RCSC Election Nears; Voting Starts November 9

The RCSC Board of Directors and the Elections Committee are pleased to announce the seven candidates whose names will appear on this year's ballot – Steve Collins, Kat Fimmel, Martin Heinrichs, Dale Lehrer, Karen McAdam, Sheila Rooney and Sue Wilson.

When early voting starts on Monday, November 9, 2020 (via the RCSC Web Portal), RCSC Members will be voting to fill a total of five vacant board seats. The three Directors whose terms expire at the end of December are currently held by President Dan Schroeder, Vice President Dale Lehrer and Treasurer Sue Wilson. In addi-

tion, there are two other seats on the Board currently filled by appointees Ron Jesse and Jerry Walczak that will become vacant.



Based upon ballots cast, the top three candidates with the most votes will serve full three-year terms; the fourth vote-getter will serve a two-year term and the fifth-place candidate will serve for only one year. All candidates must receive a minimum of 100 votes in order to win a seat on the Board. Should there not be five eligible winners, the Board will appoint additional Member(s) as necessary.

Due to COVID-19 sanitation restrictions, there is no candidate literature being placed at the various centers this election. Candidate biography information can be found in this edition of SunViews (see pages 17-18) and via the RCSC Web Portal once online voting begins. Video introductions of the candidates have also been recorded and can be viewed on the RCSC YouTube channel (which can be accessed from the RCSC website at www. suncityaz.org).

Those wishing to meet the candidates live have a number of opportunities in the coming weeks at Board Meetings on November 9 and 19. In addition, two "Candidate Forums" are scheduled where RCSC Members will have the opportunity to hear those seeking to be elected answer questions presented by both the forum moderator and members of the audience. There will be both an afternoon and an evening session so that those with daytime commitments will also have an opportunity to meet the candidate. Both sessions will be held in the Sundial Auditorium – the first one on Monday, November 2 from 2 to 4pm and an evening session on Thursday, November 5 from 6 to 8pm. Members are welcome to arrive one-half hour early for social time and to meet the candidates. Please note that physical distancing will be observed and sanitation, face masks will be required; no refreshments will be served.

Should neither forum session beconvenient, video recordings will also be posted on RCSC's YouTube channel for Members to view at their leisure. Reminder notices will be sent via RCSC News Email Alerts when this information and documentation becomes available.

In addition to online voting, Members may request Absentee Ballots (if necessary) by calling the Corporate Office at 623-561-4600 anytime between November 10 and no later than December 1 if needing to be mailed. All absentee ballots must be received by Election Day (Tuesday, December 8, 2020) which is when in-person voting will occur at Lakeview Center Social Hall #2 only from 8am to 4pm.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Golf rounds in August increased by 3,967 over prior year and represent the most rounds played in August since 2007. For the year Riverview has played 37,413 rounds, followed by Lakes West (36,158 rounds), South (34,869 rounds), Willowcreek (34,753 rounds) and North (29,632 rounds). For the month 60% of rounds played were played by Annual No-Fee golf passholders and Annual Surcharge Fee golf passholders.

On September 4, we will host a fundraiser event to raise funds for Patriot Golf Day and the Folds of Foundation. Despite restrictions due to COVID-19, we had a total of 80 participants in this year's event, matching last year's total. Total fundraising efforts fell short of previous year, as we avoided fundraising efforts that dealt with cash

Golf Courses

All major summer agronomic procedures have been completed and overseeding begins on September 28 for South, Lakes East, Willowcreek and Riverview. These courses will reopen on October 17 with cart path restrictions in place until November 6. The remaining courses will close October 19 and reopen November 7 with cart path restrictions in place until November 20. We are currently not planning an overlap period during which all courses will be closed, however we will be monitoring long range forecasts as we near the September 28 start date. Should forecasted temperatures prove problematic for overseeding, we will move the start date for the first wave of course closures to October 5. Should this change prove necessary, it will result in an overlap period of course closures as we will not move the second wave of course closures back.

