A survey of the membership was conducted: members participated in development of the annual budget, a committee of members was created to address a major construction project and we continued, and continue, to improve our Technology systems. We also overcame a number of challenge: completion of the Viewpoint lake project, improved communications and established an Outreach and Communications Committee, and hired a new General Manager. Additionally, steps have been taken to lay the foundation for the future: establish a five-year plan team, set a policy for the five-year plan, develop a program to address deferred maintenance, and development an automated system for comment cards.

Tips From A Pro

Zeroing In with Short Shots

Golf is a "target" game, yet many people dismiss the importance of proper alignment. Others attempt to line up to the target but do so improperly. Remember, alignment doesn't only affect direction, it also can affect distance and contact with the golf ball.

First, stand behind your ball and find something on the ground that is lying in between the ball and the target. This could be a divot, leaf, tee, etc. To make it easy, pick something as close to the ball as possible. Second, walk up to address the ball and position the club behind the ball aiming it in the direction of the spot that was chosen. (Similar to how you would aim your putter towards the hole.) Once it is in place position the hands on the grip. Third, step the feet in position so that they are parallel to the target line. (Again, the same as you would position your feet in putting.... aiming them parallel to the hole not at it.) Last, make the swing, feeling the confidence you will have in knowing that your alignment is correct, and your swing has a better chance of staying on the right path!

Our club offers performances on the third Friday of each month at 9:30 am in the Sundial Auditorium, where you can showcase your talents or listen to others play. You will hear a variety of styles, including jazz, blues, rock, Latin, ragtime, and classical, among others. Whether you don't play, or you're a beginner, intermediate or advanced player, we welcome you to join us. Want to learn to play, or improve your playing? We offer affordable lessons. Our Sundial studio has two grand pianos, a console piano, and classroom keyboards for you to practice on. We occasionally have lectures in the studio where you can learn more about music. The studio contains a vast library of donated sheet music, free to members. Best of all, membership fees have been waived for 2024! We believe that music is a powerful tool that can bring people together, and we hope that you'll join us in celebrating the joy of piano playing. Come and be a part of our community!



Did you know that four natural protection companion plants for your tomatoes are sunflowers, basil, French marigolds and zinnias with basil imparting a slight flavor to the tomatoes? These add color, amazing scents and flavoring to your garden while discouraging unwanted pests.

The Garden Club of Sun City meets the first Tuesday each month from

September through May with a membership of over 200 who share educational programming, knowledge, facilities, supplies, good humor, gardening lessons, field trips and social events. Annual dues are \$15.

The Garden Club office at the Grand Center includes an orchid and African violet nursery and a greenhouse where soil-based plants are started and hydroponic plants are raised including tomatoes, cucumbers and leafy greens. The Club's Community Garden at 91st and Greenway has dozens of raised and in-ground beds leased to Club members. Several mornings a week, you'll find members tending their plants which are protected from invaders by enclosures. A common garden "Pete's Patch" raises produce for sale at the Club office, meetings and special sales on site. There's also a cactus garden. The glorious rose garden at Sun Bowl is a Club project.

We love to nurture minds, friendships, plants, soils and butterflies -- yes, the Club even has a Monarch Way Station project to protect, propagate and give respite to Monarchs in migration. You can find more information at gardenclubofsuncity.org

Rhythm Ramblers Club/Band

If you love big band music, the Rhythm Ramblers Club is for you! All RCSC cardholders are eligible to join. Dues are \$10 per year and include admission to seven First Tuesday dances from October through April in the Sundial Auditorium. Looking back on recent years, the Friends of the Sun City Libraries organization is very proud of its support financially and promotionally for the two branch libraries in our community,

Each year the Friends draft budgets to allow for the Sun City Branch at Bell and the Fairway Branch to request and purchase items and services that are beyond its Maricopa County Library District allotment. Some of the budgets are spent on expenses related to programs, such as presenter fees and room rentals. Some of the budgets are for special services, such as the seed libraries.

Other items funded by the Friends are bigger and less routine. The Friends covered the partial cost of installing drive-up book returns on the north side of the Sun City Branch. The Friends contribution to this improvement in customer service was \$66,000.

Currently an improvement is underway to provide more electrical outlets at the Sun City branch. With the increased usage of electronic devices, such as laptops, cell phones and notepads, the need for easy access to power has become critical for patrons. This project should be completed in the next few months, improving service for many.

Another improvement in the works is to provide more usable space at the Fairway Branch. This change would involve relocating the library entrance and allowing for the current hallway area to be used for staff office space and storage. An additional staff member could be hired, improving service for the branches.

The Friends raise money with its Books Around the Corner used bookstore at the Sun City Branch. With the help of the public, books and other items are donated, and then sold. More than \$40,000 is raised annually, with these proceeds directly used for the branches.

The work of the Friends is most gratifying. To support the libraries and their staffs and to help get the word out about the value of public libraries are major goals of the group. A Board of Directors meets monthly to determine projects and strategies to accomplish our mission. 




