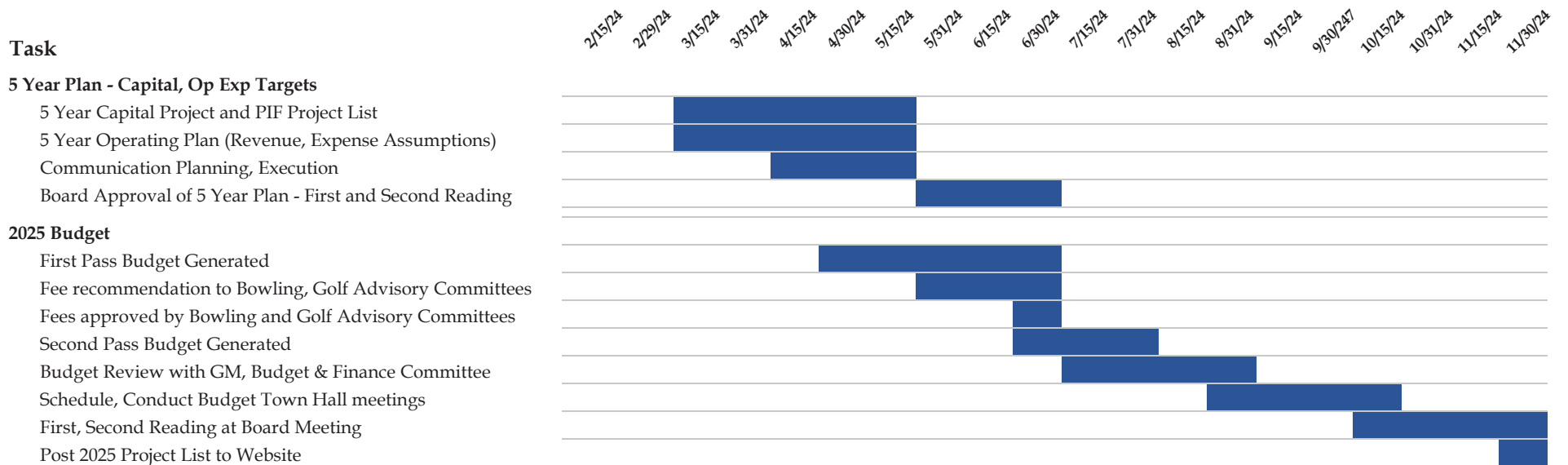

Oakmont Center Security Enhancements

RCSC is pleased to announce enhancements to security measures at the Oakmont Recreation Center to ensure the safety and comfort of all members and employees. Here's what you need to know:

1. **Token Access:** Starting in April (exact date to be announced) in order to enter Oakmont through the east gate (107th Ave), fitness center, auditorium, and club rooms, you'll need a token.
2. **Check Your Card:** Does your card have a token? If YES, just tap your card on the access panel. No need to do anything else.
3. **Oakmont Club Members:** If you don't have a token, pick it up from the Clubs Office, Monday through Friday, 9am to 3pm. Bring your RCSC Member/Privilege Card and ID.
4. **General Access:** If you need general access to Oakmont, you will need to visit Cardholder Services at Lakeview Recreation Center, Monday through Friday, 9am to 3pm. CHS is also open the first Saturday each month from 9am to noon.
5. **Access Points:** Use your card with a token on new readers at the east gate, auditorium door (from handicapped parking), and fitness room door (from west parking).

6. Note: West parking gate is for emergencies and employees only.

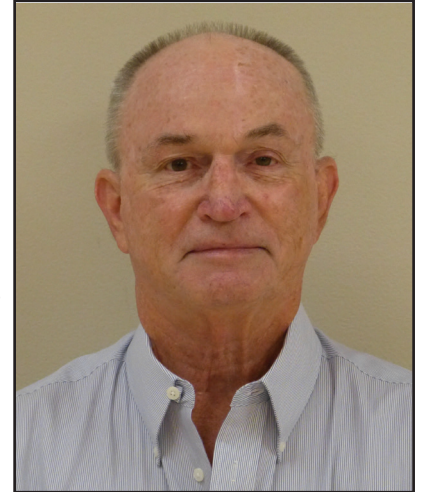

A Message from RCSC Board Director Preston Kise

Golf in Sun City AZ

Golf is one of the highest member participation activities in Sun City with over 6,000 members participating on some level. Our eight courses continue to see heavy use with over 348,000 rounds played in 2023. Despite this heavy play, our courses are doing well; overseeded fairways were good this winter and the normal Bermuda grass is starting to turn green.