During this overseed/winter season we will be running three trials of putting green seed mix. The trials will take place on Lakes East, Quail Run and the practice putting greens at South. Our traditional mix consists of 70% rye grass and 30% Poa Trivialis. For the courses undergoing the trial, bent grass will be added to the mix. These courses will use 70% rye grass, 20% Poa Trivialis and 10% bent grass. The practice putting greens at South will not use any Poa Trivialis. The mixture on the practice putting greens will be 70% rye grass and 30% bent grass. We are undergoing these trials as the number of Poa Trivialis growers has been decreasing as they switch their fields to crops that yield a bigger return on investment. We want to be prepared should Poa Trivialis become unavailable or the price becomes too high. The trials of the bent grass will give our superintendents additional experience in managing a bent grass surface for play and through summer transition.

Lawn Bowling

Mowing heights have been lowered following the completion of summer agronomic practices. The lowered heights have resulted in a quickening of pace. Lawn Bowl pace now range from a slow of 10.6 seconds at Mountain View to a high of 12.6 seconds at Bell North. The unusually hot summer and lack of rainfall resulted in greens needing additional water throughout the summer. All greens, except Mountain View, are still carrying higher than normal moisture readings. The Moisture Quotient (MQ) readings range from a low of 6.9 at Mountain View to a high of 19.6 at Lakeview West. The average MQ reading for all 6 greens has decreased by 21% over the last month.

The softball field and areas around Sun Bowl will be overseeded beginning the week of September 28. Overseeded areas around Lakeview will begin the week over October 5.



Bowling Centers Now Open Phase 2 Restrictions & Requirements

Prior to entering RCSC facilities, RCSC has implemented COVID-19 symptom screening with signage. Please read and evaluate whether you meet the criteria to enter RCSC facilities. Anyone with potential symptoms may not enter RCSC facilities. High-risk individuals should remain at home.

- Hand sanitizer is required upon entry to all RCSC facilities and offices. Users may
 utilize the sanitizer provided by RCSC.
- Bowling Centers will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm 3pm.
- No guests or visitors are allowed. All customers MUST individually display their RCSC Member or Privilege Cards to verify eligibility (ABSOLUTLEY NO EXCEPTIONS; KEY FOBS NOT ACCEPTED).
- No league play at this time.
- A limited number of users may be permitted at one time, once capacity has been reached you may be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Face masks are required. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Every other lane open with only 3 bowlers allowed per lane.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- No use of concourse tables and chairs is allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- All Games must be prepaid (maximum 3 games per person).
- Credit Cards only no cash accepted for payment.



Thoughts from a Pro

Developing A Pre-Shot Routine

One of the most important things to do during practice is to develop a consistent preshot routine. A pre-shot routine keeps you focused on the task at hand and becomes a way to ready yourself to hit your shot without overthinking. Pre-shot routines may include a variety of elements; however, the key is practicing it over enough times where it becomes automatic.

Here are some things to include in working on your pre shot routine.

- 1. Practice swings Not all people include a practice swing, but if you do make sure you limit yourself to just one on the course. If you think there is a good reason to take one, do it! If not and it just tires you out, skip it! This is all about what works for you.
- Alignment Standing behind the target line and choosing a spot to line up with is usually most effective but however you decide to ensure your alignment is consistent must be included.
- Addressing the ball -Meaning lining up the clubface to the hole, taking your grip and lastly your stance.
- Trigger to swing This is different for everyone. Some people take a breath, others do a waggle with their hands and club, or maybe a forward press...whatever you choose it must be the same every time.

Think of another sport you may be familiar with that may have a pre-shot routine. I think of hitting a serve in tennis or shooting a free throw in basketball....it doesn't matter how many times you bounce the ball before take your shot or hit your serve, only that you do it the same way each time. Work out your pre-shot routine for golf so that its comfortable for you.

