Upcoming Elections, Celebrations & More

Fall is upon us and the holidays will be here before we know it. With so much going on, here's a quick summary and the important dates you'll want to make sure are marked on the calendar.

The RCSC Annual Membership Meeting is happening on Tuesday, November 1 at 9am in the Sundial Auditorium. Registration begins at 8am and RCSC Member Cards with photo are required. No keys fobs or golf cards will be accepted, and privilege cardholders will not be allowed entry. Those wishing to attend must be queued in line no later than 9am to be counted so please plan accordingly.

RCSC Board of Director Elections this year has seven candidates running for three open seats which have 3-year terms. Online voting via the RCSC Web Portal begins on Monday, November 7 at 8am. Video recordings of the Candidate Forums held in October are posted on the RCSC YouTube channel so you can hear their thoughts, concerns and goals about the future of RCSC/Sun City. You can review the full slate of candidates and their biographies in the special election pull-out section on pages 5 and 8 of this month's SunViews newsletter.

If you are not able to vote online, you may request an absentee ballot starting November 7 by contacting the Corporate Office at Lakeview (623-561-4600). Request for mailing absentee ballots must occur no later than December 2 and all must be received by December 13.

In-person voting will be held on Election Day (Tuesday, December 13) from 8am-4pm in Lakeview Social Hall #2, located at 10626 W. Thunderbird Blvd. Winners will be formally announced via email blast/press release that evening and those elected will be sworn in at the Board Meeting on Thursday, December 15 at 9am in the Sundial Auditorium.

Sundial Winter/Spring Concert Series Ticket Packets are available through Sunday, November 13 for RCSC Cardholders only and individual concert ticket sales start on Monday, November 14 at 8am. 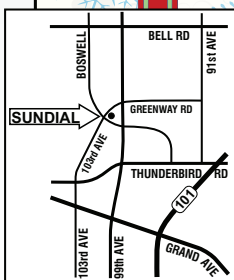

Thoughts from a Pro -

5 Ways to Replace Bad Habits

Most people want instant results when they make a change in their golf swing. Whether you are working on a new pre-shot routine, a different grip, or something more difficult such as weight shift.... making a change takes time and patience.

Even though we've all heard the adage about "breaking" a bad habit, that is a misconception. Habits cannot be "broken", they can only be replaced with new habits!

Here are five easy ways to help you replace your old habits with new ones:

1. Practice. This means spending some time either on the practice range or at home repeating what it is you're trying to achieve. The more you practice the sooner the change happens. (Don't forget playing golf doesn't count as practice!)
2. Make practice perfect. Have you heard the saying practice makes perfect? Well, I believe that only perfect practice makes perfect! If you are practicing over and over incorrectly you aren't getting anywhere! Also, depending on what you're working on, practicing correctly may be easier without a ball! Sometimes making practice swings just hitting a tee is the easiest way to learn to make the correct swing before adding the ball.
3. When you play, just play. Save the thinking for practice sessions. If you don't see results when you play you need more practice.
4. Be patient with yourself. Don't expect miracles. Give yourself time and if you're practicing consistently and correctly you should start seeing results.
5. Think positive. You can be your biggest ally or your biggest enemy! Use your brain to help your game by visualizing what you want instead of what you don't want!

90 Degree Rule

Managing to alleviate stress on golf course can be a constant issue for golf course superintendents. Foot or vehicular can cause soil compaction, soil degradation which can result in thinning turf canopy. The area of turf impact carrying two golfers is at least 48 times greater than the area affected by foot traffic.

A study conducted by a USGA agronomist had very surprising results. The average area of impact on a 6,200-yard golf course was staggering, one riding golfer with a motorized cart on 18 holes covered 4,761,600 sq ft. (1)

At RCSC we allow 5 golfers per tee time which results in a total number of square feet impacted is 19,046,400 sq ft. Peak golf season at RCSC golf courses we can see upwards to 250 golfers a day at an 18-hole golf course. The number of square feet impacted is tremendous.

RCSC golf course superintendents encourage golfers who play at RCSC courses to use the 90-degree rule.

The 90-degree rule is in place to minimize the impact on the turf. When the 90-degree rule is in effect at a golf course, it means.

- Riding in golf carts is allowed
- Those carts can be driven onto the fairway.
- They must remain on the cart path as much as possible, turning off the path only at right angles (90 degrees) to reach the player's ball.