There was a lot of concern last year with the impact of small groups (groups with over 30 players) and with other member golfers that requested tee times getting "bumped" and not getting their requests filled. The Golf Advisory Committee (GAC) worked with golf management and small group leaders to limit small group impact and increase tee time availability. A new system was put in place that restricted small groups to no more than 10% non-resident members and excluded them for a 2.5-hour prime-time window from November through April. There are now only seven small groups. Even though tee time requests have increased more than 8% from last year, the rate of tee time request refusals this year decreased by over 3%. This number could further decrease with better education of the lottery process, golfers requesting wider windows and more courses to play, and an improved golf lottery system.

A greater concern is that nearly 30% of tee time spaces every day end up being no shows because our member golfers don't let the pro shops know they can't play that day or filled spaces with names that have no intention of playing. To try and fix this problem, golf management implemented a system where member golfers that are consistent no shows will get lower tee time priority for the group they are playing with. An improved tee time lottery system may also help to fill tee time spaces more efficiently.

So how does golf work in Sun City? Every course has a greens committee made up of three men and three women that play at that course who are elected for 3-year terms. Several committees have openings or are being filled by the same people because of a lack of new volunteers. A man and woman from each committee is elected to be part of the GAC which is comprised of these 16 golfers (two from each of the eight courses), one golfer from each of the Sun City Women's Golf Association and Men's Golf Association, and a golfer from the Sun City Women's 9-Hole Association. The Golf Senior Leader and two RCSC Board members who serve as chair and co-chair complete the committee which works to help build the annual golf budget including golf fees, gather input from other golfers, and recommend changes to golf policy, operations, and golf facilities to the RCSC Board.

Greens committee information is posted in each pro shop and they are your first resource to provide feedback and your best place to get involved to improve our golfing community.

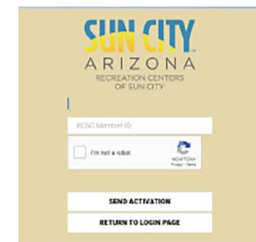
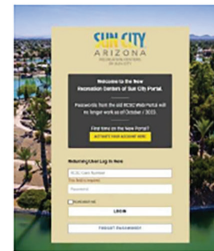
So, what are golf's challenges? We need to better communicate changes to golf policy like the recent move back to a 3-cart rule and changes to the lottery system to our member golfers. The golf area of the RCSC website could be improved to provide golf specific news on the initial page. Other issues like budget information, monthly revenue and course usage numbers, fee changes, upcoming golf projects, etc. could also be posted. Informing so many people is a difficult challenge but making information easier to find and educating our golfers are essential keys. We need to continue to raise the wages of our golf staff, so they get comparable pay with other courses and reduce our 40% annual golf staff turnover rate. We also must continue to reduce water usage by converting excess grass areas to desert scape and converting essential grass areas to a newer turf that requires much less water.

The RCSC Board, golf staff, and GAC will continue to work to make golf better for our current and future residents and make golf financially sustainable. You can get involved and make a difference now by joining a greens committee. Please continue to bring your thoughts and issues to the Board, golf staff, and the GAC to help us find more ways to improve and get important information out to all our golfers. With your help, we can make Sun City an even better place to live and to play golf.

May Mobility Continues Making “wAVes”

If you’re not aware, May Mobility launched Valley wAVe, Sun City’s first autonomous vehicle deployment in early 2023. The service was designed to help the community gain increased freedom and mobility safely and reliably by creating an autonomous micro transit system that deliver riders to key points of interest, including entertainment, medical, recreation, and housing. Since then, service has been enhanced by incorporating community feedback and analyzing data from our technology.