Remember, a good pre-shot routine takes a matter of 10-20 seconds, so it is not about playing slow. We always want to move along on the course to make the game more fun for everyone. The most important reason for developing your pre-shot routine is so that you will do the same thing every time, for every shot. This helps with consistency and overthinking. You will automatically go into your routine instead of cluttering your brain with distractions! Try it and see how it works for you!

Voting in the RCSC Board Election; A New Normal?

Just like everything else in 2020, this year's RCSC election is proving to be just one more anomaly in this year of "new" normals.

The Elections Committee did an outstanding job recruiting seven candidates who'll appear on the ballot. Each candidate offers experiences and talents that make them uniquely qualified to be elected, most importantly their desire to serve the community.

Serving on the RCSC Board of Directors is often an eye-opening and rewarding experience for those who take a seat at the table. Making decisions which may not be welcomed by many is a tough job. And this year has proven to be a real humdinger when it comes to doing what is reasonable, prudent and best for keeping our members and RCSC staff as safe as possible while following guidelines and restrictions, mandates and requirements.

While a "normal" year would have us electing three new Board directors, there are five positions which must be filled as a result of this election. Besides the three vacancies that routinely cycle through the process, there are two spots that are currently held by people appointed by the Board who are serving through the end of the year.

And that's one of the reasons your vote in the RCSC Election this year is more important than ever.

The three candidates who receive the most votes will fill the three expiring terms that are now held by Vice President Dale Lehrer, Treasurer Sue Wilson – and yours truly. The candidates who receive the fourth and fifth highest vote count will serve two years and one year respectively to complete the terms of the vacated seats.

In reality, this means we could have half of the Board change in this single election. The "normal" cycle of three expiring terms

each year provides consistency and continuity on the Board. Let's hope we can get back on track as a result.

You need to keep in mind that anyone elected to the Board must receive a minimum of 100 votes. While Sun City residents are avid voters in most national, state and local elections – not so much when it comes to voting for the RCSC Board. Most years, turnout is down right dismal. Remember, any remaining vacancy resulting from this election will once again be filled with an

appointee. Don't just sit back and do nothing. Make your voice heard and make your vote count. Do it online starting Monday, November 9; do it in person on Election Day (Tuesday, December 8). Request an absentee ballot if you must. Just do it!

Another reason this election is so important is that a search for a new RCSC General Manager will take place next year, for which the Board of Directors is responsible. Who you elect now for the Board will be making decisions and that will have consequences for years to come.

Yes...just like clockwork, the RCSC Board of Directors Election happens every year. Why not make a real difference this time around and vote for a change in this very important, extremely local election?

Remember - it is 2020 and nothing is "normal."

Financial Report

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended August 2020 within its operating and capital budget year to date. All Divisions, with the exception of Bowling and Food Service, have met or exceeded their net operating budget projections year to date with total operating income \$93k (1%) favorable to budget and operating expenses \$889k (7%) favorable to budget. Bowling and Food Service declines are driven by the COVID-19 closure and restrictions with Bowling remaining closed until Phase II of the reopen plan. Bowling did reopen in August, but income remains lower than budget. Income favorability is driven by higher than budgeted income in the Building & Infrastructure and Golf Divisions. Operating expense favorability is primarily driven by lower payroll, utility and general operating expenses across multiple Divisions. Year to date operating excess without projects favorability is \$977k (45%) favorable to budget. RCSC is continuing to see the effect of the COVID-19 related shutdown with August monthly operating income shortfalls in Bowling and Food Service totaling \$44k. However, Golf operating income excess of \$76k in August offset the shortfall.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in August were 8.0% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivable increased in August by 4.8% and is up 16.2% from the beginning of the year. Overall accounts receivable past due balances have increased in August by 3.2%. July assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.6% rate and June assessments went 60 days past due at a 1.6% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$6,557 in August. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$79,911. Payments made in August through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$154,109 from 331 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,404,142 from 3,388 property owners.

