportunity, and take pride in what your body can accomplish.

"Don't say anything about yourself that you wouldn't say about your best friend." Would you tell your best friend she is lazy, worthless and out-of-shape. Would you tell her that you hate her and wish she would change the way she looks. Would you talk down about her, day-in and day-out. Of course not! You respect that friend and care too much about her, to say such things. So STOP saying hateful things to yourself! Make being in your own skin a joy, rather than a misery. Simply accept where you are in life, focus on the moment, enjoy all the good things your body can accomplish, and push forward with an exercise program that will improve your situation. Think IT, Say IT, Become IT.

How Your Body Speaks to You

The mind is reflected in every part of the human body. Through the body we can get in touch with emotional issues that we have been repressing, denying or ignoring. As I sit and type this paper, I feel tension in my shoulders, I often experience this when I'm on the computer composing material. Feeling tension in the shoulders, it's like experiencing the weight of the world on your shoulders. I keep reaching back giving myself a massage, stretching my neck and repeating my affirmations.

Our bodies speak to us; the question is are we listening, and if we're not it begins to scream. This can be in the form of chronic and consistent pain, a body disorder or dysfunction and eventually disease. The role of the mind and emotions affect our state of health. This is only a part of the overall picture, but it's the part that is invariably overlooked. By understanding this relationship, we can gain insight, and can play a greater role in our own health and well-being. There have been great contributions made in this area of health care, by individuals such as Dr. Andrew Weil, founder and director of The Center for Integrative Medicine at University of Arizona. Dr. Weil practices integrative medicine - which considers the whole person, not just the symptoms. He makes this practice completely mainstream through his books and CDs.

Most of us tend to think of our bodies and minds as separate systems and believe they function independently for the most part. Our thoughts and feelings get translated into chemicals that fire off throughout our body, altering the chemical composition and behavior of the cells. If we are aware of which area of our body is painful, we can begin to focus on that area, possibly give our self a self-massage and start to work with some of the emotional components related to that area.

One of my main reference books, is by Louise L. Hay "Heal Your Body" which states if you tend to carry a lot of tension in your shoulders, the emotional component is related to our ability to carry our experiences in life joyously. It can also represent, carrying the weight of the world on your shoulders. We can begin to improve our emotional state by implementing positive affirmations for the shoulder, for example that would be, "I choose to allow all my experiences to be joyous and loving." Another possible affirmation is "I relax and release my perceived burdens."

Implementing this complimentary self-care practice can be beneficial in reducing stress and improving overall health and well-being. Additional practices could include guided meditation, and a simple acupressure technique called EFT, Emotional Freedom Technique. In between massage sessions, such self-care tools and techniques can be implemented.

Massage helps us to manage stress and can also be used to address a number of health issues. A full complement of massage services are offered at Fairway, Sundial and Bell Recreation Centers (as noted below) for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests. 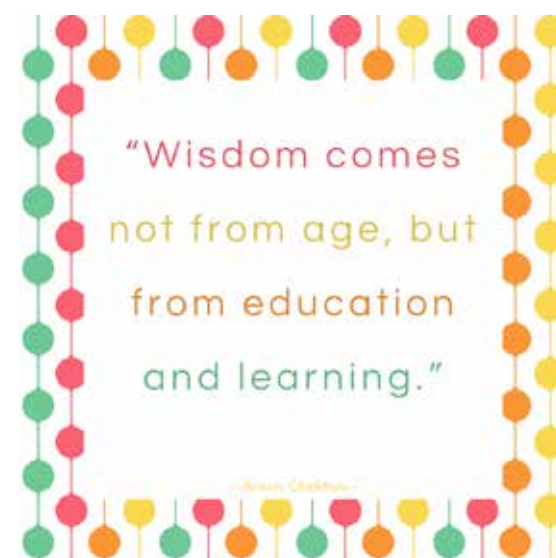