In December 2023, May Mobility launched it’s first rider-only service with a dedicated site team remotely monitoring vehicles and providing assistance as needed. There has also been collaboration with a select group of Sun City residents in an Early Rider program to utilize the service during this phase and providing feedback.

As service expands in terms of route and hours, you can expect to continue seeing May Mobility vehicles stopping at various locations in the area including recreation centers. It is planned to open these services to the public in the upcoming months and look forward to giving you a ride! May Mobility aims to improve transportation with safe, reliable, and accessible AV services. 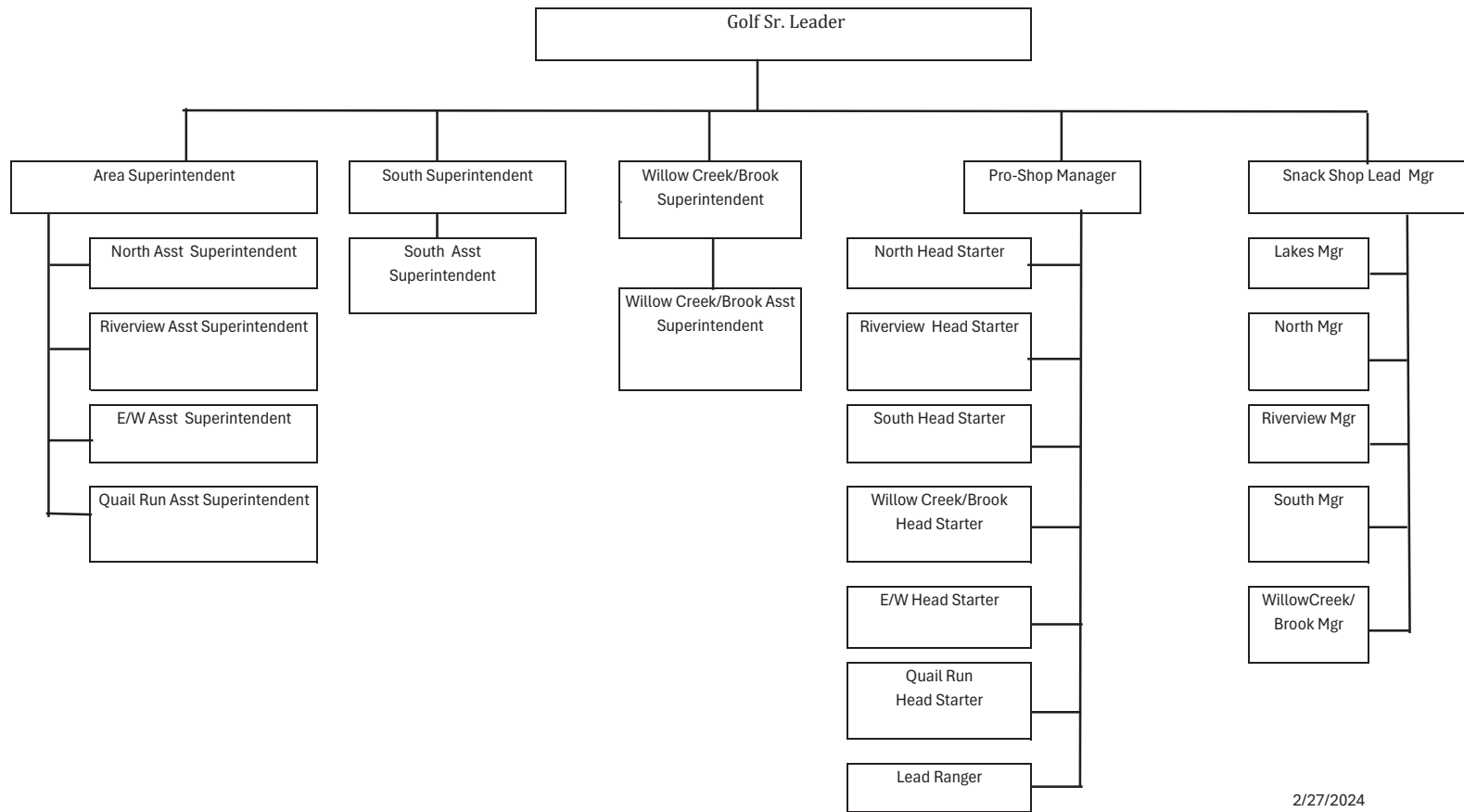
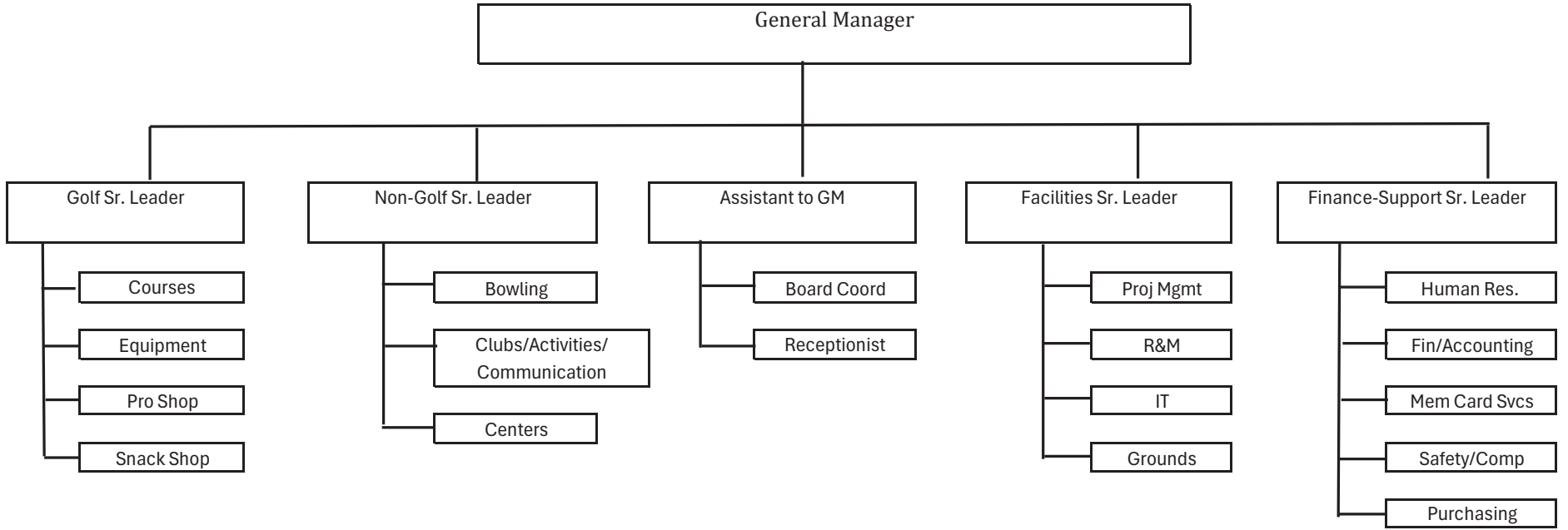