In August property transfer balances increased by 7.5%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 54% of all receivables and 53% of past due balances. At the end of August trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 23 and properties owned by lending institutions remained at 3.

Project Updates

Bell Center

Social Hall Restroom Renovation

This project includes the full renovation of the social hall restrooms including the inclusion of accessible facilities. The demolition work began on 8/31/2020 and is complete. The plumbing subcontractor is currently working in the space. The work is projected to be completed by mid-November. Contractor: K.L. McIntyre (Cost: \$160,487)

Social Hall Kitchen Renovation

This project includes the full renovation of the social hall kitchen which will replace flooring, lighting and cabinetry in the kitchen and the trash receptacle areas. The demolition work began on 8/27/2020. The demolition and environmental remediation are complete. The plumbing subcontractor is currently working in the space. The work is projected to be completed by end of October, but final use is tied to the County inspection. They will inspect the Restroom and Kitchen projects concurrently in mid-November. Contractor: K.L. McIntyre (Cost: \$126,926)

Grand Center - Building I

Most pending items have been completed within the club rooms with a few minor items remaining, mainly tied to product shipping delays.

The RCSC Grounds department is working on the landscaping on the site and is expected to complete this work by the end of September.

Pending is the 103rd Ave monument sign and building signage. Final signage design has not yet been completed, but once complete monument sign installation will be held until the Grand Center Building II nears completion.

Grand Center – Building II

RCSC has contracted with General Contractor (GC) Robert E. Porter Construction, Inc. to complete this project.

The GC commenced work on the project on 9/14/2020. Fencing around the work site has been installed and traffic flow has been redirected in the parking lot. Earthwork on the building pad site began the week of 9/14/2020.

Duration of the project is projected to be 6 months,

Lakes East/West Maintenance Yard

No changes during the month of September.

Mountain View Center

No planning or design work completed since the last report.

Sundial Center

Replaced the aged Bocce Scoreboards in September. Contractor: RCSC Skilled Trades (Budgeted at \$3000; Cost: \$163)

Fairway Rec Center Inverter #10

Inverter is missing the grid, 8/21/2020. Sent to Kortman, the breaker was tripped. Issue resolved.

Issues Resolved:

Lakeview Lanes Inverter #01

Inverter was replaced with a SMA inverter and communication was established with AlsoEnergy on 9/11/2020.

Lakeview Lanes transformer was replaced on 9/3/2020.

Open Issues:

Oakmont Rec Center – # 01/02/03/04/05/06

The inverters at Oakmont Center are not reporting production data. This has been an outstanding issue since July 2018. The production meter shows overall production data for the site, but the individual inverters are not reporting production to the AlsoEnergy aggregation reporting site. A new data logger has been replaced but unable to connect. AlsoEnergy and Fronius states it should be communicating. Kortman performed continuity check on all three wiring conductors from inverter to AlsoEnergy enclosure, wiring is good. Waiting on a response from Fronius. Fronius and Kortman are working together to find a workaround to get the inverters communicating with AlsoEnergy.

Lakeview Rear – # 01/02/03/04

Like the Oakmont site the inverters at the Lakeview Rear site stopped communicating with the AlsoEnergy data logger and thus the AlsoEnergy aggregation reporting site. The Lakeview Rear inverters are Fronius models like Oakmont Center with these two sites being the only Fronius inverters in the RCSC Solar environment. Pending confirmation of restored functionality at Oakmont Center.

Production Data:

After including August production data, the lifetime to-date production vs expected went down again slightly and is over expected by 5.20%. The percentage of inverters producing above expected reduced by 1 inverter to 79%. The inverter had small reductions of less than 0.06% that moved the overall inverter production from just over even to expected production to just under expected production.