OUR BOOKSTORE - LIKE NONE OTHER

The Library Board of the Sun City Library, more than a decade ago, decided to turn the operation of the Library over to the Maricopa County Library District (MCLD). Fund raising efforts had become difficult, and Library equipment badly needed updating. In negotiating that agreement, MCLD agreed to let the Friends of the Sun City Libraries, Inc. use the meeting room, known as the Hoover Room, at the back of the Sun City Library for a Friends Bookstore. Using left over shelving from the Library remodeling, the Bookstore was born.

The Friends had always had a sales room for donated books; but it was small. Now the challenge was to design a true bookstore. Over the years, old equipment has been replaced, shelf space has been expanded, and storage space has been added. One thing that has not changed is the all-volunteer staff. Many Friends Board of Director members worked on establishing and organizing the store. Following her Board presidency, Mary Ann McDonald asked to be the volunteer Bookstore Manager.

With her business background, Mary Ann set up an organization to accomplish what a for-profit used bookstore would include. Without saying it, she had specific goals in mind: 1) books sorted by criteria; 2) alphabetical where appropriate; 3) clean; 4) neat; 5) low prices; 6) special monthly sales; 7) include magazines, CDs, DVDs, puzzles, and other appropriate items; 8) and most of all, volunteers who knew the operation and would assist patrons. Over time, excellent volunteers were recruited who willingly gave their time. Mary Ann worked long hours, and the organization showed that.



Until Mary Ann recently passed away, few knew how difficult her job had been. Since her passing, new leadership has emerged with plans to build on the existing structure. The foundation laid by Mary Ann and her dedicated volunteers will only improve with new ideas and "second generation" volunteers bringing new energy.

Tips from Get Fit for Life

Breaking Through Plateaus

"I've hit a plateau" is a statement we hear often," states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist. "If you've been exercising faithfully and maintaining "clean" eating habits, but no longer see the same results you experienced in the beginning, you may have hit a plateau.

A plateau occurs when your progress comes to a standstill. It can be described as not making any "gains" (improving fitness level or losing weight/inches), but not necessarily moving backward (losing endurance or gaining weight/inches). Because every individual is unique, there's no way to actually predict when a plateau might happen. When it does, it's important to jumpstart your body, mind, and metabolism. This involves making changes, of some sort, to your approach to weight loss. You might change-up the eating format you have adopted, or change-up the exercise regimen you have been using. Either, or both of these actions will have positive results, over time.

With regard to exercise, you might incorporate some, or all of the following suggestions to both prevent and overcome a weight loss plateau.

- It's Time to Add Variety to Your Workouts:** Incorporating variety is critical, because your muscles become very efficient at the exercises they are accustomed to doing. Switching things up or doing something radically different during each workout session is stimulating to a body that is bored. This concept should be applied safely, to both aerobic exercise and strength training. An individual who always does the same exercises will usually plateau sooner than someone who continually makes changes. Changing your routine is crucial to keeping your muscles fired for action. Change makes muscles work harder - you feel more challenged - your body burns more calories - you build more muscle tissue.
- Ideas on Changing your Cardio Activity:** Change the type of exercise you usually do. The possibilities for aerobic exercise are endless. If you walk, try cycling. If you cycle, try the elliptical, if you use the elliptical, try the rowing machine, if you row, try a step-box routine. Consider adding aerobic activity outside the gym: dancing, hiking, swimming laps, zumba, jazzercise - anything, just change it up! Change the duration of your cardio workouts. Increase your minutes, as you become more fit - try a shorter, but more vigorous workout. Change the intensity of cardio workouts. This is something you can play with on a weekly basis - incline the treadmill, use exertion intervals on the bicycles, elliptical, rowing machine, vary the interval number and duration.
- Ideas on Changing your Strength Training Routine:** Change the mode of exercise. If you are using machines, move to free weights. If you are doing free weights, add a stability element like a Bosu Ball or Fitness Ball. Do your standing free weight exercises while balancing on one foot. Change the specific exercises you do. If you use a chest press, change to a chest fly: if you do an upright row, change to an inverted row. Think of an alternative exercise for each muscle group, and you'll have an entirely new workout! Change your resistance level and/or number of repetitions. Be sure to increase your weight regularly. Make sure you are lifting to fatigue with each set. If you typically lift 10-12 reps, try doing 8-10 with a slower cadence. Change the cadence of all three movements of the repetition (contraction, hold, release). Occasionally use a HIIT workout in place of your aerobic and strength routine.

"There are lots of ways to add variety to your workouts," states Fortier. "By always challenging yourself, you will avoid hitting a plateau in the first place, or overcome the one you're stuck in. The human body is amazingly adaptable. By making a few changes in various exercise areas, you can jumpstart your metabolism and see positive results kick-in again."