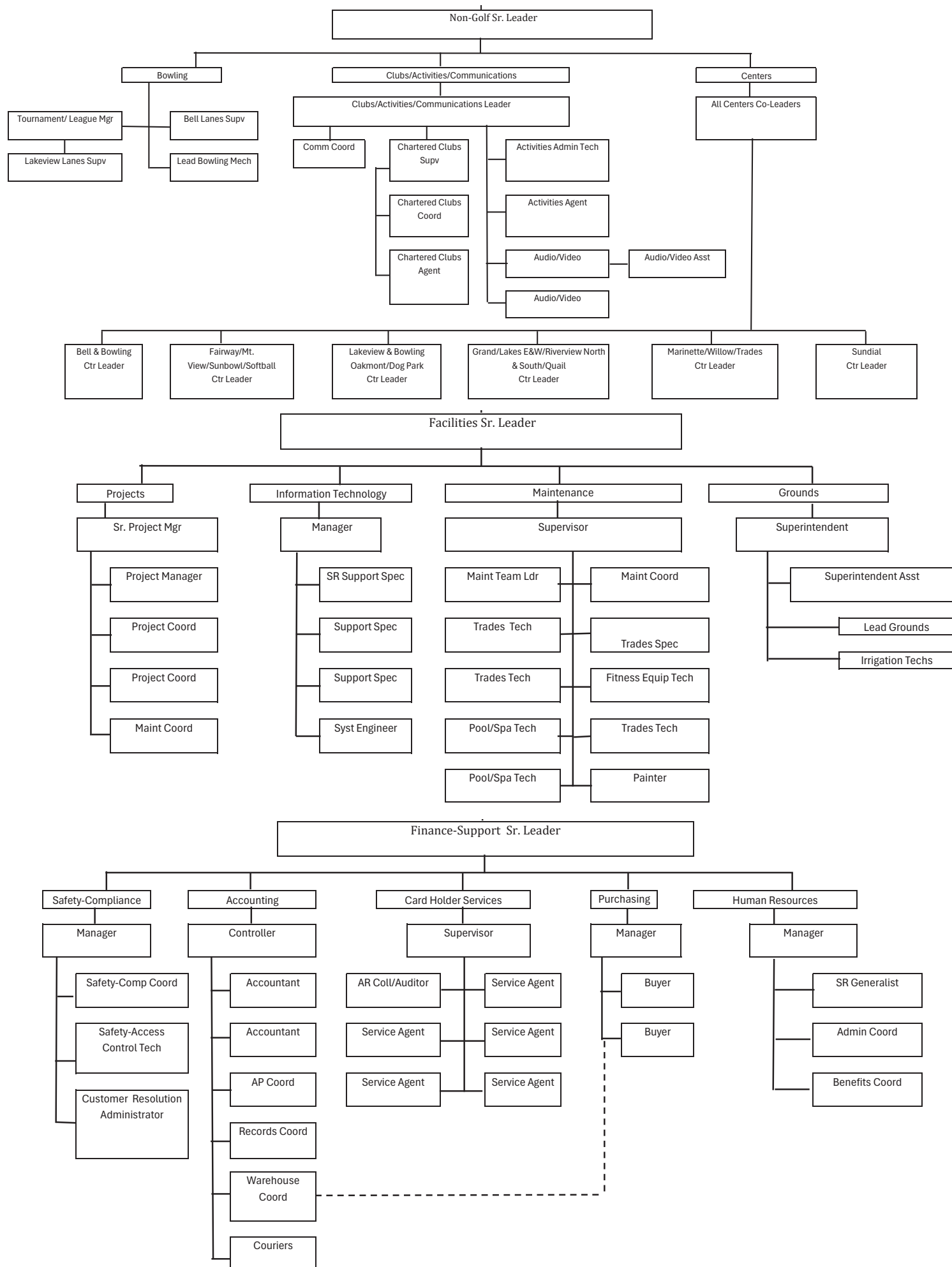

RCSC Dog Park Rules

Dog park(s) owned and operated by RCSC (“Park”) are unmonitored facilities and users are at their own risk. In order to keep the Park clean and enjoyable for all who use them and the neighboring properties, the following rules must be followed:

1. Dogs must be vaccinated and licensed with Maricopa County license tag attached to a collar or harness which shall be worn at all times. No more than 3 dogs are allowed per owner/handler at any one time. Puppies under 4 months of age are prohibited. Female dogs in heat are strictly prohibited. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. Small children and infants must be kept under strict supervision and not allowed to run in the area or chase after dogs.
2. All dogs must be restrained by leash of not more than 6 feet and of sufficient strength to control action of said dog during entrance and exit of the Park and in the surrounding areas outside of the Park. Dogs may run off leash while inside the Park.
3. Dogs may not be fed, given treats, or given anything to chew while in the Park, during entrance or exit, or in the area surrounding the Park.
4. Owners/handlers must be present in the Park at all times that their dogs are in the Park. Owners/handlers shall closely supervise and control their dogs. Dogs must be under voice control of their owners/handlers at all times. Owners/handlers must immediately clean up after their dogs and properly dispose of waste. Owners/handlers must stop their dogs from digging and immediately fill any holes dug.
5. Owners/handlers shall be responsible for all actions and activities of their dogs. Aggressive dog behavior is not permitted. At the first sign of aggression, dog will be leashed immediately and removed if behavior is not corrected. RCSC is not responsible for injuries to dogs, their owners/handlers, or others at the Park.
6. If a dog bites a person, the incident shall be reported to Maricopa County Animal Care and Control immediately by the person(s) having direct knowledge of the incident who shall also complete an [Incident Report Form](#) and submit it to the Corporate Office.
7. If a dog causes damage to RCSC Facilities, the incident shall be reported immediately by the person(s) having direct knowledge of the incident who shall also complete an [Incident Report Form](#) and submit it to the Corporate Office.
8. It is unlawful for any person having custody or control of a dog in Maricopa County to permit that dog to bark excessively. Owners/handlers must quiet dogs barking excessively or leave the Park.

By submitting this request form for access to the Duffeeland Dog Park I acknowledge the above stated rules as found in Board Policy 10 – Rules and Regulations and agree to use the RCSC dog park(s) in accordance with these rules. Additionally, I agree that the issued token will not be given to others to gain access to the Park without me being present.

Duffeeland Dog Park Waiver and Release

Please read this form carefully and be aware that in consideration for permission to use the Duffeeland Dog Park (“Park”), you will be expressly assuming the risk and legal liability and waiving and releasing all claims for injuries, damages or loss which you or your dog(s) might sustain as a result of participating in any and all activities connected with and associated with use of the facility and surrounding areas. When this Waiver and Release refers to “my dog(s)” or “your dog(s)”, it includes me whether or not I am the legal owner of the dog(s), since I am the person responsible for the dog(s) while using the Park.

I hereby acknowledge that I have voluntarily chosen to participate and use, with my dog(s), the Park owned and operated by the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (“RCSC”). I understand that the act of unleashing my dog and being physically present within the Park necessarily involves risks of injury to me, persons that accompany me, other people using the park, my dog(s), and other dogs. I understand that the aforementioned risks are entirely my responsibility and I expressly assume that responsibility and liability knowingly and voluntarily.

I hereby acknowledge that I have been provided a copy of the Dog Park Rules approved by RCSC and agree to fully comply therewith. I understand that the license requirement does not guarantee that dogs in the park are safe or healthy nor is it a guarantee that the dogs in the Park are neutered or spayed. I also understand that dogs, irrespective of their training and usual past behavior or characteristics, may act or react unpredictably at times based upon instinct or circumstances, and that not all hazards and dangers associated with dog activities can be foreseen. I further understand and assume the inherent risks including the propensity of a dog to behave in dangerous ways and acknowledge additional risks may include but are not limited to: the inexperience or irresponsibility of a dog owner/handler, the inability to predict a dog’s reaction to sound, movement, objects, persons, dog fights, dog bites, theft or unlawful capture; escape over or under fences; vegetation or standing water that may be toxic if consumed, mosquitoes, bees, ticks, fleas, other insects, wildlife such as snakes, lizards, etc. I knowingly and voluntarily accept responsibility for all of these risks in exchange for the privilege of using the Park.

By signing this Waiver and Release and using the dog park, I covenant not to sue and fully release and discharge the RCSC, its past and present directors, officers, employees, agents, attorneys, and insurers, as well as any private citizen volunteer serving as Park stewards, from any and all damages, causes of action (whether known or unknown), claims, demands, rights of action, resulting from or rising out of, my use of the Park. I further agree to indemnify, protect, defend, and hold the RCSC harmless for, from, and against, any and all claims, demands, judgments, penalties, liabilities, losses, costs, damages, and expenses directly or indirectly incurred by the RCSC, including costs and attorneys’ fees, whether or not a suit is filed, resulting from my use of the Park or from my breach or non-compliance with any of the RCSC Dog Park Rules.