MCLD Libraries

Continuing to Serve

Public Libraries serve as places for access, learning and connection across the world. So when the COVID-19 crisis led so many to close, libraries were challenged to find new and creative ways to connect to their communities and provide services people rely on. "At their core, libraries are about access," said Brianna King, Sun City Library Manager. "So, we had to get creative on how we could provide access to library services while still keeping staff and residents safe."

The Sun City and Fairway Libraries are a part of Maricopa County Library District (MCLD), a special taxing district that runs 18 libraries countywide. On March 16, 2020, all MCLD libraries closed in order to ensure the safety of staff and customers. But library operations didn't stop when the doors were locked. Instead, contactless and virtual services were dreamed up, launched, and continuously tailored to meet the needs of individual communities.

The first virtual service MCLD launched was moving its popular in-person events to the web. MCLD Now, which originally launched as a live stream service, now hosts daily ondemand videos for all ages and gets around 10,000 viewers every month.

"During these times of isolation, we wanted to keep those connections with our community and let them know we're still here," said MCLD Program Resources Manager Jolene Bradley. "It is exciting to see our staff try new things and see the community's response to the events and take part in them."

Events aren't the only missed connection communities felt. The professional one-on-one assistance librarians give to residents is another essential function of library service. What has resulted is MCLD's new Book-A-Librarian option, which allows customers to schedule phone calls and video conferences to get help with homework, digital devices, library card services and more. The online customer service desk has been well received by cardholders and appointments don't seem to be slowing down anytime soon.

The final step in bringing library services online was ensuring access to the wealth of books, movies and more in MCLD's collection. Immediately after closing doors to the public, the library district increased checkout limits and at-home access to its digital collection. From eBooks to audiobooks and more, there was quite an increase in engagement with MCLD's online resources as many people began staying home.

However, there was still an overwhelming desire from the community to regain access to the library's nearly 720,000 items in its physical collection.

Curbside and Walkup Pickup, a contactless service to reserve and pickup books, movies and more was launched in late April. The service has been extremely popular and serves an average of 360 customers per day at each of the District's 18 libraries.

Even with the unforeseen challenges 2020 brought, MCLD Libraries continue striving to be a destination for quality library service—whether at home, online or curbside. While we may not know what the next few months bring during this extraordinary time, MCLD knows this: No matter what is going on in the world, the library is always here for you.

Maricopa County Library District is currently in a phased reopening plan, and continues to extend hours and additional ways of access during the COVID-19 crisis based on data from the CDC and Maricopa County Department of Public Health. Water Conservation

It Takes How Much Water to Do What?

Okay, after all this time you've made changes in your lifestyle to help conserve water – full loads of laundry and in the dishwasher, turning the faucet off while shaving and brushing your teeth, fixing drips and leaks, embracing desert landscaping and the like.

Now it's time to consider how much water it takes to produce some of products we use and consume on a routine basis. You may recall that a pint is a pound the world around, but a pound of many items required 1,000s of pints of water to produce

- One pound of roasted coffee 2,500 gallons (or 50 bathtubs full of water)
- If you prefer tea, it take eight gallons of water to produce one cup of tea
- While an egg takes 53 gallons of water to produce, one pound of chick meat uses
 519 gallons
- One pound Pork uses 719 gallons to produce, while beef uses 1,850 gallons per pound produced
- One pound of butter requires 666 gallons
- A Glass of Milk requires 62.5 gallons to produce while orange just take 45 gallons
- Do you prefer beer or wine? Beer is the water-wise choice at 19.81 gallons vs. wine at 31.7 gallons
- Remember vegetables are good for you and only require 39 gallons to produce a pound

By eating less meat (even one day each week), you're actually reducing your water footprint by up to 25,000 gallons of water per year! Just imagine if everyone were to try it!

Phase Two of RCSC Reopening Plan

On August 27, 2020, Maricopa County met Moderate Reopening Status in the following three metrics: 1) Cases per 100,000 individuals, 2) Percent positivity, and 3) Hospital Visits for COVID-like illnesses in the region allowing RCSC Fitness Centers to re-open with limited capacity on Friday, August 28, 2020 and Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. ("RCSC") to move into Phase Two of its re-opening plan. The following is the criteria for use of RCSC facilities:

REQUIREMENTS FOR USE OF ALL RCSC FACILITIES

- Prior to entering RCSC facilities, RCSC has implemented COVID-19 symptom screening with signage. Please read and evaluate whether you meet the criteria to enter RCSC facilities.
 Anyone with potential symptoms may not enter or use RCSC facilities. High-risk individuals should remain at home.
- Hand sanitizer is required upon entry to all RCSC facilities and offices. Users may utilize the sanitizer provided by RCSC.
- A limited number of users may be permitted at one time, once capacity has been reached you may be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Face masks are always required while indoors except in showers, indoor pools and indoor spas. Outdoors face masks are required in the walking pool. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears or tied around the head.
- Strict 6 feet of physical distancing is required while in the fitness centers, indoor walking track, locker rooms and restrooms regardless if in same family. All other RCSC facilities require a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- No cash accepted for payment.

BASKETBALL - CLOSED UNTIL PHASE 3

BILLIARDS - Reopened 9/4/2020

- Billiards will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm 3pm. Face masks are required. Only 2 players per table. Use of only every other table allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment (pool sticks, cue ball, pool balls, etc.), including table railing, seating, counters and side tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOATING, PADDLE BOATS – CLOSED UNTIL PHASE 3 $\,$

BOATING, ROW BOATS

- Only 1 person per boat. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing while on RCSC property, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- RCSC will sanitize life vest, oars and cushion after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment not sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOCCE

- Use of every other rink with only 3 bowlers allowed at end of each rink in use. No guests allowed
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

BOWLING - Reopened 9/4/2020

- Bowling Centers will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm 3pm.
- Face masks are required. Every other lane open with only 3 bowlers allowed per lane.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- No use of concourse tables and chairs is allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

DARTS - Reopened 9/4/2020

- Darts will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 2pm 3pm.
- Face masks are required. Only 2 players and 1 table and 2 chairs per machine allowed. No quests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

DOG PARK

- · Hand sanitizer required upon entry. Only 1 person per bench. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs with maximum of 2 chairs per table and always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

FISHING

- Only 1 person per bench. No use of gazebos. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

FITNESS INCLUDING INDOOR TRACK

- All Fitness including the Indoor Track at Fairway will be CLOSED for sanitation daily from 12pm – 1pm.
- No guests allowed.
- Face masks are required. Each fitness center will allow 25% capacity at one time. Once capacity has been reached, you will be asked to return later as no congregating is allowed.
- Cardholders must go directly to Fitness Area OR Track at time of check in and must check out with the Facility Attendant prior to leaving or using any other amenity.
- Strict 6 feet of physical distancing is required while using fitness, indoor walking track, locker rooms and restrooms regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- Every other piece of cardio equipment will be turned off to maintain at least 6 feet of space between users.
- When using strength machines or other equipment, users are required to maintain strict physical distancing of 6 feet or more.
- No outside equipment allowed into the facility, including but not limited to, mats, exercise balls, weights, and foam rollers.
- Cardholders are encouraged to bring their own water with secure lids to rehydrate.
- No use of auditoriums, social halls, hallways or other indoor RCSC facilities for walking.