I have carefully read this waiver and release and understand its contents. By affixing my signature below, I agree to comply with the terms of this agreement. My signature further confirms that I am not aware of any incidents in which my dog(s) has/have shown aggressive, fighting, or biting behavior towards other animals or people.

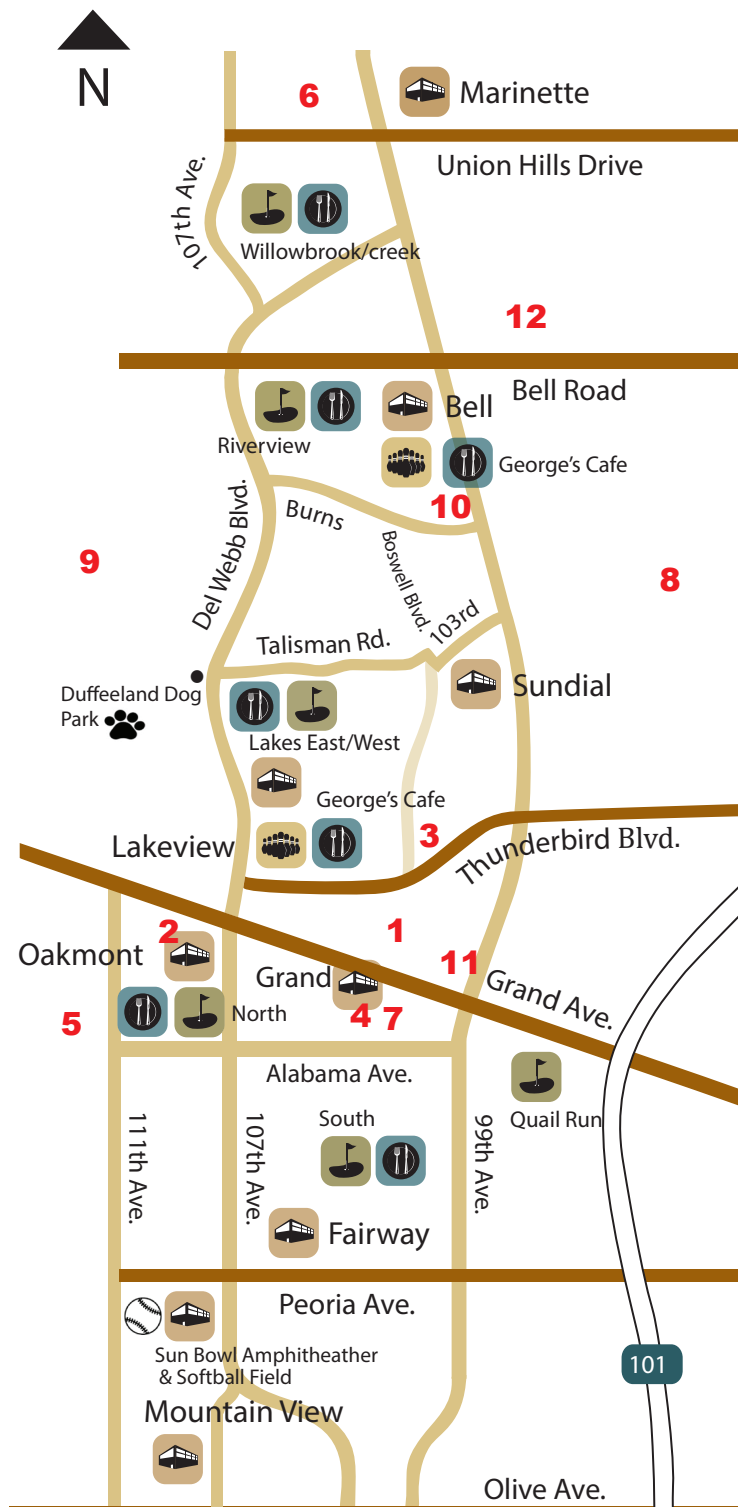