GOLF COURSES, PRO SHOPS, SNACK SHOPS

- Face masks required inside Pro Shops and Snack Shops.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family
 unless riding in same golf cart, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Chairs may not be moved from one table to the other.
- RCSC will sanitize rental carts, snack shop tables and chairs and patio tables and chairs after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment except that sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

HILLSIDE PARK

- Only 1 person per bench. No use of gazebos allowed. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

HORSESHOES

- Only 3 players (effective 9/1/2020) at end of each court in use. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

LAWN BOWLING - Updated 10/15/2020

- No guests allowed.
- Use of every rink with 2 bowlers allowed at end of each rink.
- Use of every other rink with 3 or 4 bowlers allowed at end of each rink in use.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of tables and chairs always requiring 6 feet of physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

LOCKER ROOMS, LOCKERS, CHANGING STALLS, SHOWERS, RESTROOMS

- No guests allowed.
- Always requires a strict minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing.
- Face masks are required while indoors except in showers, indoor pools and indoor spas.
- Lockers are not available, consider limiting personal belongings.
- Reduced number of changing stalls and benches available.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.
- Thorough hand washing strongly encouraged.

MINIATURE GOLF

- Only 3 golfers (effective 9/1/2020) allowed per hole. No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- RCSC to sanitize putters, balls, and scoring pencil after each use.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment not sanitized by RCSC (see above), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

PICKLEBALL

- Four players per court (effective 9/1/2020). No use of ball machine(s). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of seating, benches, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

POOL, LAP OR SWIMMING

- No guests allowed. If lanes are provided, only one swimmer/user per lane. Sign up required to use lap lane(s) with 30-minute time limit.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

POOL, WALKING

- No guests allowed.
- Masks are required in walking pool. Face masks are required to be cloth, fabric or other
 permeable material and must be worn over the mouth and nose, affixed either over the ears
 or tied around the head.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

RACQUETBALL, HANDBALL, WHISPERBALL

- Only 1 player per court. No guests allowed.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

SHUFFLEBOARD - Reopened 9/4/2020

- No guests allowed.
- Face masks are required at indoor courts. Only 2 players allowed at end of every other court.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment (cues, disks, pins, etc.), including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

SOFTBALL & OUTDOOR TRACK - Updated 9/21/2020

- Game play on the softball field may resume on October 19, 2020. No contact allowed. No quests allowed.
- A minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing is required, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible. Must chalk a line 6 feet behind home plate for visual cue to catcher in adhering to physical distancing.
- Must sanitize player seating areas after the team has batted. Players are to be seated in the dugout, fence line benches, picnic tables, and first row of bleachers so that all players are physically distanced. Players should stay in one seating location for the half inning while on offence to eliminate the need to sanitize during the offensive half of the inning. These seating areas must be sprayed with sanitizer upon going into the field for the next defensive half inning.
- Spectators are permitted provided that 6 feet physical distancing is adhered to at all times.
 Picnic tables and bleachers may be used by spectators. If bleachers are to be used, then

available seats must be identified to ensure 6 feet physical distancing. The Softball Club will be responsible for ensuring both players and spectators comply with the 6 feet physical distancing requirement. The club shall provide sanitizing spray foruse by spectators on seating after use. Spectators may bring their own seating provided that the placement and use of personal seating follows the 6 feet physical distancing requirement.

- Limited use of stadium seating, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided.

SPAS

- No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pool lounge chairs and patio tables with maximum of 2 chairs per table and required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- No pool towels, sitting or lying allowed directly on pool or spa deck.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TABLE TENNIS

- Face masks are required. Only 2 players per table. No use of ball machine(s). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TENNIS

- Four players per court (effective 9/1/2020). No use of ball machine(s). No guests allowed.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Limited use of pavilion seating, benches, tables and chairs with required 6 feet physical distancing regardless if in same family.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

TRACK - OUTDOORS

- No guests allowed. Only 1 person per bench.
- Always requires a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing, regardless if in same family, excluding an occasional situation when such is not possible.
- Cardholders are required to sanitize before and after use of every RCSC piece of equipment, including seating, counters and tables, utilizing the sanitation method provided by RCSC.

WALKING

- All indoor walking allowed only at the indoor walking track at the Fairway Center. No guests allowed
- No use of auditoriums, social halls, hallways or other indoor RCSC facilities for walking is allowed

Lost Wax Casting technique is used for creating beautiful pieces of jewelry and decorations. Pictured is Tom Johnson with a finished piece, wax tree and flask. A wax model is made and sprued to a "tree". Investment medium is then poured into a flask holding the wax tree. After heating in a kiln this wax melts and the investment becomes the mold. Molten metal is then poured into the flask making the piece, in this picture the cross.





Momentum Obstacles During Weight Loss

Losing weight can be an emotional rollercoaster," states Jane Fortier, personal trainer and weight management specialist. "In the beginning, things go great. You're moti-

vated, determined and excited about your plan. The scale moves in the right direction. You feel alive, energized and confident. Just when you think you have everything under control, life begins to shift. The energy level starts plummeting. You aren't nearly as excited as you were weeks earlier. You begin to skip exercise sessions. Junk food slips back into your diet. Your momentum begins to dissipate. Before long, you come to a complete standstill. The little voice in your head says, I'm tired, I don't want to do this anymore."



Basic Momentum Obstacles will always crop-up, with any weight loss journey. Identifying these obstacles, might make a difference in your success:

- Boredom Whether it's eating the same "healthy" foods, sticking to the same exercise routine or just the realization that this is a lifelong journey, boredom inevitably sets in. Remedy: Keep things interesting. Adding variety and switching things up, with both eating and exercise, will make the journey more enjoyable. When you start making excuses for sticking to your plan, boredom is usually the culprit.
- 2. The Dreaded Plateau You are losing weight at a slow but steady pace, then it stops. You haven't seen a change in weeks, and you are feeling discouraged. Remedy: Alter your mindset. Plateaus are not a bad thing, but rather your body's way of adjusting to a lower weight. Staying at a new set-point for a few weeks or even months is a significant accomplishment. The number on the scale may not be changing, but your body composition probably is. Shift your focus from weight loss to improved health! Once you have a better attitude about plateaus, mix up your exercise routine and alter eating habits. The plateau will subside.
- 3. Changes in Routine Life always throws you curve balls: you suddenly face health concerns with a spouse; guests will be visiting from out of town; a two week vacation is coming up; the holiday season has arrived. These routine shifts can make it difficult to squeeze in exercise and stay-on-course with healthy eating. Remedy: Go back to the beginning of your journey. Before you started that journey, you had to figure out the "what, where and how" that you would use. Time to do that again. Figure out how to approach these shifts in routine. Failure to plan is planning to fail. Life is constantly shifting. If staying healthy is important, you must engage in healthy habits always, not just when it's convenient. Think ahead, plan for changes!
- 4. End-of-Day Fatigue and Lack of Sleep As the day wanes on, so does your resolve. Evenings can be tough, especially after keeping it together all day long. If you're skimping on sleep, it makes it even more difficult to muster the energy to focus on goals, after trudging through a full day's responsibilities. Remedy: Fatigue is indeed the enemy of weight loss. Sleep deprivation messes with your hormones, causing a surge in the hormones that increase appetite and a decrease in the ones that signal satiation. When overly fatigued, impulsive choices interfere with food selection. Making sensible choices becomes more difficult. If you want to have sustained weight loss, you must prioritize sleep in order to eliminate fatigue.
- 5. Living with Someone Who Is Not Concerned with Weight Loss We are influenced by those with whom we spend the most time. When your partner is not concerned about losing weight or healthy eating, you may find yourself faced with temptation or coerced in some way. Unknowingly, those partners are sabotaging your goals. Remedy: You must speak up and make your needs known. By voicing your concern, you will open up possibilities for compromise. Don't preach or try to convince your partner to join in a weight-loss program, just ask that he or she support you, in your efforts.

Hopefully, these suggestions will help with overcoming momentum obstacles, when they arise. On the weight loss journey, surround yourself with positive, supportive people, and become your own cheerleader and best friend. 




